The editors feel this conclusion is too strong given the data presented in the manuscript and also given the accurate but sofened conclusion presented in the manuscript. Consider, for instance, writing that young adults may have a slightly increased risk of cardiovascular event...

In your response please provide, point by point, your replies to the comments made by the reviewers and the editors, explaining how you have dealt with them in the paper.
