
Overall Results


- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Jefferson County was 234. This was not significantly different from the average score of 235 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Jefferson County in 2013 (234) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (235) and in 2009 (233).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Jefferson County (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 42 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (43 points).
- The percentage of students in Jefferson County who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 33 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (32 percent) and in 2009 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Jefferson County who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 75 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (78 percent) and in 2009 (72 percent).





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (27 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (17 points).
- In 2013, male students in Jefferson County had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 27 points lower than students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (29 points).
