Introduction

The Aid Like A Paycheck student survey was designed to shed light on students' academic and financial attitudes, behaviors, and circumstances over the course of a semester. This supplement to MDRC's final report on Aid Like A Paycheck describes the survey, response rates, and responses to each survey item at three community college systems: two in and around Houston, Texas (San Jacinto College and the Houston Community College System), which participated in a randomized controlled trial, and one in California (the West Hills Community College District), which scaled up the intervention to implement biweekly payments for all eligible students. MDRC developed and administered the Aid Like A Paycheck student survey with generous support from MetLife Foundation, and with the partnership of the Center for Financial Services Innovation (CFSI) and the Center for Community College Student Engagement (CCCSE). Some individual survey items were drawn from CFSI and CCCSE instruments, as indicated in the tables in this supplement.

Houston Community College and San Jacinto College: Monthly Student Survey Design and Administration

The Aid Like A Paycheck survey was administered online and over the telephone to students who entered the Aid Like A Paycheck study in the fall 2015 or spring 2016 semester at Houston Community College (HCC) and San Jacinto College (San Jacinto). About 1,000 students were randomly selected from the study's program and standard (control) groups — split evenly across colleges and semesters — and were invited to respond to the survey once per month for any or all of the four months during their first program semester at the colleges. A total of four monthly surveys were administered per semester, and student responses took an average of 5 to 20 minutes depending on the survey's length and response mode (that is, online or over the phone). Incentives to complete the survey ranged from \$10 to \$30, depending on the length of the survey and timing of administration.

As shown in Table A.1., the survey response rates ranged from about 51 percent to 65 percent. Of the completed surveys, 80 percent were conducted online and 20 percent were completed via phone. More than 45 percent of all completed surveys were completed on mobile phones. While the survey results provide a description of the standard student experience as well

as students' reactions to the Aid Like A Paycheck program, the overall response rates and differential responses suggest that the survey findings — particularly the differences between students in the program and standard groups, and any moderate changes seen over time — should be interpreted with caution. The average response rate was nearly 60 percent, but differed somewhat across months, colleges, and research groups. The surveys administered in the first and fourth months of the semester generally had the highest response rates. Surveys in the second and third months had somewhat lower rates.

The response rates in the first month at San Jacinto and the fourth month at both San Jacinto and HCC meet the What Works Clearinghouse (WWC) guidelines for acceptable attrition rates. However, the response rates in the other months are either low or different across research groups to the extent that they could introduce unacceptable levels of bias. Those results could receive a WWC rating no higher than “meets evidence standards with reservations,” provided baseline equivalence of the analysis sample is established. For some months of the survey, baseline equivalence tests among respondents at each college indicate that some observable student characteristics differ significantly between research groups. However, when survey response analyses were run with covariate adjustments, the results were generally consistent with the unadjusted estimates, suggesting that the differences in observable characteristics most likely did not substantially affect the results. However, any unobservable differences between respondents could not be controlled for, and may be reflected in the differences in responses between research groups, confounding the causal effect estimate of Aid Like A Paycheck on the survey outcomes.

Due to the large number of questions asked in the survey, it is expected that some seemingly large or statistically significant differences between the program and standard groups will appear by chance. The p-values in the supplemental tables included here have not been adjusted for multiple comparisons. About one in twenty hypothesis tests will return a p-value that falls below the commonly used 0.05 threshold for statistical significance by chance, even when there is no causal difference between groups.

Due to skip patterns, several questions in the student survey had fewer respondents than the full sample. As a result, there is less statistical power to estimate the significance of the differences between groups on answers to these questions. The most extreme example of this scenario is the number of respondents who were not enrolled in college, which fell below 10 in each month of the survey (Question A2). In other words, because only a few survey respondents were no longer enrolled in college, the difference between research groups' reasons for not enrolling cannot be estimated with as much statistical strength as estimates of other measures on the survey.

West Hills Community College District: One-Time Student Survey Design and Administration

A version of the student survey was administered at the West Hills Community College District (West Hills) during its fall 2016 term. Unlike the surveys administered at the two Texas colleges, West Hills administered its survey once, between the middle of November and the middle of December, via the Survey Monkey online software. Furthermore, no monetary incentives

were offered to students at West Hills to complete the survey. A total of 2,664 students were sent invitations and three subsequent reminders to complete the survey online. This sample comprised all students receiving financial aid disbursements during the fall 2016 semester. With just under 500 students responding to at least one question, the final response rate at West Hills was 18 percent.² Due to the lower response rate, different method of administering the survey, and different setting at West Hills, comparisons between the West Hills survey responses and those at HCC and San Jacinto should be made with caution because different types of students are likely to respond to surveys under these different circumstances.

NOTES: In the first survey month at HCC, the combination of an overall response rate of around 60 percent and a 5 percent differential in response rates between the program and standard groups may result in biased estimates. During Months 2 and 3, similar bias may result from the combination of response rates and differentials between research groups at both colleges. Consequently, these results could receive a rating no higher than "meets evidence standard with reservations" by the What Works Clearinghouse standards.
