IEEE ORLANDO SECTION MINUTES OF

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING
1 August 1978

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Russ Theisen at 5:43 PM in meeting room Alpha of the John Young Museum. Attending were: Bill Cram, Geoffrey Dick, Chuck

Friel, Jim Lynes, George McClure, Don Mendorf, Ben Patz, and Russ Theisen.

Minutes of the previous meeting on June 20 were approved after correcting the spelling of Don Mendorf's name.

Russ Theisen announced that chairmen had agreed to serve heading the following committees: Bill Cram - Membership; George McClure - Conferences; Mannie Connell - Publicity; Dick Bergen - Barbeque; John Tracy - FES Region 4; and Joe Pullara - MTT-79 Conference.

It was observed that no election of new officers had been held thus far by the Aerospace & Electronics Systems Society chapter. After the meeting, Dick McCoy was contacted and disclosed that some thought had been given to forming a joint chapter with MTT, and perhaps with Audio, Speech & Signal Processing (ASSP) and Information Theory (IT) societies as well. It was suggested that mailing labels for local members of all four of these societies be ordered from Hq. to determine the potential size of the joint chapter and to use for mailing announcements about the organization of a joint chapter. MTT also lacks current officers, the most recent chairman being Dean Bowyer in 1977.

The need to submit meeting reports to George McClure, Section Secretary, was stressed. These reports are used to support the inputs to Hq. on which monetary rebates to the section are based, so that full reporting of all meetings and their attendance is essential to the financial health of the section. The yellow forms for these reports are available from George McClure or Russ Theisen. A supply is included in the package mailed to new chapter officers each year, as well. Meeting notices carried in the Section Notes serve as a cross-check to assure that all meetings are reported properly.

A Workshop for local IEEE officers in Florida sections and chapters will be held at the Sheraton-Orlando Jet Port Inn, 3835 Beeline Highway, on Saturday, August 19. It is open to all IEEE members and officers are particularly encouraged to attend. This training session will feature two national IEEE speakers plus others from Region 3. It is sponsored by the Florida Council of IEEE, Ron Wojtasinski (telephone 305/867-4020), chairman. Hours are 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, and there is no charge for attendance. A complimentary lunch will be served. Ron Wojtasinski's mailing address is 375 Dorset Drive, Cocoa Beach, FL 32931.

The Section's IEEE banner is still missing, and alternative sources were found to be unsatisfactory. Consideration is being given to ordering a new one from Hq. Prices are \$85 for 3-foot square and \$140 for the larger size.

It was decided that the notice formerly appearing in the Section Notes about the time and place of Executive Committee meetings should be reinstated. The first Tuesday of the month is adopted as the standard meeting date and the meeting is open to all members.

The John Young Museum will be the location for the meeting, except in November and December when there is a conflict there. An alternate location is being sought for those two months.

Ben Patz presented three treasurer's reports, his own for the current period plus two earlier reports by Dick McCoy. Cash on hand as of August 1, 1978 is \$10,169.97, including a Certificate of Deposit for \$2000 and \$6000 in a passbook savings account. This balance will be reduced by some \$1500 when bills from the Computer Society's Microcomputer

Symposium are paid. A separate bank account was not opened for this symposium, but the consensus of discussion was that a separate account should be opened for any future conference activities carried on by the Section,

A motion was approved that Society chapters must submit their budget for Section funding at or before the September Executive Committee meeting; otherwise, if no specific budget is requested, a nominal pro-forma budget will be assumed for the chapters by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer will have tabulations of actual expenditures last year by the chapters for reference at the September meeting. The Treasurer's Report was accepted. Copies of the report are attached.

Participation by the Orlando Section in SUNCON was discussed, but no specific conclusions were reached. A motion was made by Bill Cram and seconded by Chuck (rail) that Ben Patz be reimbursed for his expenses if he is able to attend the next meeting of the SUNCON steering committee in August at Georgia Tech. in Atlanta. Dr. Patz agreed he would try to attend. The date for the meeting was August 24, but later this was changed by Dr. Paris. (Ba. Tech. EE Director) and Dr. Pettit (Ga. Tech. President) to August 21, from 10:00 All to 3:00 PM. Charles Tindall of Col-Ins-Co, representing the Electronic Representatives Association's Sunshine Chapter in Orlando on the Steering Committee indicated later (August 17) that he would probably not be able to attend the Atlanta meeting on the new date. After the meeting, Jim Lynes volunteered to assist Dr. Patz and George McClure with conference planning. It is planned to send a representative to each SUNCON planning meeting until the Executive Committee is able to decide whether it wishes to commit the Orlando Section to holding bi-annual SUNCON shows in Orlando.

Chairman Theisen discussed a letter sent to Irwin Feerst regarding an "equal time" meeting of the Orlando Section that had been tentatively scheduled for July 7. With no response from Mr. Feerst to our invitation, a letter was sent to him on July 3 expressing regrets and cancelling the meeting.

Ten copies of the Section Manual, detailing operations and procedures, have been ordered from Hq. by Russ Thiesen for the use of the Executive Committee. An Information Center display was exhibited by Russ Theisen, providing convenient and attractive display of membership literature for meetings. It was moved by Geoffrey Dick, seconded by Jim Lynes, and approved unanimously that an Information Center be ordered for each Chapter in the Section. Cost is \$9.98 each.

Chuck Friel reported that the Communications Society chapter will have a program schedule for the first quarter ready at the September meeting.

Don Hendorf reported that a meeting was held on July 19 to organize the Computer Society chapter for the 1978-1979 year. Both last year's officers and this year's officers were in attendance and contributed to a smooth transition. Work is proceeding on meetings plans for next year. The first meeting is planned for September 13 and will be a tour of the Hartin Marietta Data Center in Orlando Central Park. Program Chairman is Joe Hassett (352-2208- bus.).

