DEFINITIONS AND METHODS

This report uses data collected under the U.S. Department of Education’s National Center for Educational Statistics (NCES) Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Fall Enrollment survey. Beginning with Fall 2012, the data includes distance education enrollments, using the following:

Item	Definition
Distance education	<p>Education that uses one or more technologies to deliver instruction to students who are separated from the instructor and to support regular and substantive interaction between the students and the instructor synchronously or asynchronously.</p> <p>Technologies used for instruction may include the following: Internet; one-way and two-way transmissions through open broadcasts, closed circuit, cable, microwave, broadband lines, fiber optics, satellite or wireless communication devices; audio conferencing; and video cassette. DVDs, and CD-ROMS, if the cassette, DVDs, and CD-ROMS are used in a course in conjunction with the technologies listed above.</p>
Distance education course	<p>A course in which the instructional content is delivered exclusively via distance education. Requirements for coming to campus for orientation, testing, or academic support services do not exclude a course from being classified as distance education.</p>

IPEDS collects distance education enrollments in two categories:

- “Exclusively” distance education: All of the student’s enrollments for the term were through distance education courses.
- “Some but not all” distance education: The student enrolled in a mix of course modalities, including some distance education courses.

This report creates a third category – composed of the sum of “exclusively” and “some but not all” distance education courses:

- "At least one" distance education course: A new data field created as the sum of the above two categories.

The sample for this analysis is comprised of all active, degree-granting institutions of higher education in the United States that are open to the public. The focus of this report is the distance education data that has been collected by IPEDS for the fall 2012, fall 2013, fall 2014 and fall 2015 terms. IPEDS reporting includes a number of other variables that describe the size, sector, and focus of each institution of higher education. This data allows us to compare institutions using a consistent set of definitions provided by the IPEDS survey.


Note: Changes over time for individual institutions is calculated using their IPEDS ID numbers. A small number of institutions have changed the way in which they report to IPEDS, and have not maintained the same ID numbers, so linkage is not possible. This does not impact data for a particular year, nor any national or state level comparisons - it will, however, preclude the inclusion of these institutions in a state list of top ten growth in overall enrollments or distance enrollments.

NATIONAL OVERVIEW

In higher education, 29.7% of all students are taking at least one distance course. The total distance enrollments are composed of 14.3% of students (2,902,756) taking exclusively distance courses and 15.4% (3,119,349) who are taking a combination of distance and non-distance courses.

Overall Higher Education Enrollments are Down

There were 20,928,443 total students in fall 2012 at all levels enrolled across all degree-granting institutions. Three years later in the fall of 2015, this number had decreased by 662,076, or 3.2%, to 20,266,367. Overall enrollments decreased by 248,091 students from 2012 to 2013, by 171,822 from 2013 to 2014, and by a further 242,163 from 2014 to 2015. This pattern represents a new set of conditions for higher education institutions; the previous period of 2002 through 2012 averaged a 2.7% compound annual growth rate for overall enrollments. For the first time in over a decade, higher education institutions find themselves competing for a smaller pool of students.




The vast majority of all U.S. higher education students attend public institutions. Public institutions represented 72.3% of all fall 2015 enrollments. Private non-profits represented 20.8%, while for-profit institutions enrolled only 6.9% of all students.

Most Distance Enrollments are at Larger Institutions

Larger institutions make up a small portion of all active degree-granting institutions, but command the lion's share of student enrollments. Schools with 15,000 or more total enrollments comprise only 7.1% of all institutions (341 of 4,836), yet they enroll over nine million students (9,326,861, or 46.0% of all student enrollments).


TOTAL ENROLLMENT BY SIZE OF INSTITUTION - 2015



Distance Education Enrollment Growth is Increasing


Students who are taking at least one distance education course comprise 29.7% of all higher education enrollments as of fall 2015. This share represents the total of those who are taking all of their courses at a distance, and those who are taking a combination of distance and non-distance courses. The proportion of the higher education student body taking advantage of distance education courses has increased each of the last three years. It stood at 25.9% in 2012, at 27.1% in 2013, and at 28.3% in 2014.

