Parental Right to Know Guide

Notice of Non-Discrimination and Non-Retaliation.

Parents have the right to know that District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) is committed to ensuring that all employees act in conformity with federal and District of Columbia <u>non-discrimination</u> laws. Teachers and Paraprofessionals.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) eliminated the need for highly qualified teachers. However, parents have the right to request teacher information by contacting the school <u>Principal</u>.

Student Achievement (PARCC Data).

Parents have the right to know that the 2018 PARCC results can be obtained from the District of Columbia Public Schools website.

Student Records.

Parents have the right to know that the District of Columbia Public Schools must provide notification regarding publicly released student information (FERPA). This includes parent notice if military or college recruiters request student data.

Unsafe School Choice Option.

You have the right to be notified if your child is the victim of a violent crime at school. In addition, you have the right to request a transfer for your child if he or she is the victim of a violent crime at school. English Learners (ELs).

Parents have the right to know 1) their child's English Proficiency Level (PL), 2) if DCPS meets annual measurable objectives, and 3) how they can be involved in their student's education. Notice of Educational Rights for Homeless Children.

Parents have the right to school choice and comparable services – to include transportation, educational services, and meals, for homeless students. For more information, contact the School Culture Division at (202) 442-4404.
