



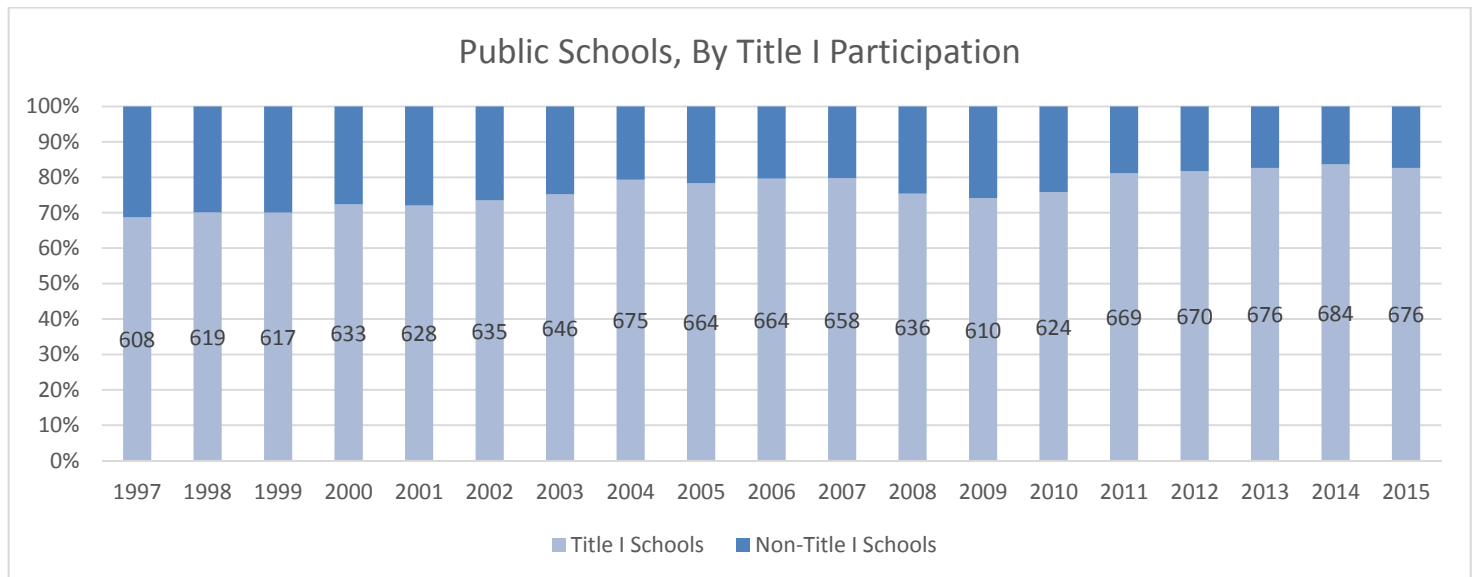
At-Risk Students Fact Sheet

Montana's definition of a basic system of quality public elementary and secondary schools includes educational programs for at-risk students (20-9-309, MCA). State statute defines an at-risk student as a "student who is affected by environmental conditions that negatively impact the student's educational performance or threaten a student's likelihood of promotion or graduation" (20-1-101(4), MCA).

Beginning in FY 2007, the Montana Legislature provided \$5 million annually to local school districts for educational services for at-risk students. The at-risk student payment is distributed in the same manner as federal Title I monies. If a district is not eligible for Title I funds, it does not receive an at-risk student payment. The payment was provided to schools in FY 2007 through FY 2009, but was not funded for FY 2010 and FY 2011. Funding was restored for FY 2012 and later. The law that establishes the at-risk student payment requires the Office of Public Instruction to report to the governor and the Legislature on the change in status of standardized test scores, graduation rates, and dropout rates of at-risk students. (20-9-328, MCA) This fact sheet provides that status report.