Russ Theisen reported that the Technical Activities Board (TAB) at Hq. has requested Committee Chairmen's names to be used in preparation of an active-member list.

Ordering of a certificate and commemorative desk set for an outstanding service award was approved.

John Gilbert was unanimously elected Society Chapters Representative on a motion by Chuck Friel, seconded by George McClure.

It was agreed that the next Executive Committee meeting will be held at the John Young Museum on Tuesday, September 5. In Russ Theisen's absence, it is expected that the meeting will be chaired by Dr. Ernie Erickson.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM.

IEEE ORLANDO SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING, 5 SEPTEMBER 1978

The meeting was called to order in Neeting Room Alpha of the John Young Museum by Vice Chairman Erickson at 5:43 PN. Attending were: Joe Budziak, Mannie Connell, Bill Cram, Ernest Erickson, Chuck Friel, Jim Gay, John Gilbert, Howard Griffin, Deen Khandelwal, Bill Kownacki, Jim Lynes, Leo A. Mallette, George McClure, King Osborne, Ben Patz, Joe Pullara, and Gerry White.

Reports were received and business transacted following the agenda distributed at the start of the meeting. The same order is followed in these minutes.

- The minutes of the previous meeting were approved following explanation by Bill Cram of the sizes and prices of IEEE banners reported therein.
- 2. The Treasurer's Report showed a balance of \$10,169.97 on 1 August, with a rebate of \$838.38 received from Hq. and \$507.00 disbursed, leaving a current balance of \$10,501.35. The report by Dr. Patz was accepted on a motion by John Gilbert, seconded by Leo Malette.
- 3. There was no report for the Society Chapters Representative.
- 4. a. AES— It was mentioned that there is no printout of mailing labels showing members' affiliations for the local chapter available. This was sought to aid in revitalizing the chapter. Further discussion ensued about ordering a set of labels for AES, MIT, IT, and ASSP local members for a mailing to generate interest in forming a joint chapter.
 - b. COM- Howard Griffin reported that COMSOC is planning a meeting for 26 October with Don Wheeler of ITT to speak on "Fiber Optics in Telecommunications," at the Winter Park Telephone Company. Later programs are "Engineering Economics" by Richard Kolsby on 16 November a tour of the Stromberg-Carlson DCO on 14 December, to be held jointly with the Computer Society.
 - c. Computer- Gerry White mentioned the previously announced tour of Martin Marietta's Hybrid Computer Lab and the Image Diagnostics Lab, on 13 September.
 - d. ITT- A slate of officers has been assembled, according to Joe Pullara, including Dr. Deen Khandelwal, Chairman; Dean Bowyer, Acting Vice Chairman; and Steve Gray, Secretary. A printout of all ITT members is needed to aid in getting this chapter active to host the 1979 ITT conference. Bill Cram reported having requested the printout from Ann O'Connors of Hq. at the workshop meeting on 19 August.
 - e. PE&IA- Jim Lynes reported on planning of a tour of the Federally-sponsored Solar Energy Building at Walt Disney World, probably on 17 October. Reservations will be required.
 - f. VT- No report.
 - g. Student Chapter- No report.
- 5. a. Awards- No report.
 - b. Barbeque— George (IcClure presented a report from Dick Bergen that the annual barbeque will be held at the Bear Lake Recreation Center on Saturday, 21 October. Arrangements have been made for a caller, and a caterer has been engaged to handle all food arrangements except the steaks. Homer Wilson is arranging contact with a steak supplier. Tickets will be available for distribution at the October Executive Committee meeting; sales target is 75 to 100 tickets sold. Volunteers are needed to assist Dick Bergen with the barbeque planning and execution.

Volunteers include Chuck Friel, Ed Griffin, Mannie Connell (publicity), Bill Cram (gate) and John Gilbert (tentative).

c. Conferences- Ben Patz reported on a meeting of the SUNCON Steering Committee he attended in Atlanta on 21 August, attended by Dr. Pettit (Pres., Ga. Tech.), Dr. Paris (Dir., E.E., Ga. Tech.), members of the Electronics Representatives Association (ERA) Atlanta chapter, IEEE Atlanta Section, IEEE Region 3 (John Heitsman), ERA/North Carolina (Bill Scroggins), and Electronic Conventions, Inc. (Bill Weber and associate). SUNCON will emphasize exhibits, with attendance of over 10,000 projected. The budget will be over \$300K, with \$50K front money required from the sponsors: \$25K from IEEE and \$25K from ERA. \$15K of the \$25K will come from the host groups Atlanta in 1981, and \$10K from Orlando. Roughly \$100K will be paid to cover expenses for ECI for publicity, mailings, etc. The financial arrangements will follow those of MIDCON, except that the complex division of surplus would not be used.

Atlanta favors SUNCON, it was reported. Attendance is drawn from up to 400 miles away, decaying exponentially with distance (to Raleigh and Gainesville).

A return of \$200K is expected from booth sales, at over \$1000 each.

Discussion centered on the number of workers required from the host sections. About 200 IEEE workers would be required during the conference, with ERA expected to be able to supply 50. 60 people are required to work on exhibits coordination alone. There are 1500 IEEE members in Atlanta versus 600 in Orlando, or 1800 for Orlando, Tampa Bay, and the Cape areas combined. Session organizers are needed to assist the Technical Program Chairman. It was pointed out that the Orlando date of 1982 matches the next recession cycle bottom, if the previous bottoms of 1957 and 1969 can be used as a gu ide.

A decision on participation is needed by June 1979, with local indications by March. The next meeting of the SUNCON committee is planned for mid-September.

