
## **Overall Results**

- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Utah was 223. This was not significantly different from the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Utah in 2013 (223) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (220) and in 1992 (220).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Utah (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 45 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (42 points).
- The percentage of students in Utah who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 37 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (33 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (30 percent).
- The percentage of students in Utah who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 71 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (68 percent) and in 1992 (67 percent).






Department of Defense Education Activity (overseas and domestic schools). In 2013, the average score in Utah (223) was

## **Score Gaps for Student Groups**

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2013, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 33 points lower than White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 1992 (21 points).
- In 2013, female students in Utah had an average score that was higher than male students by 7 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 22 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (17 points).