Population data – 2014-15 school year

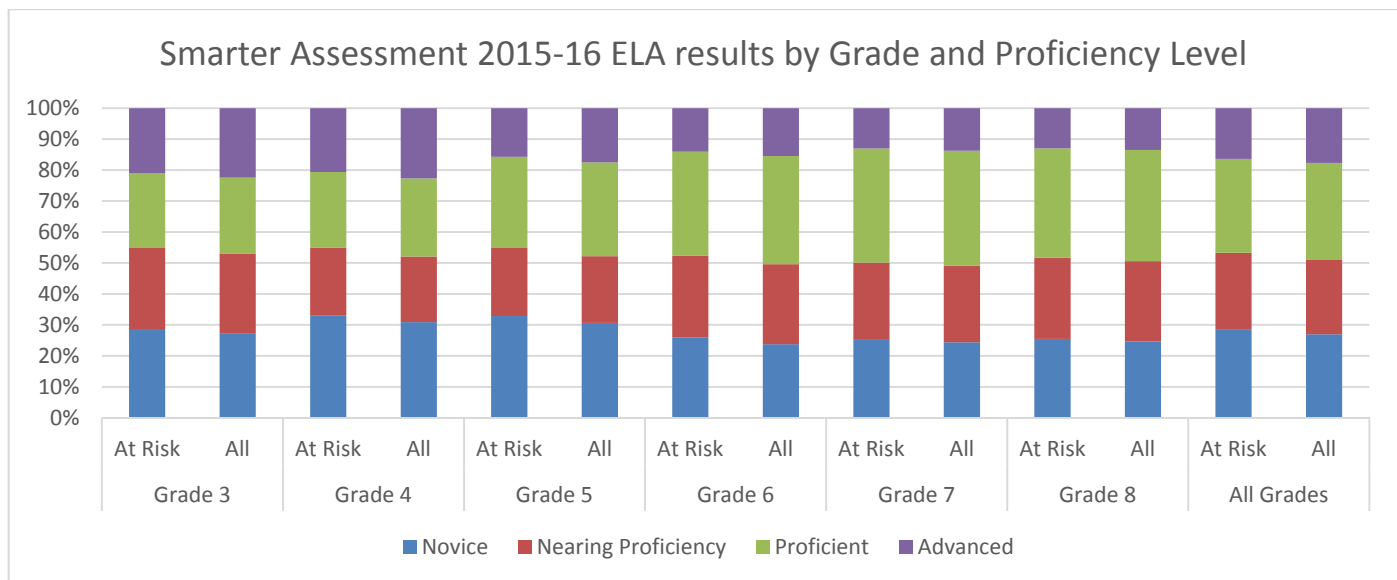
- 112,667 students, or 80% of the PK-12 public school population, were enrolled in a school that received federal Title I funding.
- 82.6% of the public schools in Montana participated in Title I in the 2014-15 school year.
- The number of schools participating in the Title I program has remained stable from 2011 to 2015. Title I school participation decreased from 2007 to 2009.



Testing data for this report is from the 2015-16 Smarter Balanced assessment (Smarter) for math and reading, and the Criterion Referenced Test (CRT) for science. Because it was a field test, the 2013-2014 administration of the Smarter assessment did not yield student or school level proficiency results. Due to a series of technical challenges with the Smarter assessment administration, the 2014-2015 results were not used as a new state baseline. The 2015-16 Smarter assessment is the first year of complete data we have for English/language arts and math since transitioning to Smarter Balanced. Assessment data includes public school data only, and does not include the state-funded schools (the Montana School for the Deaf & Blind and Youth Correctional facilities - Pine Hills or Riverside).

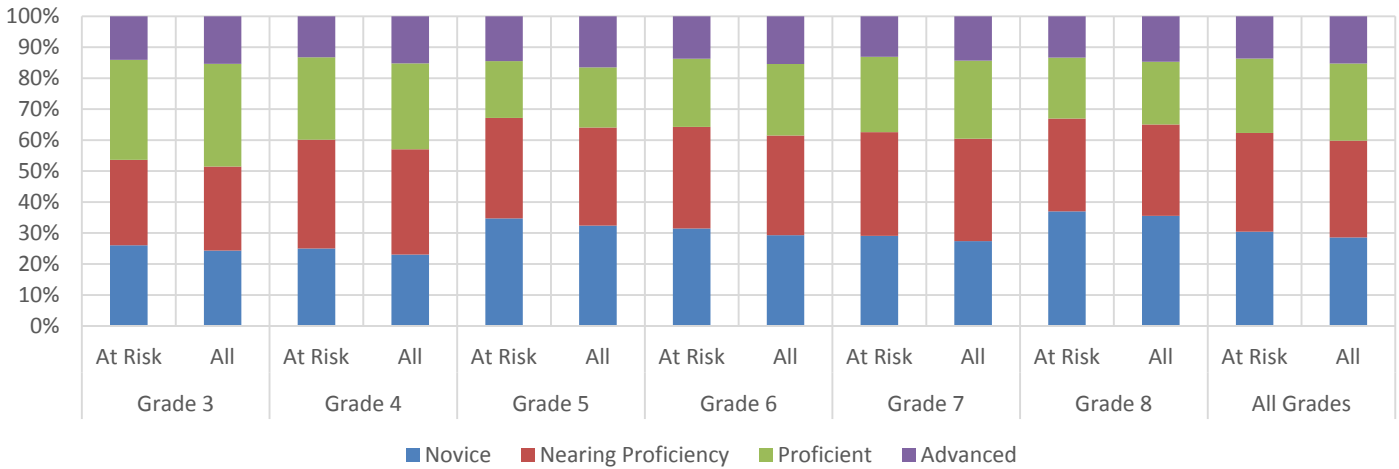
For the 2015-16 school year, a group of school leaders advised the superintendent to cut testing time for 11th grade students by requiring the Smarter assessment for just the elementary and middle school grades and to use the existing statewide 11th grade administration of the ACT for accountability purposes. The OPI has been providing this statewide administration to 11th grade students since the 2012-13 school year. The at-risk student group (those students at schools with Title I programs) make up 78.8% of the elementary and middle school testing population and 75.1% of the high school testing population in 2015-16.