It was moved by Joe Pullara and seconded by Bill Cram that the Conference Committee continue consideration of the Orlando Section's involvement in SUNCON and make recommendations at the October board meeting, or later if necessary. Ben Patz offered an amendment that feelers be sent out to chapters and to FCIEEE for support. The amended motion carried unanimously. In addition to the existing committee members of Ben Patz, Jim Lynes, and George McClure, volunteers for this purpose were Joe Pullara, Mannie Connell, and John Tracy (volunteered by Joe Pullara). Also suggested were Dr. Henning of USF in Tampa (MTT conference co-chairman), Bruce Mathews, and Jim Walters. Mannie Connell has contacts in south Florida, Ben Patz in Canaveral, and Dave Flinchbaugh in Canaveral.

A meeting of the Conference Committee was subsequently arranged for 21 September with attendance by Messrs. Connell, Lynes, McClure, Patz, and Pullara. John Tracy had travel conflicts.

- d. Education- King Osborne reported that the PE review course will be offered, the first day in November and the second in January. This will be announced in the Section Notes. The IEEE microprocessor course will be held in Tampa.
- e. Engineers' Week- No report. There was discussion about whether this topic should be assigned to the Program Chairman or the Awards Chairman. The Program Chairman has not been named, but would have responsibility for both the Engineers' Week banquet and the annual banquet, the former in February and the latter in May or June. Chuck Friel proposed Dick Kolsby for program chairman.
- f. FES Region 4 Liaison- No report. There was a request that this function be clarified by the Section Chairman.
- g. IEEE-FES Liaison- No report.
- h. Florida Council of IEEE- George McClure reported on the meeting held 19 August.

 The two topics discussed were the Florida Eclectic '79 conference to be held in

Helbourne at FIT on 22-23 March, and the issue of engineering registration. Ben Patz is program chairman for the conference which will have a microcomputer theme plus emphasis on exhibits. John Larkin of Orlando is the Exhibits chairman. The general chairman has not yet been named.

FCIEEE has taken a strong position opposing industry exemption from registration for engineers as contained in SB 1310, proposed to replace the present Florida statute on registration which expires within a year. Consideration was given to hiring a lobbyist in Tallahassee to present the FCIEEE position more strongly to legislators. Results of the questionnaire circulated earlier on engineering registration were discussed by Neil Fisher, who planned to have a second questionnaire circulated to all Florida IEEE members by Hq. (latter was received on 12 September). Joel Snyder representing USAB described its activities on registration and outlined the problem IEEE Hq. is having arriving at a position on registration. The Damon report will probably be modified to reflect GE's softer position on registration, or will be tabled for another year.

The Florida Technical Conference (Eclectic) will be sponsored by the Orlando and Canaveral sections in addition to FCIEEE for 1979. The FCIEEE share of the advance funding will be raised by assessment. For 1980 Tampa will be the host section. Miami has been invited to be host for 1981 and the North Florida sections (including Ft. Walton Beach) for 1982.

- i. MTT-79 Conference— Joe Pullara reported that Horizon House will handle the exhibits. Conference dates are 30 April-2 May 1979. Location is the Sheraton Twin Towers for the conference and the adjacent Howard Johnson for 3 or 4 workshops involving some 300 people. John Tracy and Leo Mallette are in charge of the conference digest. Hospitality is being handled by Al Levy and George McClure, Facilities by Ernie Erickson, Registration by Dick McCoy, and Social Functions by Mrs. Pullara. Section assistance will be sought later. A list of VIPs to be invited to the banquet is being compiled. The banquet speaker will be Dr. John A. Ott of St. Petersburg. His topic will be the effects of light on plants and people. MTT-79 may be a Special, not Standing, Committee.
- j. Nembership- Bill Cram reported that membership displays are on order for all chapters, in addition to membership rosters by chapter.
- k. Professional Activities- Dave Flinchbaugh reported that there will be a PAC meeting in California in September. He requested that the new Program Chairman arrange dates for a PAC speaker to have the program for a meeting of the Orlando Section.
- 1. Publications- Leo Mallette provided a comprehensive 5-page annual report showing that advertising income for the year was \$1163, against a publication cost of \$1882.64 for 92 pages in ten issues, thus paying for 62 percent of the cost. The mailing rate, which had been 2.1¢ per piece during the year, is now 2.7¢ per piece. Bill Kownacki is serving as Business Manager to solicit advertising for the Section Notes and has put out a rate sheet. He is with NCR in Lake Mary. Mallette suggested that the job of editor be further subdivided to include separate coordinator and mailer. He will be moving to California in 45 days.
- m. Publicity- Mannie Connell requested volunteers to assist in distributing information within the various companies in Central Florida employing EEs. He needs one per company.
- n. Student Activities No report.

- 6. Yearly Activity Plan- Ernie Erickson discussed the need for a calendar coordinating the planned section and chapter meetings and other events, to avoid overlap and conflict. The Program Chairman will coordinate this. Information will be conveyed to Richard Kolsby when he assumes the position of Program Chairman.
- 7. IEEE Workshop Report- George McClure discussed this item together with the FCIEEE report (5.h, above). 28 attendees signed the roster including two representatives from Hq. and one from Region 3. Attending from Orlando were Messrs. Budziak, Dick, Miller, McClure, Cram, Connell, Patz, Mendorf, Osborne, Theisen, and White. It was mentioned that Orlando was the location that brought the best attendance for these workshops from throughout the state.
- 8. Budget Approval- Ben Patz reported that he had received budgets from three chapters, with the others to come shortly.
- 9. IEEE Banner Purchase Authorization— A motion by Chuck Friel, seconded by John Gilbert, was passed authorizing the Treasurer to order a 3½ by 5½ foot banner with the name "Orlando Section" on it, to replace the banner that disappeared several years ago.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:35 PM.

