The Science Olympiad highlights the talents and skills of the top young scientific minds in the United States, and was held May 20-22 this year on the campus of Juniata College in Huntingdon, PA.

Fayetteville-Manlius High School took the Division C title followed by second-place finisher Grand Haven High School, of Grand Haven Mich.. The third-place winner was Harriton High School, of Rosemont, PA.

The goals of the Science Olympiad, a non-profit organization, are to improve the quality of science education, increase student interest in science and recognize outstanding achievement in science education. The Science Olympiad involved, nationwide, more than 1 million elementary and secondary school students in classroom activities, workshops and tournaments.

The 15 member Fayetteville-Manlius team, coached by Jamie Cucinotta, worked countless hours after school and well into the evening to amass the knowledge necessary to mount a successful competition in subjects such as Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Computer Technology.

The competition required that students not only demonstrate their knowledge of the aforementioned scientific disciplines, but also required the practical application of those subjects by designing, building and operating devices such as robots and rockets.