The chart below shows the percentage of students scoring at the Novice, Nearing Proficiency, Proficient, and Advanced proficiency levels on the Smarter ELA assessment for the 2015-16 school year. The data is organized by grade and proficiency level, with separate columns for Title I (at-risk) schools and for all tested schools. For all grades, the percentage of students scoring at the Novice level is slightly higher for Title I schools, and the percentage of students scoring at the Advanced level is slightly lower for Title I schools. For grades 3-8, the overall increase is 1.6% more Novice students and 1.3% fewer Advanced students. The differences decrease from grade 3 to grade 8.



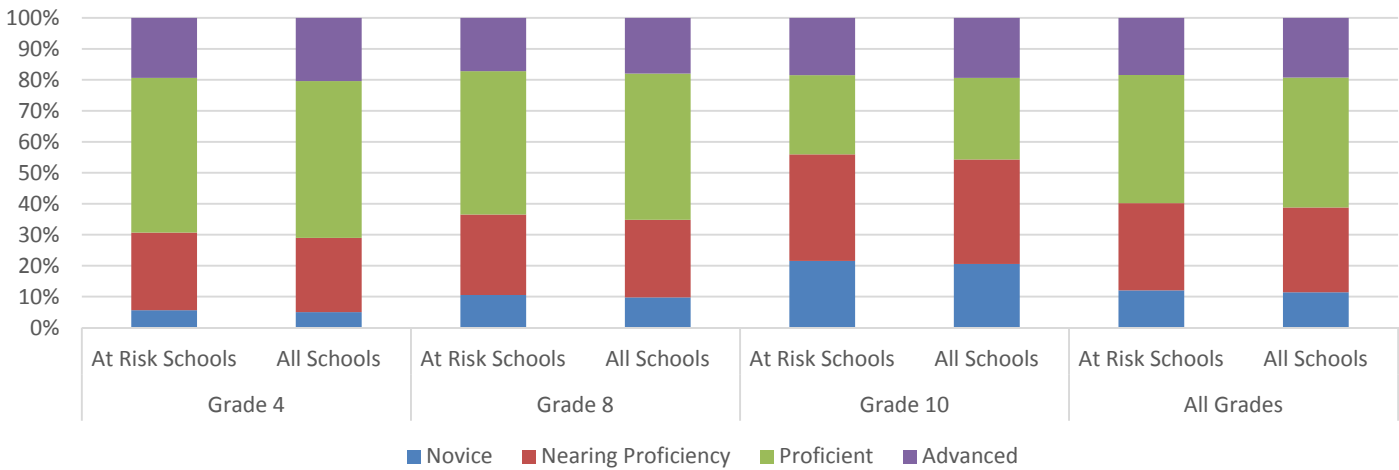
The following chart shows the percentage of students scoring at Novice, Nearing Proficiency, Proficient, and Advanced proficiency levels on the Smarter math assessment for the 2015-16 school year. The data is organized by grade and proficiency level, with separate columns for at-risk schools and for all tested schools. For all grades in the 2015-16 assessment, there is a higher percentage of Novice students at the at-risk schools, and a lower percentage of Advanced students; these gaps are in the 1.3%-2% range, and are highest in the late elementary grades (5 and 6). There is more variation between grades than there is between the at-risk schools and all schools in the Smarter math results.

