8	<b>Webmaster Report (Richard)</b>  The following report was sent out before the meeting.  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Added the minutes of the May 6th Meeting to the website.</li> <li>- Recent events section has been reduced to just a few items held at the end of 2019 (see #RecentEvents).</li> <li>- Other Past Events have been transferred to an alternative html file with a link to this file (see #PastEvents) and that goes to a link from which you can find the year of interest that provides details of past years that we have recorded.</li> <li>- The Upcoming Events section now shows the Message containing an explanation for the reduced number of events, The upcoming TENCON conference to be held in Osaka, Japan in November 2020, the upcoming ITNAC 2020 conference to be held in Melbourne, Australia in November 2020, (see #UpcomingEvents).</li> <li>- The report on industry engagement prepared by Sridhar (see #ItemsOfInterest).</li> </ul>	

- *The IEEE Industry Engagement Competition details are viewable on the site now (see #ItemsOfInterest).*
- *The recent meeting minutes have been merged with the latest membership report that arrived from Chanjief after our Section Meeting held on 6/5/2020.*
- *Updated the database giving our event list (the Access Database) and forwarded to Steven. We need to see that vTools is appropriately updated too, to ensure that these are synchronised appropriately. Can't see a way to automatically synchronise these two databases at this stage, so I think that we'll have to do it this manual way for the time being.*
- *The Committee page of the website has been updated to reflect the current 2020 composition of our committee but I need a fresh pair of eyes to look at that page and find whether there are any mistakes in personnel or omissions. Please advise any such errors. I noticed that two new recruits identified at the AGM are not on our mailing list (are they?) and have not been part of our Section Meeting. Has anything changed in the meantime since the AGM?*
- *I have prepared a "site" for the WIE Affinity groups activities and it is now part of the Central Section Website. To find it, go to the home page and look at the left hand navigation bar and you will see "Women in Engineering" as an option. Upon selecting it, you should be transported to the new site where I have put some opening words of welcome, then a section giving a copy of Kanwal's report – I did a couple of minor edits for consistency with the site but 99.9% the same as in the email. After that I have started a section for personal stories and bios. I began by plagiarising stuff from your website Kanwal (I can remove or replace it if you write a story for the NSW people as you wish.) Once again, you will find that I changed a few words here and there for consistency,*
- *I noticed a news item from the IEEE which announces the above WIE event. Since it might help with recruitment of WIE members for our Affinity Group I have copied and added it to our WIE page on the Section website. Simply go to our main page and click on the Women in Engineering tab in the left hand menu. You should be transported to the relevant WIE page and under the heading of Latest News you should find some initial details plus a link to register for this virtual event as it is free and can be attended from your loungeroom.*
- *Note that there is a very much out of date webpage for the Young Professionals activities. When Rahul and Chuan-Zheng Lee organised it it had been updated with some information but sadly after they left our region/section they took some of their knowledge and ambitions elsewhere and left a void. It will be good to revive this again before R10 tries to shut our YP Affinity Group down. I am happy to place bios and committee members together with planned events on the website at any time in order to maintain it for our Section. Please send details when they are worked out.*
