
## **Overall Results**

- In 2013, the average score of eighth-grade students in New Hampshire was 296. This was higher than the average score of 284 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in New Hampshire in 2013 (296) was higher than their average score in 2011 (292) and in 1990 (273).
- The score gap between higher performing students in New Hampshire (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 46 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1990 (41 points).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 47 percent in 2013. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 (44 percent) and in 1990 (20 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 84 percent in 2013. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 (82 percent) and in 1990 (65 percent).



## **Score Gaps for Student Groups**

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2013, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 27 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1990, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, male students in New Hampshire had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 22 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (21 points).
