# LAND-GRANT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

## YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1945

**B**EGINNING with the 1943-44 school year, the statistics for land-grant colleges and universities have been published as a separately printed bulletin and not as a section of the chapter on Statistics of Higher Education of the *Biennial Survey of Education*. This makes it possible to publish these data in final form much sooner than formerly.

*Staff, 1944-45.*—In general, there was a decrease in staff in land-grant institutions from 1943-44 to 1944-45. There was a decrease in both men and women staff in the colleges for Negroes only, but the women staff increased slightly in the other institutions.

*Students, 1944-45.*—The data presented here for 1944-45 show the continued decrease in the number of regular session full-time enrollments in land-grant institutions with white students through 1944-45. While there was some increase in civilian enrollment, there was a larger decrease in military full-time enrollments. In the land-grant institutions for Negroes the total enrollment of full-time students increased from approximately 9,400 to 11,400 from 1943-44 to 1944-45. There were great decreases in all institutions in the number of short-course Government-contract military students.

*Income, 1944-45.*—The total educational and general income for land-grant institutions increased approximately \$2,800,000, although the income from the Federal Government decreased approximately \$3,800,000. The income from the normal peacetime sources, student fees, the State, and private gifts and grants increased more than enough to counteract the decrease in Federal appropriations for war-connected education.

*Expenditures, 1944-45.*—Expenditures for educational and general and "other noneducational" accounts increased approximately \$5,000,000 from 1943-44 to 1944-45. A large part of this increase was reported for "extension" and was for war-connected courses classified under this account. There was also a major increase in the expenditure for the operation and maintenance of the plant.