IEEE ORLANDO SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 7 NOVEMBER 1978

The meeting was called to order at 5:45 PM by Chairman Russ Theisen in the Alpha Room of the John Young Museum. Order of business followed the standard agenda.

Even if it were necessary to borrow \$2,000 to get the \$10,000 and pay interest on the \$2,000 it would be profitable, said Ben Patz. No action was taken on the suggestion. The Treasurer's Report was accepted on a motion by Dave Flinchbaugh, seconded by Gayle Fairless.

The proposed section budget for the coming year was presented and discussed. Income last year was possibly higher than it will be this year. In addition to the \$3280.97 surplus plus \$500 loan repayment returned to the Orlando Section by the Vehicular Technology Conference committee in 1977, there was an additional \$312 income from the Mini-Micro Conference plus the Hq rebates for meetings held. 

The 5:30 PM meeting was called to order by Chairman Russ Theisen in the Alpha Room of the John Young Huseum. Present were Joe Budziak, Geoffrey Dick, Ernest Erickson, Gayle Fairless, Dave Flinchbaugh, Deen Khandelwal, Don Hendorf, Ben Patz, Bill Rhoden, and Russ Theisen. The order of business followed the standard agenda.

- 1. The minutes of the November meeting were approved on a motion by Don Mendorf, seconded by Bill Rhoden.
- 2. Ben Patz delivered the Treasurer's Report. Copy is attached.
- 3.a. A new chairman is being sought to revitalize the AES chapter.
 - b. Joe Budziak reported the Communications Society planned a joint meeting with the Computer Society on December 14, featuring a plant tour of Stromberg-Carlson. A meeting is being planned for January with a QUIP speaker.
 - c. Don Mendorf reported the Computer Society also plans a meeting on January 8 with Dr. Jane Liu speaking on magnetic bubbles in data base management systems.
 - d. Deen Khandelwal reported on the Dec. 7 tour of the Wall St. Journal plant by MTT, and a talk on Jan. 9 by Max Yoder of ONR on Extremely High Frequency Integrated Circuits. On Feb. 8 MTT will have a talk on Computer-Aided Design of Microwave Integrated Circuits by Dr. Barry Spielman. Deen discussed plans to activate an Electron Devices group in a joint chapter with MTT.
 - e. Geoffrey Dick reported PE&IA plans to have plant tour of Florida Power's Turner generating plant at Lake Monroe on 12 Dec. He also requested a supply of attendance cards (sent subsequently by G. McClure).
- 4.a. Suncon conference status was reported by Ben Patz. IEEE ORLANDO SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 2 JANUARY 1979

The meeting was called to order at 5:40 PM by Chairman Russ Theisen in the Alpha Room of the John Young Huseum. Present were Mannie Connell, Bill Cram, Gayle Fairless, Bill Kownacki, Jim Lynes, George McClure, Don Mendorf, Joe Miller, King Osborne, and Russ Theisen. The order of business followed the standard agenda.

- 1. The minutes of the December meeting were amended to show Russ Theisen attending the SUNCON planning meeting on 30 November before being approved on a motion by Bill Cram, seconded by Gayle Fairless.
- 2. In the absence of the Treasurer, no Treasurer's Report was submitted. A reminder was to be sent to the Treasurer to check on payment of the caterer's bill for the recent barbeque.
- 3.a. Computer Society meetings were announced by Don Mendorf. On 8 Jan., Jane Liu will talk on Intelligent Magnetic Bubble Memories and their Application in Data Base Management Systems, at the FTU (UCF) Residence Center, Orlando Central Park, at 7:00 PM. Dr. Liu is a Distinguished Visitor from the University of Illinois. On 14 February, another Distinguished Visitor, Dr. Kenneth J. Thurber, will speak on Computer Communication Systems at 7:00 PM at the Orlando Public Library. Papers are still being sought for presentation at the Florida Eclectic '79 conference in March.
- b. Joe Miller reported that the PE&IA chapter was forced to cancel their January meeting owing to illness of the speaker.
- c. George McClure relayed Mel Kelch's report that no meetings were planned at present for the VT chapter, but that an effort was being made to formulate plans for three meetings in the Spring season and that it is hoped initial announcements can be made at the February EXECOM meeting.
- d. For the Student Chapter, King Osborne was asked to get the names of the elected officers and forward then to Russ Theisen who will supply them to Gayle Fairless and George licClure for publication and to keep the mailing list current.

4. Standing Committees

- a. Nominations for awards to be made during National Engineers' Week are to be submitted to Bruce Hathews by 5 January for consolidation with awards plans of the Florida Engineering Society (FES).
- b. George McClure relayed Dick Bergen's concern that the bill from Meiner's Catering Service for the Barbeque had not yet been paid, despite repeated submittal of bills. The Treasurer should take action on this. All other details of the Barbeque have been wrapped up.
- c. George licClure reported on attendance at HIDCON in Dallas being less than was expected, with exhibitors being disappointed. While 15,000 to 20,000 had been planned, only 12,269 showed up, including 2800 exhibitor personnel. Over half were pre-registered and many came on free passes from distributors and reps promoting the show, according to a story in Electronic News, 18 December 1978 issue. The story quoted Bill Weber talking about SUNCON and saying that IEEE plus ERA in Atlanta and Orlando are backing the new venture (although the Orlando IEEE Section has not yet agreed to back it). Attendance the first year at HIDCON in Chicago was 12,000.
- d. Reporting on Education, King Osborne said that the PE review course is now underway.
- e. Russ Theisen reported on Engineer's Week plans, stating the need for awards nominations. Although Lou Frey was invited to speak at the 17 February banquet, he cannot give an answer before 4 February and Bill Rhoden has therefore been asked to get another speaker. Bill has invited suggestions on speaker candidates; two offered were any member of the Florida Public Service Commission, and the manager

