### 6. Updated Outline Discussion

I. Review updated wording of Scope

Ansgar noted there was some discussions on this during the last call. It was pointed out there were inconsistency in the wording which this updates sought to correct.

Everyone is encouraged to re-read the Scope section and add comments where they feel appropriate.

- II. Review draft "P7003 Values Statement" document Paula Boddington Paula reviewed the values under which IEEE P7003 group are operating. She provided the values of IEEE and IEEE-SA, procedural values of the WG and the values relating to the WG goals. Please review the document if you have not had a chance. - a) Principle agreement with "Real-time automated assessment of emotions in children prior to clinical investigation" project to explore using that project as consistent example use cases at multiple places within the standard document.

- V. Updates/contributions for document sections
  Ansgar noted that we need volunteers to take ownership of some sections.

  - i. Matthew, Pascal and Paula expressed interest in developing a section on Taxonomy of Algorithm Bias. Pascal has worked on taxonomy and said he would share the literature and resources.
  - ii. Nozha raised the issue of legal context for definitions, responsibilities, rights and remedies associated with algorithmic bias. It was suggested that a section to provide an overview of such legal context could be useful.
  - iii. Paula suggested having a section (possibly subsection of the taxonomy section) to discuss "how people are grouped"
  - iv. It was suggested to have a section on Psychology & Bias
  - v. It was suggested to have section (subsection of "Evaluating of algorithmic processing" section (?)) on "Resilience against eternal manipulation to Bias the system"
- 7. Gaps in Working Group membership expertise that need to be filled? We certainly have a biased WG, focusing on mostly Europe and USA. Little from Japan, but nothing beyond there. Ansgar asked how to reach out to other, suggestions?

Juliette, suggested that WeThData <a href="http://wethedata.org/">http://wethedata.org/</a> might be a useful link for expanding the WG diversity, as might the LocalizationLab

(<u>https://www.localizationlab.org/</u>). She asked the group to look at the link and see if they are interested and she would make the connection.

Matthew has contacts in China/Hong Kong region. He can reach out to them.

Paula noted linguistics and Political Science. Expertise in these areas. She will reach out to some people.
