

This cost will be determined based on how many technical societies request a print version and the size of their membership.

Content

- All technical societies can submit content to the editor of The Technologist for consideration. Content submission forms can be downloaded from www. tacny.org/articlesubmission.html and submitted to technologist@tacny.org. Please keep submissions to 600 words or less. The Technologist will accept longer submissions of particularly compelling content on a case by case basis.
- The Technologist may include the following categories of content:
- Two to four feature articles (or more) per month written by technical society members summarizing recent technical studies, projects, programs, etc., in Central New York.

- One technical society or teacher awards recipient profile per issue. Seven issues would feature one technical society and five issues would feature one of the five teacher award recipients for that year.
- Technical society updates: brief stories summarizing news of your organization, in case members miss a meeting.
