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STATISTICS OF STATE SCHOOL SYSTEMS, 1924-25

Statistics of kindergartens and of elementary and high schools, supported by public funds in the various States, are given in this report. The major items presented include total enrollments, high-school enrollments, average daily attendance in all schools, number of teachers, number of school buildings, value of school property, and expenditures. The data are for the school year 1924-25, excepting for two states, Arizona and Wyoming, which are for 1923-24. Data for private schools are not included because they are incomplete.

Since 1925 marks the close of the first quarter of the twentieth century, advantage is taken of the opportunity to review the progress made in that period and to show a few of the trends.

Certain increases and improvements over 1924 are worthy of notice. Total enrollments increased from 24,288,808 to 24,650,291, while high-school enrollments increased from 3,389,878 to 3,650,903. Average daily attendance increased from 19,132,451 to 19,838,384, and number of teachers from 761,308 to 777,945. The number of school buildings decreased 4,421, but the value of school property increased \$507,548,186. Total expenditures increased from \$1,820,743,936 to \$1,946,096,912.

The per cent which the school population (those of ages 5 to 17 inclusive) is of the total population has decreased from 31.3 per cent in 1870 to 26.6 per cent in 1925, but the per cent of population enrolled has increased from 17.8 per cent to 21.7 per cent in the same time.

Since 1924 the per cent which the number of pupils enrolled in high schools is of the total enrollment has increased from 14 per cent to 14.8 per cent. The percentage of attendance in all schools increased from 78.8 to 80.5. Length of session increased 1.3 days, and average number of days attended by all children enrolled increased 4 days from 1924 to 1925. Salaries of teachers increased \$25 per annum, and per pupil cost increased \$2.93, making the amount per pupil in average daily attendance \$98.10 in 1925.

Reduction in amounts of current expenditures and outlays are noted in these States: Alabama, California, Maine, Minnesota,

Nebraska, Nevada, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, and South Dakota. Reduction in enrollments are noted in Alabama, Colorado, Georgia, Kansas, Montana, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Dakota, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, and West Virginia. Reduction in high-school enrollment is indicated in Colorado, Maine, Michigan, North Dakota, South Dakota, Texas, and Vermont, although the increase in high-school enrollments for the United States is 7.7 per cent over that for 1924. The two-year increase from 1922 to 1924 is 14 per cent.

TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF PROGRESS

From 1900 to 1925 the population of the United States increased 50.11 per cent. The birth rate has been falling off, so that the population of school age has not kept pace with the general population. The group 5 to 17 years of age, inclusive, has increased 38.78 per cent, while the 5 to 14 age group increased 39.34 per cent. Total enrollments in public schools have increased 59 per cent during the past quarter of a century. The greatest increase is in the high school, 603.11 per cent, while the elementary school enrollment has increased only 40.15 per cent, an increase slightly greater than the increase in the school census. The number of pupils in average daily attendance has increased 86.58 per cent during this period, and the number of teachers, 83.89 per cent.

The number of school buildings has increased only 4.26 per cent since 1900. This low increase is due largely to the fact that many one-room school buildings have been replaced by union, consolidated, or centralized schools, one new building taking the place of four or five smaller buildings. The number of one-room schools is smaller by 37,175 than it was in 1918.

Original costs generally determine the value of school properties, so that inflated values do not account for any part of the increase in value. The value in school property has increased 673.05 per cent during the past 25 years. This shows that larger and better buildings must have replaced smaller buildings of lesser value.

Other increases are shown graphically in the following diagrams and graphs: Figure 1 shows, by five-year periods, increases in the annual salaries of teachers, supervisors, and principals.

