
2013 Trial Urban District Snapshot Report

Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Jefferson County was 221. This was higher than the average score of 212 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Jefferson County in 2013 (221) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (223) and in 2009 (219).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Jefferson County (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 49 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (47 points).
- The percentage of students in Jefferson County who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 33 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (35 percent) and in 2009 (30 percent).
- The percentage of students in Jefferson County who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 66 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (68 percent) and in 2009 (64 percent).

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (27 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2009, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, female students in Jefferson County had an average score that was higher than male students by 8 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 34 points lower than students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (28 points).
