STATISTICS OF PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS, 1919-20.

CONTENTS.—Preliminary survey—Summary of statistics of public high schools from 1890-1920 (Table 1)—Summary of statistics of public high schools from 1907-1920 (Table 2)—Teachers in public high schools (Tables 3-8)—Pupils enrolled (Tables 9-21)—Pupils in military drill (Table 22)—Graduates (Tables 23-28).

Statistics of public high schools for 1920, contained in the following pages, include statistics of secondary schools which are controlled by publicly elected or appointed boards of education.¹ Statistics for 1920 of other secondary schools, which are considered as private high schools or academies, are contained in Bulletin, 1922, No. 9.

Statistics of junior high schools are included so far as reported. In States having only seven grades in the elementary schools, pupils in the first year of the junior high school, corresponding to the sixth year of the elementary school, have not been included. Only those two-year junior high schools have been included which were reported in connection with regular high schools. Two-year junior high schools organized separately were considered as resembling departmental organization of elementary grades too closely to be included with junior high schools.

A junior-senior high school, having either the 2-4 plan or the 3-3 plan of organization, has been counted as one school in the number of all high schools reporting. Under either plan of organization the junior portion of a junior-senior school has been counted in the number of junior high schools, and under the 3-3 plan of organization the senior portion has been counted in the number of senior high schools. The senior portion of a junior-senior high school organized on the 2-4 plan has been included with regular high schools. A regular high school is one not organized on the junior, senior, or junior-senior plan.

The statistics have been tabulated to show the enrollment and the number of teachers in regular high schools grouped according to the number of years in the high-school course. To find the number of pupils in a high-school course of four years, the number of pupils in senior high schools and the number of pupils in the third year of three-year junior high schools have been added to the number of pupils in regular four-year high schools. To find the number of teachers instructing those pupils, corresponding groups of teachers should be added together, but full information is not available. The num-

ber of teachers in regular four-year high schools and the number of teachers in senior high schools are given in the following pages. The number of teachers of pupils in the third year of three-year junior high schools (corresponding to the first year in regular high schools) and the proportion of teaching time given to such pupils by teachers who also instruct pupils in the first and second years of such high schools were not reported.

The statistics have been tabulated to show also the number of pupils, of teachers, and of graduates of all public high schools, grouped according to the population of the communities in which they are located. The first group consists of schools in cities of 100,000 population, the second group, of schools in cities, towns, and boroughs having a population of 2,500 to 99,999, and the last group, of schools in rural and village communities. A high school in a rural or village community is a school supported by a State, a county, a township, or a district (not in the sense of a single school district), or by an independent village which had a population less than 2,500 in 1910. Union high schools are considered as rural. A high school in a city, town, borough, or village, having from 2,500 to 9,999 population, has been grouped with the high schools in rural communities, if it is supported by a rural taxing unit, that is, by a unit larger than that determined by the corporate limits of the city proper. A school with this type of support has not been grouped with rural high schools, if it is located in a city having 10,000 population or more, because it is probable that such a city would influence strongly the curriculum of the school and would contribute a large part of its support.

Financial statistics of the high schools have not been tabulated, because other studies of public high school expenditures for approximately the same period have been issued by this bureau.

Of the outlying possessions, reports of high schools in Porto Rico only were received.

Survival percentages, in Table 2, have been computed as follows: The enrollment in the first year of the course at a given date, e. g., 1911, was divided into the enrollment in the second year of the course in the year following, namely, 1912; into the enrollment in the third year of the course in 1913; and into the enrollment in the fourth year in 1914. This method disregards the percentage of retarded pupils, but the percentages of retardation for the several years of the course differs but slightly.¹ Duplication in the enrollment in the years of the course is probably about equal. Since the number of deaths within the high-school ages, 14 to 18, is counterbalanced approximately by the increase in enrollment due to immigration, these factors have been disregarded also.
