Subject: INFORMATION: SAT Participation and Performance and the Attainment of College and Career Readiness Benchmark Scores for the Class of 2013




Figure 1. Mean SAT combined scores of graduates in MCPS, Maryland public schools, and the national Classes of 2011 to 2013.

Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) students continue to outperform the state of Maryland and the nation on the SAT according to the *2013 College-bound Seniors* report released by the College Board. The mean SAT combined score (1648) for the MCPS Class of 2013 was 192 and 150 points higher than those for public school graduates (1456) in the state and graduates in the nation (1498), respectively (Figure 1). From 2011 to 2013, MCPS graduates improved the mean SAT combined scores by 11 points, while the scores for Maryland public school graduates and graduates nationwide declined by 16 and 2 points, respectively.




Figure 2. SAT participation rates of graduates in MCPS, Maryland public school, and the national Classes of 2011 to 2013.

In 2013, the participation rate for MCPS graduates (69.2 percent) was similar to that for public school graduates (69.0 percent) statewide and was 19.1 percentage points higher than that for graduates nationwide (50.1 percent) (Figure 2). From 2011 to 2013, the participation rate for MCPS 2013 graduates decreased 1.4 percentage points, while the rates for public school graduates in Maryland and graduates in the nation held steady.




Figure 3. Mean SAT combined scores of Black or African American graduates in MCPS, Maryland public schools, and the national Classes of 2011 to 2013.




Figure 4. Mean SAT combined scores of Hispanic/Latino graduates in MCPS, Maryland public schools, and the national Classes of 2011 to 2013.

On average, MCPS Black or African American students (1397) in the Class of 2013 outperformed their peers in the state (1255) and the nation (1278) by 142 and 119 points, respectively (Figure 3). The mean SAT combined score for MCPS Hispanic/Latino students (1451) in the Class of 2013 was 64 and 97 points higher than their 2013 peers in the state (1387) and the nation (1354), respectively (Figure 4). Race/ethnicity comparison between MCPS and Maryland and the nation should be interpreted with caution because results are not available for students identified as Two or More Races in Maryland and the nation.

Results for SAT Participation and Performance in MCPS

SAT participation and performance are one of the milestones on the path to college and career readiness. Analysis of postsecondary outcomes for MCPS graduates indicates that graduates who took the SAT were more likely to enroll in college and to earn a four-year degree within six years. Overall, SAT participation for the MCPS Class of 2013 declined slightly from 70.6 percent in 2011 to 69.2 percent in 2013 (Table 1). Among all racial/ethnic groups, SAT participation rates increased for Asian graduates (0.5 percentage points) and students identified

as Two or More Races (2.8 percentage points) from 2011 to 2013. Of all graduates receiving special services, there was a notable increase in SAT participation among MCPS graduates who received English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) services in the Class of 2013 (4.2 percentage points) compared with their peers in the Class of 2011.

The most recent mean SAT combined score for the MCPS Class of 2013 (1648) was 11 points higher than that for the Class of 2011 (1637) (Table 1). From 2011 to 2013, all racial/ethnic groups except Hispanic/Latino graduates improved their SAT mean combined scores. Particularly noteworthy was the 2013 mean combined score for Black or African American graduates, which was 15 points higher than that for their 2011 peers. From 2011 to 2013, the graduates who received Free and Reduced-price Meals System (FARMS) and special education services improved their mean SAT combined scores by 14 and 62 points, respectively.

Participation and performance on the SAT varied significantly across high schools in the district. In 2013, 14 of the 25 high schools had participation rates higher than the district average (69.2 percent) (Table A7). Nine of the 25 high schools attained mean SAT combined scores of 1650 or higher, and 4 of the 25 high schools attained mean SAT combined scores of 1800 or higher (Table A8). From 2011 to 2013, 9 of the 25 high schools showed increases in SAT participation rates (2.1–6.7 percentage points) and 18 of the 25 high school improved mean SAT combined scores (7–66 points) (Tables A7 and A8). Of note are seven high schools—Clarksburg, Damascus, Kennedy, Northwest, Rockville, Seneca Valley, and Sherwood—that demonstrated increases in both SAT participation rates and mean SAT combined scores for all graduates.

Attainment of College and Career Readiness Benchmark Scores

Colleges and universities now accept both SAT and ACT college entrance exam scores. One important measure of MCPS' districtwide milestones is scoring 1650 or higher on the SAT, or 24 or higher on the ACT (College and Career Readiness benchmark scores); these scores are a critical focus in the MCPS Strategic Planning Framework, *Building Our Future Together: Students, Staff, and Community*. Overall, MCPS graduates continued to improve the rate of

meeting college and career readiness benchmark scores from 50.4 percent in 2011 to 53.1 percent in 2013 (Table 2). All student groups improved rates of meeting college and career readiness benchmark scores from 2011 to 2013. Particularly, the rate of meeting college and career readiness benchmark scores for Black or African American students in 2013 was 1.9 percentage points higher than that for their peers in 2011. Of all graduates who received special services, there was a notable increase (3.6 percentage points) in the rate meeting college and career readiness benchmark scores for those receiving special education services in the Class of 2013, compared with their peers in the Class of 2011.

MCPS school staff will continue to use the college and career readiness monitoring tools developed by the Office of Shared Accountability as a part of our efforts to improve performance on college entrance exams. College and career readiness monitoring will allow schools to prepare all students for postsecondary and career success by identifying students for academic reinforcement or support as early as Grade 9.

Attached Data Tables Description

The attached tables provide additional information about SAT/ACT participation and performance, as well as the attainment of college and career readiness benchmark scores. Tables in Appendix A are reported based on the students' most recent SAT scores to be consistent with the reporting rule of College-Bound Seniors Report by the College Board.

- Tables A1 to A3 provide data on SAT participation and performance among groups of graduates in the Classes of 2011 to 2013 in MCPS, Maryland, and the nation. Tables A4 to A9 provide SAT data on MCPS student groups and high school participation and performance by gender, race/ethnicity, and service group for the Classes of 2011 to 2013.

- Tables A10 to A14 show the number of graduates, number and percentage of students taking the SAT, and mean SAT critical reading, mathematics, writing, and combined scores by gender, race/ethnicity, and service group by high school for the Class of 2013.

The data tables on SAT performance in Appendix B are based on the highest SAT score in one test administration. MCPS monitors students' highest SAT scores in one test administration to align with the College Board's SAT score-reporting policy, Score Choice. This policy gives students the option to send SAT scores by test date in accordance with a particular college's score-use practice.

- Tables B1 to B5 provide SAT participation and performance data for MCPS high schools and student groups by gender, race/ethnicity, and service groups for the Class of 2013.

Tables in Appendix C describe the participation and performance of SAT and ACT, and the attainment of college and career readiness benchmark scores (scoring 1650 or better on the SAT or 24 or better on the ACT). The reporting rule is based on the highest SAT and ACT scores in one test administration.

- Tables C1 and C2 provide participation and performance on SAT and ACT, participation and performance in SAT or ACT, and data on the attainment of college and career readiness benchmark scores, disaggregated by gender, race/ethnicity, and special services and by high schools for the Classes of 2011–2013.
- Table C3 reports the participation and performance on SAT and ACT; participation and performance in SAT or ACT; and data on the attainment of college and career readiness benchmark scores disaggregated by race/ethnicity, service group, and high school for the Class of 2013.