- of the McCoy jetport to speak on airport expansion plans.
- f. The Florida Council of IEEE plans a meeting on Saturday, 10 February, at the Sheraton Jetport Inn, according to Russ Theisen. FCIEEE still is looking for a Secretary, and would prefer one from the Orlando Section since most of their meetings are held in Orlando. A volunteer would be welcomed.
- g. On Membership, Bill Cram reported that the Orlando Section had fallen short of the goal of a 5 percent increase set by the Region 3 Membership Development Committee. The Dec. 1977 count was 654 and the Dec. 1978 goal was 687. The actual count at the end of October was 660, 27 short of the goal. The new Section banner in Bill Cram's custody survived the collapse of a suspended ceiling in his office caused by a leak in the roof, and is drying out.
- h. Gayle Fairless reported on Publications. The January Section Notes are in the mail and will be speeded in delivery by the grace of the U.S. Postal Service. Inputs to the editor for the Section Notes should reach reach Fairless by the tenth of the preceding month. They can be mailed to

IEEE ORLANDO SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 6 FEBRUARY 1979

The meeting was called to order at 5:35 PM by Chairman Russ Theisen in the Alpha Room of the John Young Museum. Present were Bill Cram, Membership Chairman; Ernie Erickson, Section Vice Chairman; Gayle Fairless, Publications Chairman; Dave Flinchbaugh, PAC Chairman; Steve Fruit, Student Chapter Chairman; Jim Lynes, PG&IA Chapter Chairman; George McClure, Section Secretary; Don Hendorf, Computer Chapter Chairman; King Osborne, Education Chairman; Ben Patz, Section Treasurer, Bill Rhoden, Junior Section Past Chairman; Tom Shuminsky, Student Chapter Secretary; and Russ Theisen, Section Chairman. The order of business followed the standard agenda.

- 1. The minutes of the January meeting were approved on a motion by Bill Cram, seconded by Bill Rhoden, after correction of the telephone list attached to it. The Student Chapter Chairman should be shown as Steve Fruit, 275-2786 (bus.), 644-2601 (home). For the Computer Society Chapter, Mannie Connell should be shown as Vice Chairman for membership and his business telephone at Reflectone is 671-0470. Joe Massett is Vice Chairman for Programs and Gerry White is Secretary of the Computer Society Chapter. Gerry White's business telephone has changed to 273-4910.
- 2. Ben Patz reported that no Treasurer's Report was available, but that one would be mailed to the Secretary later. It was not received in time to be included in these minutes. In an oral report, Dr. Patz reported that the Orlando Section had received a check for \$842.68 from Hq., representing the Section's share of proceeds from sales of the conference record for the 1977 Vehicular Technology conference held in Orlando; this brings the total proceeds to the Section from that conference to \$4123.65 (not counting the repayment of the \$500 cash advance). \$900 is being transferred from the Section's savings account to the checking account to meet expenses, including costs of \$464 to cover the Section Notes during the past two months.

The first rebate from Hq. is due in March, but we are late in submitting our financial report due on February 1. The next rebate occurs in September. Dr. Patz reported that for students the rebate is \$1.00 per student member and is not affected by the number of meetings the student chapter holds. This information was passed in a telephone conversation with Robert Asdal at Hq.

- 3. There no reports for the following society chapters: Aerospace & Electronic Systems, Communications, Microwave Theory & Techniques, and Vehicular Technology. It was learned later that Deen Khandelwal is on a trip to India. There was no Chapter Representative's Report.
- a. For the Computer Society, Don Mendorf reported that the February meeting to discuss computer communication systems is scheduled for February 14, rather than February 17 as reported in the Section Notes. There will be no March meeting in view of the Florida Eclectic conference being held then. The April meeting will feature another Distinguished Visitor as speaker and is tentatively set for April 18.
- b. Jim Lynes reported that the PE&IA chapter is looking for a speaker for its March meeting, scheduled for the second Tuesday in March. He noted also that about 3000 letters had been written to the Interagency Committee on Nuclear Waste Disposal, most of them favoring further development of nuclear power.
- c. For the Student Chapter, Steve Fruit extended an open invitation to attend the Engineering Fair at UCF to be held on February 15-17. Two student projects to be shown are the micromouse running a maze and the TV typewriter.

Steve expressed the Interest of the Student Chapter in working more closely with the Orlando Section. Section assistance is sought in arranging for speakers and tours. There is student interest in resuming the "Day with an Engineer" program that was conducted in the past. The establishment of an Engineering Scholarship fund was mentioned. There is an effort underway to start a student chapter of the Computer Society at UCF.

On the discussion of an effort to involve Engineering Technology people at UCF in student chapter activities, reference was made to the January issue of Spectrum which presented President Suran's comments on the EE vs. ET controversy. The Engineering Fair received publicity through the Orlando newspaper later.

4. Several Standing Committee reports were made.

- a. Awards- Ernie Erickson reported for Bruce Mathews that all award candidates should be submitted within the next day or two, to be considered for the awards banquet. Nominees have already been received from the following chapters: Computer, Communications, PE&IA, and Students.
- b. Barbeque- Dick Bergen reported by telephone that all bills had been paid.
- c. Conferences- George McClure reported that another date had been set for a meeting of the SUNCON Steering Committee in Atlanta, on February 27. Following the meeting Jim Lynes agreed to attend the Atlanta meeting. A recent newspaper article was mentioned, stating that 17 conventions were already lined up to use the Orange County Convention and Civic Center that is not scheduled to open until February 1981 (and that date could well be delayed. Last year, 430,000 convention-goers in Orange County spent \$53 million. That figure is expected to triple two years after the convention center opens.

