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North Dakota University System 2023 Fall Enrollment Report

October 2023

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Introduction

This report aims to provide an overview of the annual fall census data for students enrolled in degree credit courses within the North Dakota University System (NDUS). Please note that, except for Table 10, all tables in this report exclusively represent data for students enrolled in degree credit courses.

Table 10 focuses on developmental and collaborative coursework. Collaborative courses are included in the degree credit coursework count when applicable, while developmental courses are excluded since credits earned from them cannot be applied towards certificates or degree programs.

This report introduces significant changes compared to prior versions of the annual Fall Enrollment Report. It incorporates two new tables and includes revisions to existing ones. For a comprehensive summary of these changes, please refer to the detailed table provided in the addendum of this report.

In addition to the annual Fall Enrollment Report, NDUS also offers an abridged Spring Enrollment Report each year. The NDUS also produces an Annual Enrollment Report, accounting for unduplicated enrollment in degree credit, non-degree credit, and noncredit activities throughout the academic year, as well as Programs Completed and Programs Enrolled reports annually, which cover certificates and degrees awarded during the academic year and students' program plans as of the fall census, respectively.

FIGURE 1: Undergraduate Headcount by State



FIGURE 2: Graduate Headcount by State



FIGURE 3: Headcount by North Dakota County



Definitions

Academic Level

A grouping of students within a career defined by credit hours earned and institutional policy.

Age

Age is calculated based on student's date of birth as entered in the student information system. For census reporting, age is as of the 20th day of classes during the specified term. NDUS reporting truncates student age to whole year classification.

Alumni Dependent

A tuition residency group coded for the dependents of NDUS alumni. Per SBHE Policy 805.1(3)(b), Undergraduate students who are children or spouses of graduates of NDUS institutions qualify for a tuition rate that is 150% of the resident rate, regardless of residency. Students meeting this requirement should be coded as ALDEP.

APO AE/AP

A military post office address.

Beginning Freshmen

A full-time or part-time student attending college for the first time as a freshman. This is a calculated value in Report D of the census enrollment reporting. For the Fall semester, this value includes students who started in the previous summer term.

Blended

See Combo.

Collaborative

An admit type for a fully admitted student in good academic standing at the home institution who is taking an approved course at a separate NDUS provider institution. Student admit type at the provider institution is collaborative. See *Home Institution*.

Combo

A course delivery mode category that describes a course delivered by more than one instructional mode, usually some combination of face to face and distance ed. Includes Hybrid, Hyflex, and Blended.

Contiguous

A reduced tuition rate for students from states bordering North Dakota, including Montana, South Dakota, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan are states/provinces that border North Dakota, per SBHE Policy 805.1(3)(a).

Degree Credit

Instructional activities which result in the award of college credit that can be applied toward a college degree.

Degree Seeking

A student enrolled in courses for credit and recognized by the institution as seeking a degree, certificate, or other formal award. A high school student enrolled in postsecondary courses for credit is not considered degree/certificate-seeking.

Delivery Mode

The instructional delivery method of a course as determined by Board approval. Includes the following: On campus face to face, off campus face to face; independent study, online synchronous, online asynchronous, interactive video and combo.

Developmental

A basic academic skills course designed to prepare students to complete regular academic degree-credit courses. All NDUS courses numbered less than 100 are developmental courses.

Developmental courses may count toward a student's full-time course load but do not count as degree credit coursework.

Developmental Only

An enrolled student who is taking developmental (remedial) courses. These students are not counted in enrollment counts.

Distance Education

An academic program or institutional-approved credit course that uses one or more technologies to deliver instruction to students who participate in coursework from a location physically separate from the instructor. Distance education may occur synchronously or asynchronously. Distance education delivery modes include online synchronous, online asynchronous, interactive video, and independent Study.

Duplicated

An enrollment count in which an individual student may be counted more than once because they are enrolled in more than one course delivery method or on more than one campus.

Enrollment

A single enrollment constitutes a single student enrolled in a single course or institution. A student may carry more than one enrollment per term, enrolling in multiple courses or at multiple institutions.

Full Time (FT)

Determined each term, a full-time undergraduate student is defined as enrolled in 12 or more credit hours. For graduate and professional students, full time is defined as being enrolled in 9 or more credit hours. (SBHE policy 440).

