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

ardly a day goes by without a delegation touching down in New England from some faraway place seeking the secret behind America's innovationbased economy. It is in this small corner of the United States, they know, that the dynamic relationship between education and prosperity has been most developed, if not perfected. It's here where world-class and up-and-coming colleges alike prepare students for occupations that may not have existed when those students first stepped on campus, where university research labs spin off new companies and whole new industries, and where vibrant campuses energize host cities and villages.

Many of these visitors arrive knowing just a handful of famous New England colleges and universities and leave awed by the breadth of the region's higher education offerings. Indeed, it is the diversity of New England's 270-plus campuses public and private, two-year and four-year, religious and secular, professional and liberal arts—that makes the region truly world-class.

The colleges and universities listed here directly employ more than 250,000 people and spend \$20 billion annually in operating costs alone. They draw in 850,000 students each year from across the nation and around the globe and send them forth as teachers, skilled medical technicians, entrepreneurs, engineers, poets, even future Nobel laureates.

Ironically, however, the region faces significant challenges in its backyard. All six New England states are among the bottom 10 nationally in the growth of their 18- to 24-year-old populations since 1990. By some estimates, only 76 percent of New England ninth-graders graduate from high school in the normal four years time, and just 59 percent of those high school graduates enroll in college the following fall. Then, only one in five students graduate from New England community colleges within three years of enrolling. Fewer than half graduate from New England four-year state colleges within six years. Even at the region's public land grant universities, just 65 percent of students earn four-year degrees in six years; only 74 percent at private institutions do.

Three in 10 doctorates awarded by New England universities go to foreign students, while just one in 10 go to U.S. minority students. Many of our own residents simply cannot afford the colleges we boast about to the rest of the world. Total yearly charges for resident students, including room and board, average nearly \$40,000 at New England's private four-year institutions and \$18,000 at the region's underfunded public campuses. While Americans pay an average of \$242 each in annual state taxes to support public higher education and student aid in their states, New Englanders pay \$177.

If New England is to serve the world and provide a ladder to success for its own people, the colleges and universities in this directory must innovate and collaborate. They can find an excellent model in NEBHE's tuition-saving Regional Student Program, which this year celebrates its 50th anniversary. This "Tuition Break" program provides a discount on the out-of-state tuition students normally pay at public colleges and universities in the other New England states if they pursue approved majors that are not offered by the state colleges in their home state. Since it was established in 1957, this NEBHE program has provided New England students and families with significant savings on more than 200,000 annual college tuition bills. And the six states have saved untold millions of dollars by avoiding duplication of programs already available in other New England states. It's a common market with a proven track record—and it's a model of cooperation we must build upon.



In academic year 2006-07, nearly 8,200 New England students went to college through the RSP Tuition Break and saved \$46 million on their annual tuition bills. Full-time students enrolled in the RSP Tuition Break program saved an average of \$7,000 each on their annual tuition bills. All of New England's public colleges and universities participate in the RSP **Tuition Break** Program.

In addition to helping New England students and families pay for college, the RSP Tuition Break enables the New England states to avoid spending billions of dollars in capital and operating expenditures for academic programs already offered in other New England states.

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The New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE) helps you study for careers like these when you enroll in one of the hundreds of approved degree programs offered through NEBHE's Tuition Break program.

NEBHE's Tuition Break Program, (aka Regional Student Program, RSP, or Apple program), provides a discount on tuition to New England residents when they enroll in approved degree programs at out-of-state public colleges and universities in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. The Tuition Break is available for certain degree programs that are not offered by any state college or university in a student's home state. New England residents are eligible for the Tuition Break on hundreds of associate degree, bachelor's degree, and graduate degree programs.

What is tuition?

Tuition is what colleges charge for courses and instruction. Other costs billed to students include fees and room and board. Tuition at state colleges and universities is typically based on a student's residency. A student who is a resident of the state where the college is located is charged the in-state tuition rate; a student from another state typically pays a much higher out-ofstate tuition rate. A student eligible under the RSP Tuition Break program pays a regional rate that is between the in-state and out-of-state rates. Note: Only the tuition portion of college costs is discounted by the RSP Tuition Break program, not fees, room and board and other expenses.

How much of a discount is the RSP Tuition Break?

The Tuition Break allows an eligible student to pay a regional rate, which is significantly less than out-of-state tuition. The rate is based on a percentage (up to 175 percent) of the out-of-state college's in-state rate. Example: In-state tuition = \$3,000; Out-of-state tuition = \$12,000; Regional tuition = \$5,250 (discount of \$6,750).

Is the RSP Tuition Break a scholarship?

No. It is a discount on the regular out-ofstate tuition rate that a student pays when attending a state college or university in another New England state.

Is a student in the RSP Tuition Break program eligible to apply for financial aid?

Yes. A student should complete the FAFSA federal application and any financial aid applications required by the college(s). For more information, check Financial Aid Resources listed in this flyer.

Is the RSP Tuition Break for New England only?

Yes. The program is only for permanent New England residents attending out-ofstate public colleges and universities in the six New England states—Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont.

