Murray: let us put Sridhar's report up on the website after the submission date. **Chapters / YP / WIE / Student Reports Computational Intelligence (Mengjie):** The following report was sent out before the meeting. The CI Chapter has 11 full papers, 6 posters and 2 specialised tutorials accepted by ACM Genetic and Evolutionary Computation Conference (ARC/ERA/CORE Tier A) to be held virtually in Cuncan, Mexico on 8-12 July 2020. More than 10 members and Graduate Student members will attend the conference virtually. The CI Chapter has 17 full papers accepted by IEEE Congress on Evolutionary Computation (ARC/ERA Tier A) and 2 papers accepted by International Joint Conference on Neural Networks (ARC/ERA Tier A) to be held jointly 9 as WCCI 2020 in Glasgow, UK on 19-24 July 2020. More than 15 members and Graduate Student members will attend the conference virtually. IEEE CIS told us that our CI chapter is one of the best performing CI chapters the IEEE CI Society in 2019 based on the number of technical events hosted in 2019. The CI Chapter has two special issues accepted, one by IEEE Transaction on Evolutionary Computation, the other by IEEE Computational Intelligence Magazine. At least 4 new students were recently registered as an IEEE Graduate Student Members to the Chapter/Section. Additional comment: Chapter nominated for best chapter award (global).
