Advanced Placement Exam




Figure 1. Percentage of 2011–2012 public school graduates in MCPS, Maryland, and the Nation who took at least one AP exam and earned one or more AP exam scores of 3 or higher.

Students in the Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) Class of 2012 continued to outperform Maryland and the nation on Advanced Placement (AP) examinations based on the *AP Report to the Nation* released by the College Board on February 20, 2013. In 2012, 67.3 percent of MCPS graduates took one or more AP exams, a rate that was 19.1 and 34.9 percentage points higher, respectively, than the rate for public school graduates in Maryland (48.2 percent) and the nation (32.4 percent) (Figure 1). A striking percentage of MCPS graduates earned at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher (52.3 percent), which was 22.7 percentage points higher than the rate for public school graduates in Maryland (29.6 percent) and more than twice the rate for public school graduates in the nation (19.5 percent).

The percentage of graduates who took one or more AP exams increased 1.2 percentage points from 2011 to 2012; a similar pattern is noticed for public school graduates in Maryland (1.8 percentage points) and the nation (2.2 percentage points) (Figure 1). Between 2011 and 2012, the percentage of MCPS graduates who earned at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher increased 2.7 percentage points as well as for public school graduates in Maryland (1.7 percentage points) and in the nation (1.4 percentage points).

Particularly noteworthy is the fact that MCPS graduates significantly contributed to Maryland's first place national ranking for AP exam performance. For the fifth year in a row, Maryland had the highest percentage of graduates who earned one or more AP exam scores of 3 or higher. In fact, MCPS students account for 33.1 percent of all of the 2012 Maryland graduates who earned a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam (Table 1).

Among Black or African American graduates in the MCPS Class of 2012, 43.0 percent took at least one AP exam, a rate that was 13.5 and 22.4 percentage points higher than the rate of public school graduates in Maryland (29.5 percent) and in the nation (20.6 percent), respectively (Table 2). More than one half of Hispanic/Latino graduates in the MCPS Class of 2012 (54.2 percent) took an AP exam, compared with 44.0 and 31.4 percent of public school graduates in Maryland and in the nation, respectively.

AP exam performance among Black or African American and Hispanic/Latino graduates in the Class of 2012 was notable districtwide. The percentage of Black or African American graduates in the MCPS Class of 2012 who earned at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher (23.3 percent) was more than twice the rate for Black or African American graduates in Maryland (9.4 percent) and nearly four times the rate for Black or African American graduates nationwide (5.9 percent) (Table 2). The rate of Hispanic/Latino graduates in the MCPS Class of 2012 with at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher (38.1 percent) was 10.4 percentage points higher than the rate of Hispanic/Latino graduates in Maryland (27.7 percent) and was more than twice the rate for Hispanic/Latino graduates in the nation (16.9 percent). The percentage of Black or African American and Hispanic/Latino graduates in the MCPS Class of 2012 with at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher was 3.8 and 18.6 percentage points, respectively, above the national average (19.5 percent) for all graduates.

MCPS high schools continued to support AP exam participation and performance of minority graduates. Between 2011 and 2012, 11 of the 25 high schools showed an increase in the AP exam participation rate for Black or African American graduates, and 12 of the 25 high schools showed an increase in the AP exam participation rate for Hispanic/Latino graduates (Tables A6a and A6b). Eleven of the 25 high schools showed an increase in the percentage of Black or African American graduates who earned an AP exam score of 3 or higher, and 13 of the 25 high schools showed an increase in the percentage of Hispanic/Latino graduates who earned an AP exam score of 3 or higher (Tables A8a and A8b). Eight of the 25 high schools showed increases for both AP exam participation and performance rates for Black or African American, and 9 of the 25 high schools showed increases for both AP exam participation and performance rates for Hispanic/Latino graduates (Tables A6a, A6b, A8a, and A8b).

In 2012, of note are four high schools—Gaithersburg, Col. Zadok Magruder, Rockville, and Wheaton—that demonstrated increases in both AP exam participation and performance for both Hispanic/Latino and Black or African American graduates (Tables A6a, A6b, A8a, and A8b). Gaithersburg, Walter Johnson, Col. Zadok Magruder, Richard Montgomery, Rockville, and Wheaton high schools had an increase in AP exam participation for both Hispanic/Latino and Black or African American graduates. Gaithersburg, Col. Zadok Magruder, Quince Orchard, Rockville, Sherwood, and Wheaton high schools demonstrated an increase in AP exam performance for both Hispanic/Latino and Black or African American graduates.

International Baccalaureate Exam

MCPS provides the International Baccalaureate (IB) program for students at selected high schools as an option of experiencing college-level coursework and earning college credits in high school. The IB program continues to grow and MCPS high school students show a steady increase in taking IB courses and exams. In 2012, 6.8 percent of MCPS graduates took one or more IB exams, a rate that was 1.2 percentage points higher than the rate for MCPS 2011 graduates (Table B1). From 2011 to 2012, the percentage of MCPS graduates who earned at least one IB exam score of 4 or higher increased from 5.1 to 6.1 percent. All racial/ethnic groups made improvements on IB participation and performance between 2011 and 2012.

In 2012, there were eight high schools with IB programs in MCPS. Two high schools—Seneca Valley and John F. Kennedy—began providing an IB program to MCPS students approximately four years ago. Because students who took IB courses and exams in those two schools began to graduate in 2012, there were no comparable IB data for graduates in those two IB schools between 2011 and 2012. Among MCPS graduates in the eight IB schools, the proportion that took at least one IB exam ranged from 9.7 to 46.7 percent. In addition, 6.9 to 42.7 percent of these graduates earned at least one IB score of 4 or higher (Table B2). From 2011 to 2012, three out of six high schools with IB programs showed an increase of IB exam participation rate and four out of six high schools showed an increase in the percentage of graduates who earned at least one IB exam score of 4 or higher. Two high schools—Rockville and Watkins Mill—demonstrated increases in both IB exam participation and performance between 2011 and 2012.

Conclusion

The growth in AP and IB exam results for the MCPS Class of 2012, especially for Hispanic/Latino and Black or African American graduates, may be credited to the district's commitment to provide increasing access to the AP and IB programs and to raise the level of support for underserved students in AP or IB classrooms. High schools have created a school climate of high expectations for all students, encouraged collaboration among staff members, and focused on teaching and learning practices for student achievement. The College Readiness Monitoring Tool developed by the Office of Shared Accountability (OSA) is used by school staff members to identify students for AP or IB course-taking and to monitor AP or IB exam participation and performance. The support provided has translated into AP and IB success, which in turn may promote equity for all students to be ready for college.

The attached tables provide additional information for your review. Table A1 describes AP exam participation and performance of 2010 to 2012 public school graduates in MCPS, Maryland, and the nation. Tables A2 to A5 provide data on AP exam participation and performance for the graduates in the MCPS Classes of 2010 to 2012 by student groups and by high schools. Tables A6 to A9 provide data on AP exam participation and performance of MCPS graduates in 2011 and 2012 by high schools and student groups. Tables B1 and B2 provide data on AP exam participation and performance, IB exam participation and performance, and data on the AP and/or IB exam participation and performance and the attainment of Key 6—at least one AP exam score of 3 or higher or one IB exam score of 4 or higher—by student groups and by high schools 2011 and 2012.