Since the purchasing power of the dollar has fluctuated materially during this period, these average salaries are deflated, or adjusted, by using the cost of living index published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The purchasing power of the 1913 dollar is taken as a base. For 1905 the index is estimated to be 80 per cent of the 1913 base. No index has been computed for 1900. Previous to 1913 the

dollar would buy more goods than it did in 1913. Since the base year, the dollar has lost some of the purchasing power that it had in 1913. In 1920 a salary of \$871 bought less goods than did a salary of \$386 in 1905, the difference amounting to 46 of the 1913 dollars. In 1925 it took an average salary of \$1,252 to purchase as much as \$726 would have purchased in 1913. Both actual and adjusted figures are shown in the graph.

Figure 2 shows the average number of days that schools were in session in the United States for each five-year period from 1900 to



1925 or, in other words, the school opportunity for those of school age. The diagram shows also the number of days actually used by those enrolled and the per cent of the total opportunity used by those enrolled. Length of session has increased 17.53 per cent, and the number of days attended by those enrolled has increased 37.88 per cent during the whole 25-year period. The average number of days of attendance by those of school age increased 57.66 per cent during this period. In 1900, public schools were in session for 144.3 days. In 1925, the length of session had increased to 169.6 days. During the period from 1900 to 1925, the average number of days attended by those enrolled increased from 99 to 136.5 days. The percentage

of attendance increased from 68.6 to 80.5. During this 25-year period the percentage of the session not used by those enrolled decreased from 31.4 to 19.5.

Figure 3 shows per capita costs of public schools upon the basis of total population from 1900 to 1925. The total amount expended



increased from \$214,964,618 in 1900 to \$1,946,196,912 in 1925, an increase of 805.31 per cent during the whole period. The per capita of population cost increased 503.87 per cent, or from \$2.84 in 1900 to \$17.15 in 1925. The data are shown in Table 1.

In Figure 4 are shown per capita costs upon the basis of the number of pupils in average daily attendance. These costs are adjusted to

meet the change in the purchasing value of the dollar, the 1913 dollar being taken as the basis for adjustment. The 1920 per capita cost, although nearly twice as high as that in 1910, was not sufficient to purchase as much material as the 1910 amount.



A gradual increase in actual per capita costs occurs from 1900 to 1916, then a more rapid increase until 1922, after which the annual increase drops off gradually until 1925. The curve showing actual costs has the appearance of reaching a limit in height within the next

few years. The actual and the adjusted values are given in the following table:



Twenty-three States have already exceeded \$100 in 1925, four spending more than \$150 per child. Seven States are spending less than \$50 per pupil in average daily attendance. Many cities are spending more than \$130 annually for each pupil in average daily attendance for current expenses alone, while one spends as much as \$175 per pupil. The average of \$98.10 for 1925 is typical of what

schools in the different States and localities are now spending per pupil in average daily attendance.

One element in the increasing cost of public schools during the past six years is the resumption of building programs that were curtailed during and just after the war period. In 1920, outlays represented 14.8 per cent of the total expenditures; in 1925 they represent 22.3 per cent. The total cost of outlays, sites, buildings, and contents for 1925 was \$433,584,559, or more than four times the amount spent in 1915, \$102,756,375, and nearly three times the amount for 1920, \$153,542,852.

The rapid increase in the number of high-school pupils is another factor in increasing costs. The cost of educating a high-school pupil is generally from two to three times as much as the cost of educating



an elementary grade pupil. In 1924 the cost per pupil enrolled in the high schools was \$173.72 and in the elementary grades \$58.93. The public high school enrollment does not as yet show any signs of slowing up on the rapid increase it has been making for many years past. The increase in high-school enrollment in 1925 over 1924 is 261,025, and this is greater than the average annual increase from 1922 to 1924, and more than 52,000 greater than the annual increase for the past 10 years. Again, the junior high school is a rapidly growing organization, and junior high school administration costs more than that for elementary schools.

Enrollments in public high schools from 1915 to 1925, and the trends for 1926 and 1927 are shown in Figure 5. In 1915 the public high school enrollment was 1,561,556; in 1916, 1,710,872; in 1918, 1,933,821; in 1920, 2,199,389; in 1922, 2,873,009; in 1924, 3,389,878;

and in 1925, 3,650,903. An estimate based upon these figures indicates that the high-school enrollment for 1925-26 will reach 4,000,000, and for 1926-27, 4,300,000. These figures do not include junior high school pupils below the traditional ninth grade.

