Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Nevada was 214. This was lower than the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Nevada in 2013 (214) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (213) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (206).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Nevada (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 47 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (50 points).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 27 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (25 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (20 percent).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 61 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (58 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (51 percent).



Compare the Average Score in 2013 to Other States/Jurisdictions



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 26 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (30 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
- In 2013, female students in Nevada had an average score that was higher than male students by 8 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 27 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
