From The State Superintendent

Beginning in January of 2012, the Alabama State Board of Education embarked on a bold and transformation plan for K-12 public education in our state known as PLAN 2020. Foundational to this plan was a new definition of a successful and prepared high school graduate informed by community colleges, institutions of higher education and business and industry rather than the misaligned concept of Adequate Yearly Progress as defined under No Child Left Behind.

Over the past two years new standards have been adopted to create a trajectory toward college and career readiness for ALL students. New and meaningful assessments have replaced the laborious assessments of the last decade. And a policy environment that promotes and rewards innovation and creativity has replaced one of compliance and uniformity and as a result Alabama now has its highest recorded Graduation Rate, 80% all a result of unleashing the creativity at the local school and school system level.

This report card includes a plethora of data and financial information we hope you will find helpful in gaining a holistic picture of the world of K-12 education in our state and the vast need that remains to insure every child becomes a graduate and every graduate is prepared for college, work and adulthood in the 21st century.

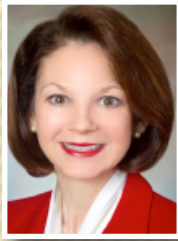

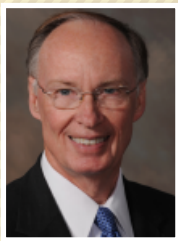

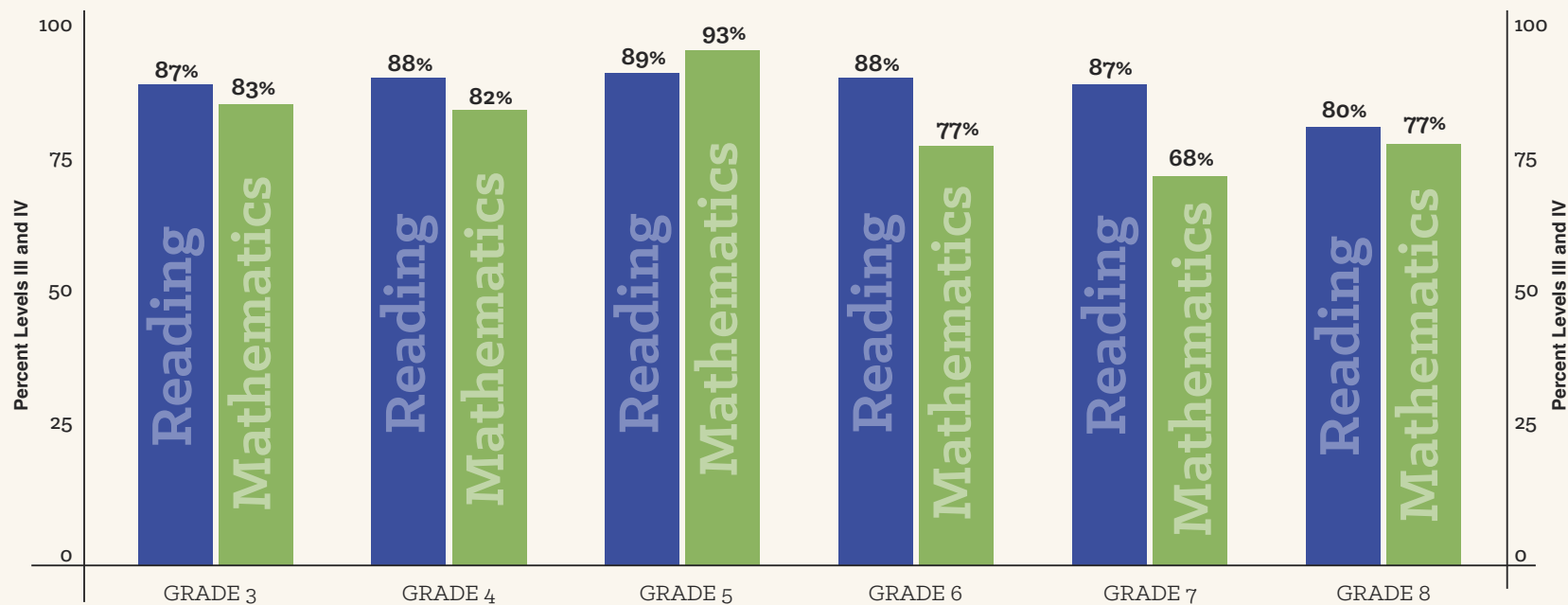

National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) Report

Also known as the nation’s Report Card, the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) is the largest nationally representative and continuous assessment of what America’s students know and can do. There are differences in NAEP and Alabama’s assessments. NAEP is not aligned to any particular content standards, whereas Alabama’s assessments are all aligned with the Alabama courses of study. Proficient as defined for NAEP is “competency over challenging subject matter,” whereas proficient (Levels III and IV) for Alabama’s assessments is defined as “at grade level.” All Alabama students participate in Alabama’s assessments every year at each subject and grade level, but only a small representative sample of Alabama students participate in NAEP reading and mathematics, which is administered every other year.

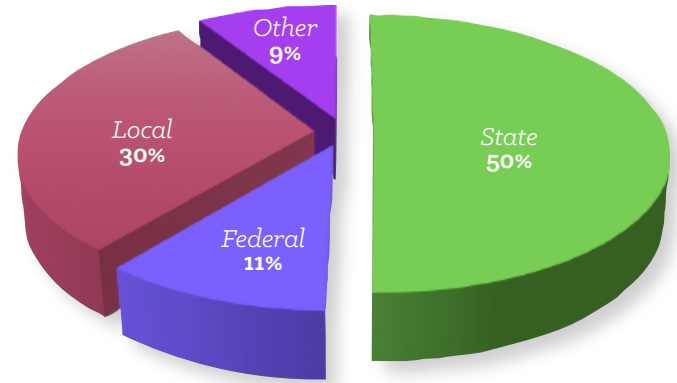

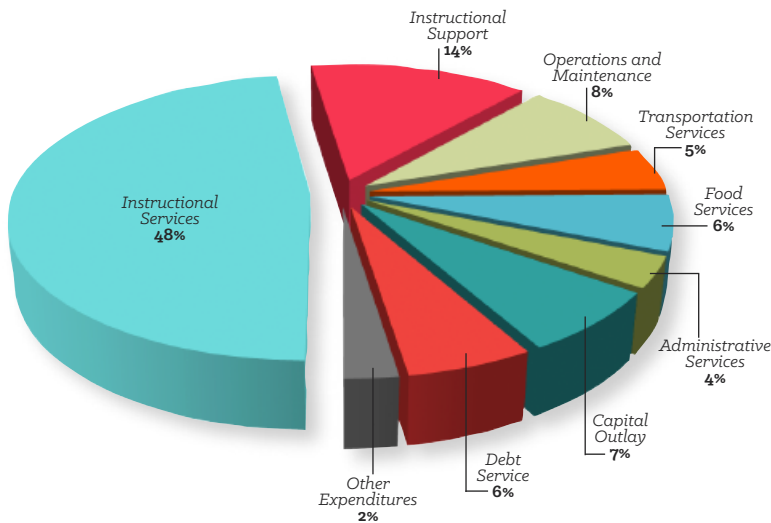