On the Florida Eclectic, Ben Patz reported that the conference program would be printed shortly. There are more than 11 sessions already on tap during March 21-23, with three sessions on military microprocessors and three sessions on commercial microprocessors. George McClure reported receiving inquiries from Brazil, Canada, and France, in addition to U.S. inquiries from outside Florida.

- d. Education- Jim Lynes urged that more publicity be given to the dates for the PE Review Course, given once a year by Jim Gay. In discussion it was agreed to cover this in the Section Notes, by including it in the quarterly events calendar and making special mention of it in June. The next PE exam will be held in November. Ernie Erickson noted that UCF requires EEs to take the EIT exam before receiving their Bachelor degrees.
- e. Engineers' Week- Bill Rhoden distributed tickets for sale by the Executive Committee. Lou Frey had not been able to confirm that he would be able to speak, and plans have been made to have a backup speaker if needed. The banquet is being planned as a buffet. Tickets are \$9.00 each, with the Section paying \$1.00 for students, so that their tickets sell for \$8.00 (student members only). The student chapter is adding another \$3.00 subsidy out of their operating funds to bring the student member price down to \$5.00.

Bill Rhoden also reported on Nominating Committee activity. The slate of officers nominated for the 1979-80 term is: Chairman, E. Erickson; Vice Chairman, G. McClure; Secretary, B. Patz; Treasurer, J. Gilbert. The deadline for nominations by petition is April 15 (15 members' signatures are required plus a statement from the nominee certifying his willingness to serve).

- 4.f. IEEE-FES Liaison- Russ Theisen reported that Ed Griffin had received a request from the Florida Engineering Society that the IEEE Orlando Section pay a \$25.00 assessment to support the FES awards banquet for Engineers' Week. Ernie Erickson moved that the \$25.00 be paid. The motion was seconded by G. McClure and passed. The FES banquet was scheduled for Friday, February 23 at the Marriott Hotel on Sand Lake Road. Three awards are to be presented, one each for Engineer of the Year, Technician of the Year, and Organization of the Year.
- g. Florida Council of IEEE- Russ Theisen reported that the next meeting was scheduled for Saturday, February 10, at the Sheraton International Airport Hotel on McCoy Road. He will be unable to attend because of travel to Michigan during that time. (George McClure and Dave Flinchbaugh did attend that meeting subsequently; a report is attached.)
- h. Membership- Russ Theisen reported that Mannie Connell had agreed to accept responsibility for Membership in addition to his present work as Publicity Chairman. Bill Cram had earlier resigned the membership post in view of heavy business pressures. Russ reported that as of 12/31/78 the Orlando section had 679 members and 52 in arrears. Distribution by grade is: 12 Fellows, 97 Senior Members, 481 Members, and 53 Students. Russ emphasized the need for members to upgrade their membership to senior Member whenever they were qualified to do so (actively practicing engineering for ten years or more with significant performance over at least five of those years), partly to permit the election of more Fellow-grade members (the number is limited to 1/4 of 1 percent of the number of senior members). Applications to nominate candidates for Fellow grade were passed by Russ to Dave Flinchbaugh.
- i. Professional Activities- Dave Flinchbaugh reported on plans to set up a session on the last day of the Florida Eclectic conference from 10 AM to 1 PM, perhaps consisting of a panel including Bruno 0. Weinchel (Vice President, Professional Activities) and the Region 3 representative to the U. S. Activities Board. It was pointed out that other sessions already planned on Friday (March 23) for Eclectic will overlap this (from 9-11, and 1-3). Ben Patz mentioned also that Dr. Jones of Eglin AFB plans a program on Friday from 11 to 12 on new unified software, with a speaker from Washington.

The program for ECLECTIC is not yet available. It is being prepared by Dr. Ray Glenn at Harris Corp. (305/727-4559) and should be available in a week or so. Ben Patz is experiencing delay in getting letters to authors of papers typed at UCF.

- j. Programs No report had been received from Richard Kolsby.
- k. Publications- Gayle Fairless noted that the deadline for inputs to the Section Notes in the tenth of the month. He needs the ECLECTIC program. An input is planned to publicize student activities. A problem has been encountered with typographical errors creeping into the typesetting process. It was suggested that Gayle review a proof copy from the printer before allowing the press run, to catch such errors in the future.
- 1. Student Activities- Ben Patz relayed a message from Bruce Mathews that names of outstanding students should be forwarded to Dr. Mathews for awards consideration.
- 5. Special Committee
 a. MTT-79 Conference- George McClure and Ernie Erickson reported on the January 9
 meeting of the MTT Adcom and conference committee at which arrangements were discussed.
 Joe Pullara is in charge of section support for this MTT-79 conference, scheduled from
 April 30 through May 2, with workshops held May 3-4. Ernie Erickson is handling room

arrangements, George McClure is handling food function arrangements and reservations, and June Pullara is handling the ladies' program and hospitality. Others are alked to help.

6. Old Business-

- a. Meeting Reports- George McClure reminded chapter secretaries that reports of chapter meetings are to be submitted to the section secretary within ten days after the meeting is held. An accurate count of members and guests is essential for these reports, since they are used in making up the annual report of meetings that is sent to Hq.
- b. The Annual Report submitted for the Orlando Section as of 1 February showed the following activity for 1978:

NOTES FROM FCIEEE MEETING, 10 FEBRUARY

Ron Wojtasinski, Chairman, noted that \$1500 had been allocated by Region 3 to FCIEEE for section training and coordination.

Ron Waters was elected Secretary, replacing Joe Horne who could not afford to travel. Joe will work with the Tallahassee subsection on PAC.