How does a student qualify for the RSP Tuition Break?

As a permanent resident of a New England state, a student is eligible for the RSP Tuition Break when enrolled in an approved degree program offered by a specific public college or university in another New England state. Approved majors (associate, bachelor's and graduate) for residents of each New England state are listed at www.nebhe.org/tuitionbreak. For a list of programs, search our online database of programs or download the annual catalog.

How does a student apply for the RSP Tuition Break?

A student must declare an approved Tuition Break major that is offered by that college and indicate, "applying for NEBHE RSP Tuition Break" on the college's application for admission.

How is a student accepted as an RSP Tuition Break student?

The college or university notifies a student of acceptance through the RSP at the time of acceptance to the college.

Can a student already enrolled at a college declare an RSP Tuition Break major at that college?

Usually. An enrolled student needs to contact the registrar and/or the college's RSP campus representative, listed at www.nebhe.org/tuitionbreak.

What happens if a student changes from an approved RSP Tuition Break major to a major not approved?

The college bills the student for the full out-of-state tuition once he/she is enrolled in a non-RSP degree program.

Can the RSP Tuition Break be used to attend a private college?

No. Only New England's state colleges and universities and community colleges participate.

Why is a state of residence not listed as eligible for an approved degree program?

A state is not listed when one of the state colleges or universities in that state offers a comparable program (which in some cases has a different name).

If an out-of-state college is closer to a student's permanent home, is the student eligible for the RSP Tuition Break?

Sometimes. A student who lives closer to an out-of-state college than an in-state college offering the same program, is eligible for the RSP Tuition Break in some cases. Most community colleges (and some four-year campuses) allow this eligibility. Refer to RSP Policies: Proximity Policy for details at www.nebhe.org/tuitionbreak and contact an RSP campus representative to find out if a particular college allows this eligibility.

Are graduate programs available with the RSP Tuition Break?

Yes. Hundreds of approved master's, doctoral and graduate certificate programs are available. In certain cases, graduate students may petition for eligibility for other unique programs. Refer to RSP Policies: Highly Specialized Graduate programs. Details are available at www.nebhe.org/tuitionbreak.

Is the RSP Tuition Break a new program?

No. The program is 50 years old. The RSP was established by NEBHE in 1957 to expand educational opportunities for New England residents and help the states avoid duplication of costly academic programs. Since 1957 the RSP has provided New England residents with savings on more than 200,000 annual tuition bills. The RSP has also saved individual New England states billions of dollars in expenditures, because they do not have to start up and operate academic programs that are offered in other New England states.

Financial Aid Resources for New England College Students

Meeting College Costs Using Financial Aid

t least half of all students receive financial aid to help pay for college, which costs on average about \$16,000 a year for a student attending a public college in state or double that for a private college (according to College Board 2006-07 data).

What are students expected to pay each year towards their college expenses? Colleges make that determination based on personal finance information provided by students and their parents on their financial aid applications.

For starters, students (and parents of dependent students*) need to complete the federal government's FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to be considered for most kinds of financial aid, including loans. Students also need to complete additional financial aid application forms required by the colleges they wish to attend.

The FAFSA asks students (and parents of dependent students*) to report family income, assets and benefits, and other information such as size of family and number of family members in college. Based on this information, the federal government calculates a student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and reports the EFC to colleges listed by the student on the FAFSA and on a Student Aid Report provided to the student.

Colleges often use additional criteria to determine a student's EFC based on the other applications they require. The colleges identify the student's eligibility for financial aid by subtracting the EFC from the Cost of Attendance.

What is the Cost of Attendance? The colleges determine the estimated full cost of attendance for their students, which includes not only tuition, fees, room and board, or the costs of off-campus living, but also books and supplies, transportation and personal expenses.

Financial aid is available from four basic sources: the federal government, state government (see agencies listed on page 27), colleges and universities, and private sources (including foundations, community organizations and corporations).

Federal Aid

The federal government awards three major types of financial aid: Grants (gift aid, based on financial need); Work-Study (an award based on financial need, providing part-time employment arranged by the college); and Loans (borrowed money which must be repaid).

Grants

Federal Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity (FSEOG) are awarded by the colleges to undergraduate students who are identified as eligible by the federal government, based on information provided in the FAFSA.

Work-Study

Work-study money is awarded by the colleges to students identified as eligible by the federal government, based on information provided in the FAFSA. The students earn the award amount through part-time employment provided or arranged by the college.

Federal Perkins Loans

Federal Perkins Loans are very lowinterest loans administered by participating colleges for undergraduate, graduate and professional students with exceptional financial need who are enrolled part-time or full-time. Priority is given to Pell Grant recipients. Students repay their loan to the college where they received it.

Federal Stafford Loans

Federal Stafford Loans are for undergraduate, graduate and professional students enrolled at least half time. Students can borrow up to a maximum loan amount each year they are enrolled and pay back the loan after leaving college. Financial need is not a requirement, but loans are subsidized for students demonstrating financial need (the interest on their loan is forgiven while they are enrolled in college).

