
Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Iowa was 246. This was higher than the average score of 241 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in lowa in 2013 (246) was higher than their average score in 2011 (243) and in 1992 (230).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Iowa (those at the 75th percentile) and Iower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 38 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (38 points).
- The percentage of students in Iowa who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 48 percent in 2013. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 (43 percent) and in 1992 (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Iowa who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 87 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (86 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (72 percent).



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 15 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, male students in lowa had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 23 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was wider than that in 1996 (15 points).