The number of students taking at least one distance education course increased 3.9% over the previous year, and grew by 11.0% in the three years since 2012. The 3.9% growth rate exceeds that observed between 2012 and 2013 (3.4%) and between 2013 and 2014 (3.3%). The 6,022,105 total of distance education students for 2015 includes 4,999,112 who are studying at the undergraduate level, and 1,022,993 who are studying at the graduate level.

STUDENTS TAKING DISTANCE COURSES BY LEVEL - 2012-2015




Public Institutions Host Two-thirds of All Distance Learners

Among all students who were taking at least one distance course in fall 2015, 1,020,622 (17.8%) were at a private non-profit institution, 870,918 (14.5%) were at a for-profit institution, and the vast majority, 4,080,565 (67.8%), were at a public institution. Most distance enrollments at public institutions were at four-year institutions, with 2,254,708 students (55.3%), while 1,825,857 (44.7%) enrolled at two-year institutions.

Distance Enrollments Are Primarily Undergraduate


There are nearly five times as many undergraduate enrollments (4,999,112) as graduate enrollments (1,022,993) among students taking at least one distance education course. The proportion of undergraduates (83.0%) among students taking at last one distance course is only slightly less than the proportion among the overall higher education population (85.3%).

DISTANCE AND TOTAL ENROLLMENTS PERCENTAGE UNDERGRADUATE - 2015




Percentage of Students Enrolled in at Least One Distance Course - 2015




Percentage Change in Number of Students Enrolled in at Least One Distance Course - 2012 to 2015




Percentage of Students Taking Exclusively Distance Courses - 2015




Percentage of Students Enrolled Exclusively in Distance Courses Studying in the Same State as the Institution - 2015




Percentage of Students Who Take Some or All of Their Courses On Campus - 2015




Number of Students Taking Exclusively Distance Courses From Outside of the United States


Percentage of Students Taking at Least One Distance Course Who Are Studying at the Graduate Level - 2015




Percentage of Students in State Enrolled at Two-Year Institutions - 2015




Percentage of Students in State Taking at Least One Distance Course Enrolled at Two-Year Institutions - 2015




Percentage of Students in State Enrolled at Public Institutions - 2015




Percentage of Students in State Taking at Least One Distance Course Enrolled at Public Institutions - 2015

The United States has 4,836 degree-granting higher education institutions across all 50 states and territories. In total, these institutions enrolled a total of 20,266,367 students as of fall 2015 (17,284,241 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 2,982,126 at the graduate level). 


Distribution of Total Student Enrollment



Arkansas has 55 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 1.1% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 168,402 students as of fall 2015 (148,630 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 19,772 at the graduate level). The fall 2015 figure is a decrease of 6,688 students (or -3.8%) from the number enrolled in the fall of 2012.




Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment



Hawaii has 21 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 0.4% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 69,331 students as of fall 2015 (61,366 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 7,965 at the graduate level). The fall 2015 figure is a decrease of 9,105 students (or -11.6%) from the number enrolled in the fall of 2012.

Among the total student body, 21,543 (19,954 undergraduates and 1,589 graduate students) were taking at least one course at a distance. This is 31.1% of the enrolled student body, which is higher than the national average rate of 29.7%. The number of students taking distance education courses in the state increased by 313 (or 1.5%) between fall 2012 and fall 2015. This is lower than the national level of growth of 11.0%.

8,133 students in Hawaii are taking all of their courses at a distance, made up of 7,427 undergraduates and 706 graduates. This represents 11.7% of all students enrolled in the state, a rate that is lower than the national average of 14.3%. A total of 7,137 (or 87.8% of these exclusively online students) live in Hawaii, the remainder come from outside of the state. This rate is higher than the national in-state average of 55.1%.