The Chairman directed that the sections should identify their representatives to FCIEEE on an annual basis, either January-December or July-June, to Ron Waters.

Each section was asked to put all FCIEEE representatives on the mailing list for their section newsletters. Changes of address for the representatives should be sent to Ron Waters.

George McClure reported on planning for ECLECTIC and SUNCON. Miami representatives indicated strong interest in hosting SUNCON, at least alternating with Orlando. So far, 30 exhibitors have been signed for ECLECTIC '79, with probably 10 more to come. Attendance of 500 is expected, with a break-even point of 300. The final program is due out by February 17. There will be a final report for ECLECTIC '79 presented at the April meeting of the conference committee, in Cocoa.

The Tampa section has accepted responsibility for hosting Florida Eclectic '80.

The thought was that Miami would host Eclectic '82, then, but Miami has subsequently been sounded out on the possibility of hosting the ComSoc conference (NTC?) in 1982, and if that happens they could not hold the Eclectic '82 as well. Thus, if there is no strong reason not to, Miami should be offered Eclectic '81 again. Eclectic '82 could be held in the Panhandle with Orlando taking it in 1983. SOUTHEASTCON will be held in the Panhandle in 1983.

Jim Hammond of Panama City was appointed PAC chairman for the state, and will represent FCIEEE on the relevant issues along with Vice Chairman, Vern Powers.

The financial health of FCIEEE is improving. Treasurer John Kassak presented a budget that did not call for any assessments from the sections next year.

Wojtasinski noted a story in Electronic Engineering Times stating that IEEE foresees a shortage of engineers, and discussing the prospect of importing engineers to meet the demand. Ron challenged the basis for the story and plans to ask IEEE for the basis of their input to it.

Dave Flinchbaugh reported work on education in three areas: 1) Eclectic tutorials, 2) PE refresher courses, and 3) setting up of courses from IEEE Hq. It was mentioned that the Engineering Management Society offers courses in stress management, use of time, and technologial forecasting. These are described in the Miami section newsletter and are apparently being offered there.

The next meeting of FCIEEE will be on May 5. There will be a section training session on June 2, both at the Sheraton International Airport Hotel, Orlando. GFM

IEEE ORLANDO SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 6 MARCH 1979

The meeting was called to order at 5:52 PM by Chairman Russ Theisen in Room 103 of the Monsignor John Wells Service Center, St. Margaret Mary's Catholic Church, 641 M. Knowles Avenue in Winter Park. Present were Mannie Connell (Publicity/Membership), Bill Cram (Member at Large), Ernie Erickson (Vice Chairman), Gayle Fairless (Publications Editor), Dave Flinchbaugh (PAC Chairman), Howard Griffin (ComSoc Chairman), Bill Kownacki (Publications Business Manager), Carol Lynch (Treasurer, Student Chapter), Jim Lynes (PSåla Chairman), George McClure (Secretary), Don Mendorf (Computer Soc Chairman), Ben Patz (Treasurer), Russ Theisen (Chairman), and Homer Wilson (Member at Large). The order of business followed the standard agenda.

- 1. The minutes of the February meeting were approved on a motion by Don Mendorf, seconded by Bill Cram.
- 2. Ben Patz presented Treasurer's Reports for the past three months (attached). Income from the Awards Banquet in February was \$294, with 44 attending. Dr. Patz pointed out that the two student awards (each a \$50 savings bond) had not been given out for last year or this year, and that the recipients had indicated a preference for \$37.50 in cash rather than the equivalent savings bond. A motion by Bill Cram, seconded by Jim Lynes, was passed to authorize payment of the 1979 awards. Dr. Patz was instructed to check with Dr. Harden and Dr. Mathews on the status of the 1978 awards (one was to go to Tom Riordan). Dr. Patz reported that the Orlando Section's contribution to the Florida Eclectic conference was \$1000.01 in cash and mailing costs paid. Another \$124 spent for FCIEEE mailings will be reimbursed to the Section.

The rebate from IEEE Hq. is anticipated to be about \$1000. It has not been received as yet, probably because of a month's delay in mailing the financial report to Hq., owing to a misunderstanding as to who was to mail it. That report was due in on February 1, but was just recently mailed.

- 3.a. The Communications Society is planning an April meeting, Howard Griffin reported.
- b. The Computer Society is heavily involved in Eclectic, Don Mendorf reported. In addition, a chapter meeting is planned for April 18, with Douglas Jensen speaking on distributed computers. Information was distributed about the 1979 National Computer Conference (NCC), to be held in New York City, June 4-7. Dr. Patz reported there was a chance that Dr. Burkhalter from Germany, who was to visit UCF during March 8-12, would speak to the Computer Society on microcomputers and emulation.
- c. The PE&IA plant tour of the Switchgear Division of Gould-Brown Boveri in Sanford, on March 13, was mentioned by Jim Lynes.
- d. The Student Chapter was reported by Carol Lynch to have placed second in UCF's Engineering Fair Group Displays.

There were no reports submitted for the AES, MTT, or VT chapters, nor for the Chapters Rep resentative.

- 4.a. The Awards Chairman was absent, but Russ Theisen reported that Lou Frey was unable to speak at the Awards Banquet and Doug Barnes was the speaker instead. Awards were presented to Jim Hart (Senior Student), Steve Chapman (Junior Student), George Wade Brown (Communications Society), Jim Lynes (PE&IA), Russ Theisen (Computer Society), and Sedki Riad (Student's Faculty).
 - b. Conference activity was reported by George McClure and Jim Lynes. McClure reported

making contact with two exhibit contractors to assist Dr. Andy Revay at Eclectic. Dr. Revay later reported having selected McKinney over Greyhound, on the basis of a price difference of \$5 per booth. He was pleased with their performance.