Smarter Assessment 2015-16 Math Results By Grade and Proficiency Level



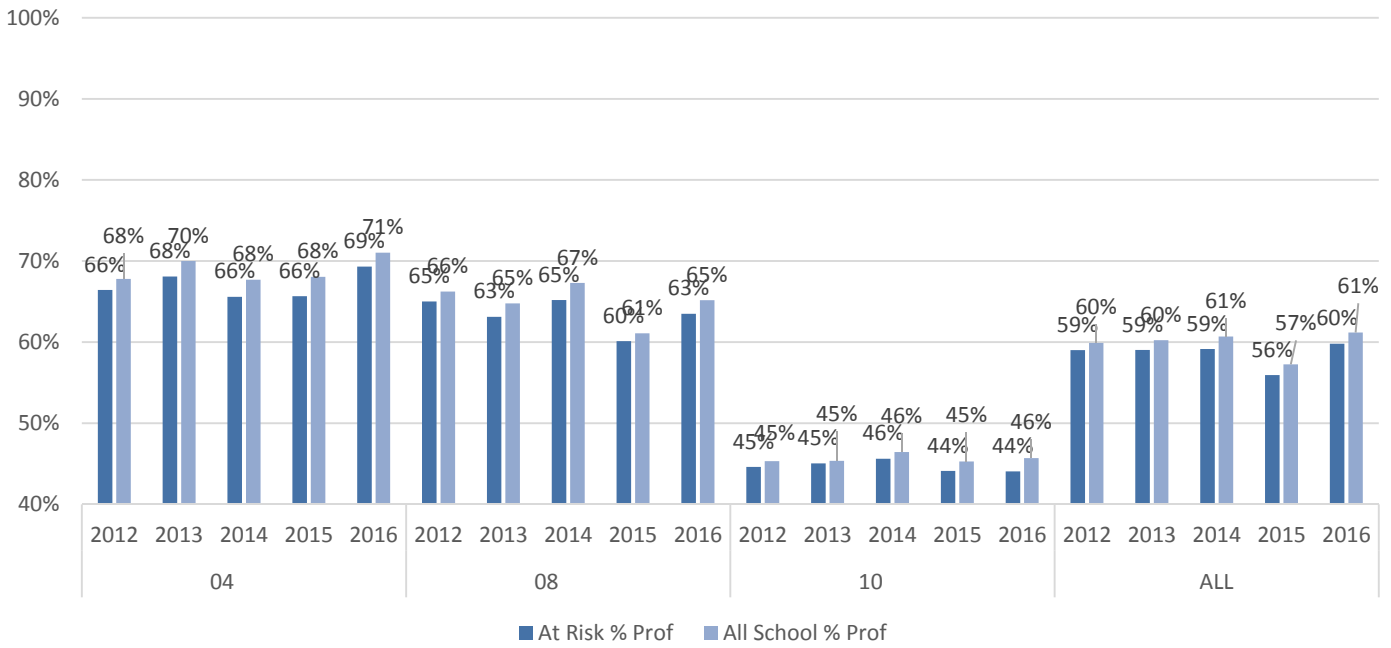
The chart below shows the percentage of students achieving the Novice, Nearing Proficiency, Proficient, and Advanced proficiency levels for the 2015-16 Science CRT assessment. The data is organized by the grade of the test taker and is provided for at-risk schools and for all tested schools. Only grades 4, 8, and 10 are tested for the Science CRT assessment. Overall, the percentage of students in the Novice level is less than 1% higher at the at-risk schools compared to all schools, and the percentage of students scoring at the Advanced level is roughly 1% lower.