The regular high-school enrollment in 1900 was 8.47 per cent of the number of children in the United States of ages 15, 16, 17, and 18. In 1905 it was 10.12 per cent; in 1910, 12.53 per cent; in 1915, 20.96 per cent; in 1920, 28.94 per cent; and in 1925, 47.11 per cent. The high-school enrollment can more than double and still not include all children of high-school age. It is not likely that this limit will ever be reached, but the break in the increase in high-school enrollment has not yet begun.

SOME PROBLEMS OF SCHOOL SUPPORT

States having a low per pupil expenditure for schools generally have a high percentage of children in the total population. South Carolina has 33.85 per cent of her population in the school ages 5 to 17, inclusive, and a per capita expenditure for each pupil in average daily attendance of \$46.68. For Mississippi these amounts are 33.01 per cent and \$29.97; for North Carolina, 32.78 per cent and \$59.99; for Alabama, 32.77 per cent and \$32.87; for Georgia, 32.23 per cent and \$31.89; for Arkansas, 32.17 per cent and \$29.11; for Louisiana, 31.01 per cent and \$61.98; and for Tennessee, 30.28 per cent and \$37.73. A high percentage of children means a low percentage of adults to support schools. In the States mentioned above, the percentage of the population 21 years of age and over ranges from 46.33 to 51.96. Annual per capita income in these States ranges from \$346 to \$438. Per capita wealth ranges from \$1,216 to \$1,855. The average per capita income in the United States is \$827, and the per capita wealth is \$2,918.

States having a high per pupil expenditure generally have a low percentage of children of school age. In the District of Columbia, only 17.71 per cent of the population are of school age, and the expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance is \$148.98. For California these amounts are 19.82 per cent and \$164.90; for Nevada, 19.92 per cent and \$163.97; for New York, 22.74 per cent and \$162.71; for Washington, 22.80 per cent and \$112.92; for Ohio, 23.12 per cent and \$112.31; for Michigan, 23.77 per cent and \$138.96; and for New Jersey, 24.33 per cent and \$154.62. The percentage of the population 21 years of age and over in these States ranges from 60.14 to 69.76 per cent. Annual per capita income ranges from \$690 to \$887. Per capita wealth ranges from \$2,883 to \$6,998 in these States.

Including pupils, teachers, and other school officers, and all others that put in full time in educational work of all kinds, approximately two persons out of every seven in the United States are engaged in

school business. The business of educating the child of to-day to become the citizen of to-morrow is not only the largest business in this country, but one of the most important. Each locality has its



own set of problems in the matter of furnishing finances for carrying on the public school system.

With adequate financial support, the school is able to furnish an educational opportunity for the child as far as the level of high-

school graduation. At the present time the average length of school life in the public schools of the United States is about seven years. Data are given in Table 5 which show the average number of years of school life for each State, the per cent of illiteracy for those of 10 years of age and over as determined by the Census Bureau, the per capita income, and the per capita wealth.

In Figure 6 an attempt is made to show graphically how length of school life correlates with illiteracy, per capita income, and per capita wealth in the various States. The States are arrayed according to length of school life, that is, the average total attendance in public schools, measured in 180-day years, for each person of school age. The curves for illiteracy, per capita income, and per capita wealth are smoothed to make the trends stand out more clearly. Names of States are omitted, but they may be identified from Table 5.

States with the highest average length of school life have low rates of illiteracy, high per capita incomes, and high per capita wealth. States with low average length of school life have high rates of illiteracy, low per capita income, and low per capita wealth. While it is not contended that length of school life causes all the fluctuations in the other three factors as shown in Table 5, it correlates so well with each of the three that school attendance seems to be a strong contributing factor to the welfare of the Nation.
