


Question: How are fine arts credits related to postsecondary enrollment?

Response:

AISD graduates in the Class of 2006 who earned between 5 and 8 fine arts credits were more likely to attend postsecondary institutions than those earning less than 5 credits. The difference in postsecondary enrollment rates was more dramatic for economically disadvantaged students than for those not identified as economically disadvantaged.

- Students without economic disadvantage were 19% more likely to attend postsecondary institutions if they had earned between 5 and 8 credits. Additional credits in fine arts did not seem as positively related to postsecondary enrollment.
- ➤ Economically disadvantaged graduates were 54% more likely to attend postsecondary institutions if they had earned at least 5 credits in fine arts.