CRT Science Assessment, 2015-16, Results by Grade and Proficiency Level

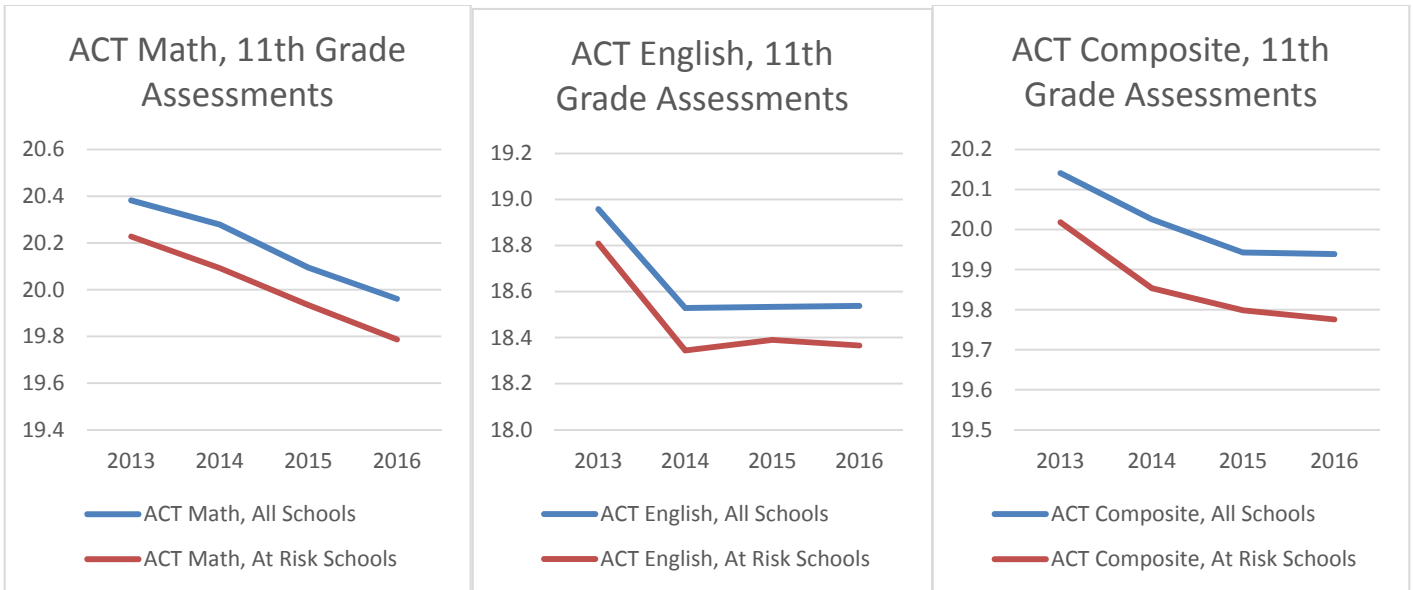


The following chart shows the percentage of students scoring Proficient or Advanced in the Science CRT assessment for FY 2012 through FY 2016. Data are provided for each grade assessed, for each year of the assessment, and for at-risk schools and for all tested schools. There is a consistent 1% difference between the at-risk schools and all schools for all grades, with the highest differences at grades 4 and 8 (2%). There was a decrease in the overall proficiency rate in science in 2015, driven mostly by a decline in grade 8; this decline was seen in both at-risk schools and all schools. The 2016 science proficiency data shows an increase, statewide and in the 4th and 8th grades, for both at-risk schools and all schools.

The charts below shows the average scale scores on the statewide administration of the ACT for the spring of 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016. Charts for the math, English, and composite ACT scores are provided. Both the math and English scores as well as the composite score show a difference of 0.1-0.2 points (out of 36 total) between the at-risk schools and all schools.



Graduation rates

- The Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation rate measures the “on-time” graduation of students, based on a student’s entry date into 9th grade. The rate increased from 82.1% in 2010-11 to 86.0% in 2014-15 for all public schools.
- The differences in graduation rates between the schools receiving the at-risk student payment and all schools is relatively small, roughly 0.5% difference for the all student group between the at-risk schools and all schools.
- For the high school grades, at-risk schools enroll 74% to 75% of the students in public schools.
- For American Indian students in high school, the difference in graduation rate is very small between at-risk schools and all schools; for two of the three years included, the at-risk schools graduate a higher percentage of American Indian students than all schools.
- For high school grades, the at-risk schools have 88% to 89% of the American Indian student cohort.

Dropout rates

- Dropout rates have decreased since the 2007-08 school year for all students, both at Title I schools and for all schools. With the exception of an increase in 2011-12 and another in 2013-14, the dropout rate for American Indian students had decreased since 2007-08.
- Differences in dropout rates between Title I/ At-risk schools and all schools has been very small (within 0.1%) since 2010-11, and the difference between the two school types for American Indian students only slightly larger (0.3%).
- Separate charts are shown for high school (9-12) and middle school (7-8).
- At-risk schools have 75-76% of the overall enrollment in public high schools, and 76-77% of the overall enrollment in grades 7 or 8. The at-risk schools have 88-89% of American Indian student enrollment for both high school and grades 7 or 8.
- Grade 7 and 8 dropout counts are very low statewide; fewer than 50 students annually have dropped out during their 7th or 8th grade school years since 2008-09.