Full Time Equivalency (FTE)

A measure used to determine an enrollment equivalent based on all students attending full time. On a semester, FTE is calculated as undergraduate total credit hours divided by 15; graduate total credit hours divided by 12. Every professional student is counted as one FTE student. In this report, FTE is rounded to nearest whole number.

Full Time Equivalency (FTE) as a calculated column

Using in the *CS – Student Records Enrollment History* data model, FTE is a rounded whole number determined by a creating a calculated column within the model as follows:

Graduate Level (GRAD)

An academic level used for a student who holds a bachelor's or first professional degree or equivalent and is taking courses at the post-baccalaureate level.

Headcount

The distinct count of individual students enrolled in credit courses, regardless of credit load. When counts are disaggregated at institutional or course level, a student may be duplicated if enrolled in more than one course delivery or institution (See Duplicated).

High School Students

Used to identify a high school student enrolled in college coursework. Means a student who has not yet graduated from high school but is enrolled in a college class for credit. Includes both dual credit and early entry categories, however, these categories are not differentiated within NDUS data.

Home Institution

The Institution where the student is fully admitted into a degree program. This is used for the Collaborative Student process, among other things.

Hybrid

See Combo.

Hyflex

See Combo.

Independent Study

A course delivery mode where Instruction occurs in a self-study, self-paced format with mutual the instructor and student agreement on method(s) of communication.

Instruction Mode

See Delivery Mode.

International

A tuition residency status for a student who originates from outside the United States.

Interactive Video

A course delivery mode where video and audio communications occur synchronously between two or more remote sites with live, animated image transmission and display. This connection allows for both the faculty and students to be seen and heard by each other without physically being in the same classroom.

MHEC

A Tuition reduction program offered to states participating in the Midwestern Higher Education

Compact (MHEC). States currently participating with North Dakota include Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, and Wisconsin. To receive this residency coding and corresponding tuition rate, the student must meet guidelines. Not all graduate programs participate.

MN Reciprocity

An undergraduate tuition residency category that includes students approved by the state of Minnesota to be charged the reduced tuition rate, per the North Dakota – Minnesota Reciprocity Agreement.

MN Professional

A graduate tuition residency category encompassed within the North Dakota – Minnesota Reciprocity Agreement. See *MN Reciprocity*.

ND Military

A residency category for active duty members of the U.S. military, who receive North Dakota instate tuition.

Non-Degree Seeking

A student enrolled in institutional instructional activities, except for remedial courses typically taken by degree seeking students, which result in the award of college credit.

Non-Resident

A tuition residency group for a student who does not meet any of the other tuition residency choices.

Not Specified

Used when a student did not self-report within a category listed.

Off Campus Face to Face

A course delivery mode where the instructor and students are physically located in the same place in an off-campus location and may incorporate the use of multiple supportive technologies as appropriate.

On Campus Face to Face

A course delivery mode that describes a traditional classroom where the instructor and students are physically located in the same place and location, at the same time.

Online Asynchronous

Online instruction that occurs independent of time or location and does not require the instructor and student(s) to be online at the same time.

Online Synchronous

Online instruction occurs independent of location, but at the same time (real time) for instructor and student(s).

Part Time (PT)

Determined each term, an undergraduate or graduate student who is enrolled in courses for credit but less than full-time. (see Full Time)

Professional Level (PROF)

An academic level used for medical, law and pharmacy students.

Race

Group or groups with which a person identifies as having origins as identified as valid values for IPEDs reporting.

Scheduled Credit Hours (SCH)

The sum of all course credit hours in which students are enrolled.

Transfer

Undergraduate students who have earned college credit at another postsecondary institution following high school graduation (SBHE Policy 440).

Total

See Duplicated.

Tuition Residency

The official residency used for tuition purposes, determined by the state and institutional policy.

Undergraduate

A student enrolled in a bachelor's degree program, an associate's degree program, or a vocational, technical or other program below the baccalaureate. Includes high school students taking college coursework for credit.

Unduplicated

A distinct count across measured fields.

WUE

Tuition reduction program offered to states participating in the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) and the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP). States participating in the program along with North Dakota include Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming. Not all programs at all institutions are eligible for tuition reduction.
