- Our Chapter Secretary, A/Prof Bing Xue, has been appointed as an Associate Editor for IEEE Transactions on Evolutionary Computation, the top journal in the field, and an Associate Editor for Journal of Royal Society of New Zealand. She has been re-appointed as the Chair of the IEEE CIS Technical Committee on Data Mining and Big Data Analytics. She will continue to be in the IEEE CIS Women In Computational Intelligence Committee as a member.

- The Chapter has decided to help several members in the Chapter to apply and be promoted to a Senior Member this year with a goal to increase at least two new Senior Members in 2020.
