FOREWORD

SINCE 1917 the Office of Education has published at approximately 4-year intervals a compilation of the lists of institutions accredited by Nation-wide, regional, and State accrediting agencies. This edition is the ninth in the series, the last previous edition having been issued for the year 1948. The bulletin is a source of reference for educational officers and students desiring information about the accredited status of institutions of higher education. Agencies of the Federal Government use the bulletin constantly in various phases of their work.

Accreditation by Nation-wide and regional agencies has been indicated in the annual publication *Education Directory, Part 3: Higher Education* for a number of years. Accreditation by State agencies does not lend itself to such frequent reporting and is not included in the annual directory but is carried in this bulletin.

This bulletin brings together lists furnished by professional, regional, and State accrediting agencies as of February 1952.

ACCREDITED HIGHER INSTITUTIONS 1952

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACCREDITATION

THE BEST available method of ascertaining the general standing or quality of an institution of higher education in the United States is to examine its accredited status. In most countries ministries of education exercise some degree of control over educational institutions. In the United States, however, the Federal Government has no such authority. Jurisdiction over educational activities is a function of the several States which may exercise much or little control over the institutions within their borders.

State agencies generally have not assumed responsibility for the direct control of institutions of higher education. Most State departments of education do, however, through the teacher-certification function exercise a measure of control over those institutions whose graduates enter the teaching profession. State universities likewise exercise a type of control through the practice of accepting in full, in part, or not at all, credits earned in other institutions within a given State.

In addition to the limited approval of State agencies, accreditation is carried on by voluntary agencies representing educational and professional groups. The process of accrediting consists of establishing standards or criteria believed to be significant in determining the quality of an institution's program and applying these standards to an institution to discover to what extent the institution meets and maintains the standards. The voluntary accrediting agencies exercise no legal control over institutions but do exert a great deal of influence through their published lists of accredited institutions.

The Office of Education does not accredit or approve educational institutions. It does furnish information about the accreditation of institutions by other recognized agencies, principally through this bulletin and through the *Education Directory, Part 3; Higher Education*, published annually.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

Since the publication of the 1948 edition of *Accredited Higher Institutions*, a number of activities worthy of record have occurred.

REGIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

The Western College Association has assumed responsibility for accrediting 4-year liberal arts colleges in Arizona, California, and Nevada. There are now six regional accrediting associations covering every section of the country, including Territories and outlying possessions. The names and addresses of the secretaries of the regional associations and the areas covered by each association may be found on page 66.

The six regional accrediting associations have established a National Committee of Regional Accrediting Agencies for the purpose "of coordinating the activities of regional accrediting agencies, and to cooperate with similar national agencies, in the hope that ways may be found to minimize some of the evils that have accompanied the rapidly expanding accrediting movement." Annually on January first the Committee issues a list of *Institutions Accredited by the Regional Accrediting Agencies of the United States*.

PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

Leaders in nursing gradually realized that accreditation by a number of autonomous organizations resulted in duplication of effort and cost; confusion on the part of institutions, students, the profession, and the public; and fractional rather than comprehensive evaluation. Steps were initiated which led to the establishment in 1949 of the National Nursing Accrediting Service. The first list of programs in nursing approved by this new service was released in October 1949 and replaced the accredited lists of the National Organization for Public Health Nursing, the Association of Collegiate Schools of Nursing, the National League of Nursing Education, and the Catholic Hospital Association.

The National Association of Chiropodists appears as a recognized accrediting agency for the first time in this edition. Its six member institutions are listed in Part II of the bulletin.

NATIONAL COMMISSION ON ACCREDITING

Representatives of the Association of Land-Grant Colleges and Universities, the National Association of State Universities, the Association of Urban Universities, the Association of American Universities, the Association of American Colleges, the Association of Teacher Education Institutions, and the American Association of Junior Colleges have formed the National Commission on Accrediting

(formerly the Joint Committee on Accrediting). This Commission does not plan to accredit institutions of higher education but to recommend to member institutions those accrediting bodies which it considers worthy of recognition. Associations seeking recognition are now referred to the National Commission on Accrediting.

ORGANIZATION OF THIS BULLETIN

This bulletin is divided into two parts. Part I contains a compilation of institutions of higher education accredited by the six regional associations and by State universities and State departments of education. Accreditation by State universities is shown on three levels: (1) For unconditional admission to graduate school, (2) for full transfer credit, and (3) for partial transfer credit. Accreditation by State departments of education is shown for general collegiate purposes and for teacher-certification purposes.

Part II contains lists of professional and technical schools, some or all of the units of which are accredited by or hold membership in the appropriate organization. Accreditation is shown by curricula in undergraduate engineering, in technical type institutes, and in nursing.