The number of students that take any of their courses on campus, including those who take all of their courses on campus and those who take a mix of on-campus and distance courses, is 61,198, or 88.3% of the total student enrollment in Hawaii. This number represents a decrease in proportion on campus from the four years prior (88.9% from 69,700 students in 2012). The -0.6% rate is a smaller change than the national 1.7% decrease.




Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment



Idaho has 20 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 0.4% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 121,108 students as of fall 2015 (113,244 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 7,864 at the graduate level). The fall 2015 figure is an increase of 12,925 students (or 11.9%) from the number enrolled in the fall of 2012.

Among the total student body, 60,704 (57,192 undergraduates and 3,512 graduate students) were taking at least one course at a distance. Illinois has 194 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 4.0% of all such institutions in the United States. 


Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment



Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment



Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment



Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment



Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment



Rhode Island has 13 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 0.3% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 82,292 students as of fall 2015 (71,972 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 10,320 at the graduate level). The fall 2015 figure is a decrease of 1,660 students (or -2.0%) from the number enrolled in the fall of 2012.

Among the total student body, 10,539 (9,511 undergraduates and 1,028 graduate students) were taking at least one course at a distance. This is 12.8% of the enrolled student body, which is lower than the national average rate of 29.7%. The number of students taking distance education courses in the state increased by 447 (or 4.4%) between fall 2012 and fall 2015. This is lower than the national level of growth of 11.0%.

1,719 students in Rhode Island are taking all of their courses at a distance, made up of 1,165 undergraduates and 554 graduates. This represents 2.1% of all students enrolled in the state, a rate that is lower than the national average of 14.3%. A total of 881 (or 51.3% of these exclusively online students) live in Rhode Island, the remainder come from outside of the state. This rate is lower than the national in-state average of 55.1%.


The number of students that take any of their courses on campus, including those who take all of their courses on campus and those who take a mix of on-campus and distance courses, is 80,573, or 97.9% of the total student enrollment in Rhode Island. This number represents a decrease in proportion on campus from the four years prior (98.4% from 82,605 students in 2012). The -0.5% rate is a smaller change than the national 1.7% decrease.




Distribution of Total Student Enrollment



South Carolina has 79 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 1.6% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 249,758 students as of fall 2015 (223,692 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 26,066 at the graduate level). 


Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Total Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment






Distribution of Distance Student Enrollment



Wyoming has 10 degree-granting higher education institutions, which represent 0.2% of all such institutions in the United States. These institutions enrolled a total of 34,205 students as of fall 2015 (31,602 of which are studying at the undergraduate level and 2,603 at the graduate level). The fall 2015 figure is a decrease of 3,537 students (or -9.4%) from the number enrolled in the fall of 2012.

Among the total student body, 10,923 (10,235 undergraduates and 688 graduate students) were taking at least one course at a distance. This is 31.9% of the enrolled student body, which is higher than the national average rate of 29.7%. The number of students taking distance education courses in the state decreased by 23 (or -0.2%) between fall 2012 and fall 2015. This is lower than the national level of growth of 11.0%.

4,130 students in Wyoming are taking all of their courses at a distance, made up of 3,603 undergraduates and 527 graduates. This represents 12.1% of all students enrolled in the state, a rate that is lower than the national average of 14.3%. A total of 3,603 (or 87.2% of these exclusively online students) live in Wyoming, the remainder come from outside of the state. This rate is higher than the national in-state average of 55.1%.


The number of students that take any of their courses on campus, including those who take all of their courses on campus and those who take a mix of on-campus and distance courses, is 30,075, or 87.9% of the total student enrollment in Wyoming. This number represents a decrease in proportion on campus from the four years prior (88.8% from 33,514 students in 2012). The -0.9% rate is a smaller change than the national 1.7% decrease.




Distribution of Total Student Enrollment


