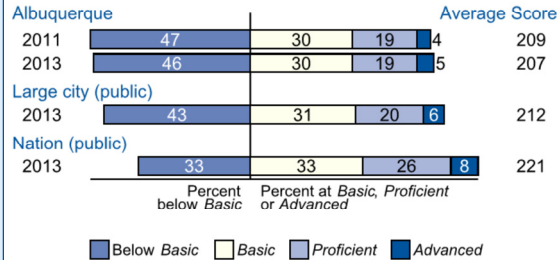


Overall Results

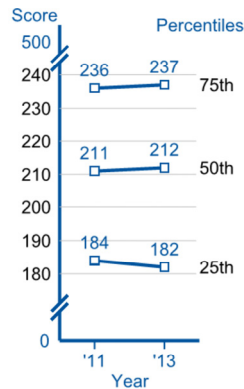
- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Albuquerque was 207. This was lower than the average score of 212 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Albuquerque in 2013 (207) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (209).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Albuquerque (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 55 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (52 points).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 24 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (24 percent).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 54 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (53 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

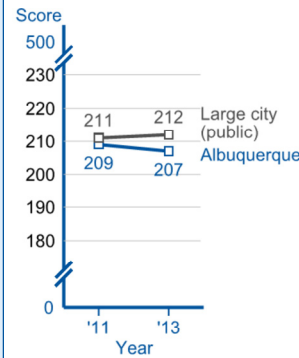

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2013, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 33 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (30 points).
- In 2013, female students in Albuquerque had an average score that was higher than male students by 11 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 36 points lower than students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (33 points).
