
English Learners (ELs) and Charter Schools

This fact sheet uses data from the Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC). CRDC defines charter school as a "nonsectarian public school under contract—or charter—between a public agency and groups of parents, teachers, community leaders, or others who want to create alternatives and choice within the public school system."


In SY 2013–14, states reported a total of 6,239 charter schools nationwide.


Fact

In SY 2013–14, the average percentage of charter school students who were ELs, nationally, was 9.8 percent. Eight states reported EL enrollment rates in charter schools higher than the national average.


In SY 2013–14, 18 states reported higher percentages of ELs among charter school students than among non-charter school students.

In SY 2013–14, Texas, Minnesota, and California reported the highest percentages of charter school students who were ELs. Texas and Minnesota also reported higher percentages of ELs among charter school students than among non-charter school students.
