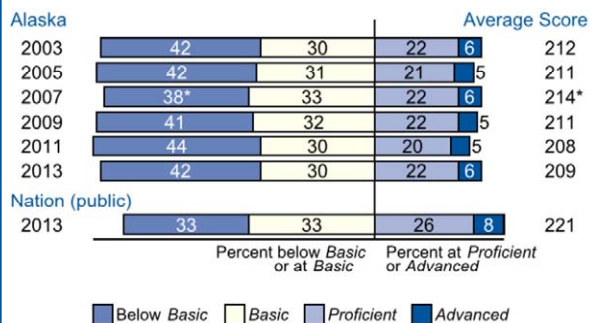


Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Alaska was 209. This was lower than the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Alaska in 2013 (209) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (208) and in 2003 (212).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Alaska (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 56 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (55 points).
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 27 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (26 percent) and in 2003 (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 58 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (56 percent) and in 2003 (58 percent).

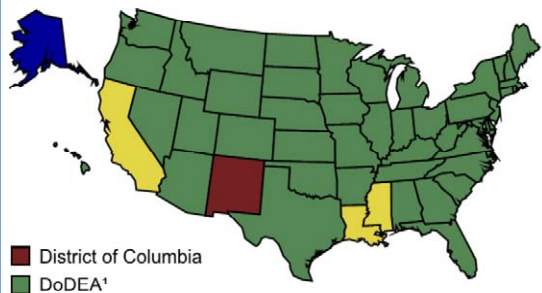
Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

Compare the Average Score in 2013 to Other States/Jurisdictions

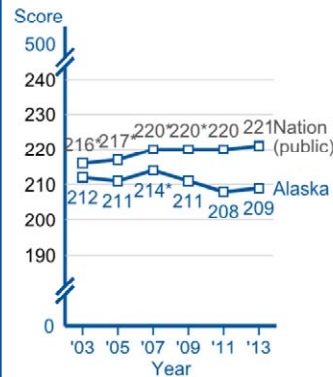

In 2013, the average score in **Alaska** (209) was

- lower than those in 46 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 3 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (17 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 14 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (17 points).
- In 2013, female students in Alaska had an average score that was higher than male students by 6 points. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2003 (13 points).
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 33 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (32 points).