Federal PLUS Loans

Federal PLUS Loans are for parents of dependent* undergraduate students enrolled at least half time. The maximum amount to be borrowed equals the cost of attendance minus any other financial aid received by the student. Repayment generally begins within 60 days after the loan has been disbursed.

Where to Obtain Stafford and PLUS Loans

If the college participates as a lender in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program, students/parents bordirectly from the federal government by applying through the college's financial aid office. Otherwise, students/parents borrow from a bank, credit union or private lender that participates in the Federal Family Education Loan program (FFELP).

Consolidation Loans

Multiple Stafford or Plus loans can be combined into one loan for easier repayment. Information on Direct Loan consolidation is available from www.loanconsolidation.ed.gov or 800-557-7392. For FFELP consolidation, contact the lender or loan service agent.

Non-Federal Aid

Scholarship, grant and loan programs administered by agencies, foundations and loan authorities in each New England state. (See detailed list starting on page 25.)

Scholarships and grants (gift aid) are awarded based on financial need and other criteria, such as academic and personal achievement, religious affiliation, ethnicity, memberships, hobbies or special interests. Scholarships and grants are offered by state financial aid agencies, colleges and universities, businesses, private foundations, community organizations, veterans' groups, etc. To research scholarship opportunities, conduct free searches sites using such www.fastweb.com (see other web site resources on pages 24 and 25). Also check with the colleges, high school guidance offices, public libraries, chambers of commerce and community organizations for scholarship directories and lists.

*Independent students report only their own income and assets (and their spouse's, if married). A student is considered independent if one of the following applies: Born before Jan. 1, 1984(for 2007-08 academic year), married, enrolled in a graduate program (beyond bachelor's degree), has legal dependent(s), is an orphan or ward of the court, or a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces.

CALCULATING ELIGIBILITY

Cost of Attendance

Tuition, fees, room and board, books and supplies, transportation, personal expenses.



Expected Family Contribution

Determined from the FAFSA and/or the College Board's Profile and any other financial aid application required by the college.



Eligibility for Financial Aid

The maximum amount of money students can expect to receive in financial aid.

FREE INFORMATION

Free financial aid information and free scholarship searches are readily available from several sources including the federal government, state financial aid agencies, college financial aid offices, high school guidance counselors, libraries and the Internet.

Watch out for scholarship scams! Explore all free sources before considering any private, fee-based scholarship service. Make sure a private service is reputable. Information is available from the Federal Trade Commission at www.ftc.gov or telephone 1-877-FTC-HELP.

MEET DEADLINES

Students need to check with the college financial aid office to find out which application forms are required and what the deadlines are. Financial aid applications must be completed on time, and early is better. Note: Students can apply for financial aid before they have been accepted by the colleges where they have applied for admission.

The FAFSA should be completed as soon as possible after January 1. Students and families can choose to estimate their income for the previous year and verify it later, instead of delaying their application until after filing taxes.

Other calendar systems include 4-1-4, which features two terms of four months each and a one-month intersession intended for experimental or intensive study and variations such as 4-4-1 or 4-1-4-1.
- 7. An institution's student body is classified as **men** for men only, women for women only or coed for men and women.
- **8.** Tuition/Fees generally refers to annual tuition and mandatory fees, if reported, for a typical undergraduate (except in the case of institutions that enroll only graduate students). Institutions listing tuition per credit hour are footnoted as such. For public institutions, in-state tuition and mandatory fees are listed first; followed by out-of-state tuition and mandatory fees. Tuition and fees are current for the 2007-2008 academic year. Fees may include the cost of health insurance required by some institutions if students are not covered by comparable health insurance and may vary according to program of study. The figures listed for Tuition/Fees do not include room and board charges unless otherwise indicated.
- 9. Housing, Room & Board refers to average annual charges for students living on campus and participating in a standard meal plan (unless otherwise noted) during the 2007-2008 academic year.
- 10. Listing shows the total number of full-time employees (excluding faculty) and part-time employees (excluding faculty), in most cases as of Jan. 1, 2007.

- 11. Listings shows the total number of full-time faculty and part-time faculty, in most cases as of Jan. 1 2007. Faculty counts may include adjuncts.
- **12. Enrollment figures** are for the Fall 2006 term unless noted. The figures are reported by institutions based on a headcount of fulland part-time degree enrollment in undergraduate and graduate degree programs and full- and part-time non-degree enrollment.
- **13. Online Enrollment** refers to the total number of students enrolled in online courses and/or degree programs in Fall 2006. Enrollment may include students enrolled in hybrid programs, taking some courses on campus and others online. Online enrollment is included in figures reported in item #12.
- **14. Foreign Enrollment** refers to the total number of foreign students enrolled in Fall 2006. Foreign enrollment is included in figures reported in item #12.
- 15. International Student Information if reported includes contact information and websites for international applicants.
- **16.** Admissions Information is presented in a brief narrative and may include: examinations required by institutions as part of the admissions process or for placement after admission; application deadlines and fees for first-year students; and information regarding special admissions programs and related deadlines. The admissions office telephone number, email address and website address are also provided.
