Due to Covid-19 restrictions it will be held on-line, using Zoom. There will be a special on-line training session for judges on Sunday, April 18 at 9 AM to prepare them for the new way the Event will be conducted. We will also need judges for the Written Reports, which will be done on-line, just as we did last year.
	We will be needing 75 volunteers to run all aspects of the competition. We hope many members who have joined us in previous years will come again, but we always welcome new volunteers. Event volunteers can choose from a variety of roles such as the following: Written Report Judge, Track Judge, Oral Presentation Judge, Administration, Robot Repairs, Photographer, and Zoom specialist. If you are willing to be flexible we'll assign you to where you are needed the most. Engineers volunteering at previous competitions have commented that the experience has been very rewarding with most wanting to judge in following years' competitions.