Jim Lynes attended the meeting of the SUNCON Steering Committee in Atlanta for the Section on February 27, and reported that the name is being changed to SOUTHCON, and that the next meeting is to be on June 11 (this was later changed by Dr. Pettit of Georgia Tech. to June 12, so that Bill Weber, of ECI, could attend in addition to Don Larson. The new full name is Southeastern Electronics Show and Convention. The June meeting will be of the Board of Directors, and the Orlando Section must have decided whether to participate before then. Front money of \$25,000 is required for the IEEE and ERA, each, for a total of \$50,000. Jim Toler of the Atlanta Section is exploring the possibility of a \$25K loan from IEEE; that would require approval of the IEEE's board of directors which meets next in August. If approval is given, the money could be available when required in January 1980. A second loan may be required for the 1982 conference, which would be held in Florida.

IEEE/ERA responsibility for registration would be just crowd control; ECI will hire a local show operator to manage the operation. A subsidiary, Registration Control Systems, handles registration details for a fee that is paid out of the gross receipts.

The SOUTHCON board will have ten members, divided between IEEE and ERA, with 4 from Atlanta, 4 from Orlando, and one each from ERA Piedmont and from IEEE Region 3. Don Larson will coordinate with the local people. In addition to Atlanta and Orlando, cities interested in hosting the show include Charlotte and Miami. ECI is doing a market survey of electronic equipment sales in Orlando, Atlanta, Dallas, and Chicago that should be ready in 6 to 8 months. Although attendance at MIDCON in Dallas was disappointing, it did make money, having sold 600 booths versus the 350 planned. The dates for MIDCON may be moved to November to improve the turnout.

No action was taken at this meeting regarding participation in SOUTHCON; it was pointed out that a commitment was required before it could be known whether IEEE's board would approve the \$25K loan, and that the amount required exceeded the net worth of the Orlando Section.

- c. Dave Flinchbaugh reported that a course on Electrical Equipment Safety is planned for Harch 26 in Orlando and March 29 in Hiami, to be conducted by Claude Haggard of the University of North Carolina. Tuition for the one-day (8 AM-5 PM) course is \$70 for mambers and \$90 for non-members. A mailout to all ten sections in Florida is planned to publicize these courses.
- d. Engineer's Week was reported by Russ Theisen. The Florida Engineering Society banquet was attended by 258. The winning engineering firm of the year was Dawkins & Associates, Inc., and the winning engineer of the year was M. E. Dawkins of that firm. The technician of the year was Terry McSweeney (an IEEE nomination).
- e. The meeting of Florida Council of IEEE last month was reported by George McClure (see last month's minutes), who also stressed the need to make our delegates known to FCIEEE on a continuing basis. Russ Theisen stated that the delegates are specified by our by-laws as the section vice chairman and chairman. This will be reported to FCIEEE.
- f. Numbership status reported by Nannie Connell and Russ Theisen was that there are 679 members in the section, but 52 were in arrears as of the last week in February. A plan to put the section membership mailing list on a computer was discussed. To get a tape to read in the computer (and avoid the manual entry exercise) will require a trip to Piscataway; the section must supply the tape. The five membership displays ordered twice finally arrived, and a membership display has been requested from Hq. for the HTT conference. A student membership drive poster was shown, to be used on bulletin boards, and having tear-off coupons. The Computer Society is giving a \$5 rebate for new members.

- g. Professional Activities- Dave Flinchbaugh reported two meetings are planned during the Eclectic Conference: a PAC dinner and workshop on Thursday evening at which Bob Cotellessa was the speaker (replacing Bruno Wienchel as dinner speaker), and a Frisday morning update on PAC activities by Jim Hammond of Ft. Walton Beach, PAC chairman for Florida. Dr. Cotellessa is Vice Chairman, USAB.
- h. Publications- Gayle Fairless reported that the mailing list for the March Section Notes had gone astray and it was necessary to enlist volunteers to address them by hand. A backup set of mailing labels was later obtained to prevent recurrence.
- 1. Publicity- Mannie Connell pointed out that the complete program for Eclectic was published in the Section Notes.
- 5.a. MTT-79 Conference- George McClure reported a meeting was scheduled for further planning at the Sheraton Twin Towers on March 8. Ann Conners from Hq. will coordinate operation of the membership booth during the conference.

6. New Business-

- a. Russ Theisen noted that use of the John Young Museum for a meeting location had been terminated when payment was requested for a year in advance. The new location at St. Margaret Mary's was agreed on for future meetings (see map below). It is requested that those attending the meeting go direct to the service center location, Room 103, rather than making inquiry at the Rectory. Although no-parking signs are posted on Knowles Avenue by the service center, these are intended for daytime traffic control only, and parking there is permissible for this meeting.
- b. The Florida Council is circulating a petition to add Leo Young as a candidate for IEEE President. He has an active background in professional activities.
- 7. Adjournment- The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 PM. The next meeting of the Executive Committee will be held at 5:30 PM on Tuesday, April 3, at the Msgr. John Wells Service Center, St. Hargaret Mary Catholic Church, 641 N. Knowles Avenue, Winter Park.



Chapter Reports-

a. AES- George McClure reported plans for a joint meeting with the Computer and VT chapters on 7 June with a speaker describing the Orlando Airport People Mover System. It was later reported that there were 18 in attendance at the meeting. The report of the meeting was also sent to the AES Newsletter editor and the VT Chapters Chairman,

to make them aware of activity by the local chapters. Both societies stage annual competitions for outstanding chapter awards, based on reported chapter activities, membership increases, etc. A letter was sent to the president of the AES Society requesting information on speakers sponsored by AES and available for chapter meetings. Such a list was received in reply and will form the basis for the program agenda to be prepared for the coming year. A chapter budget request has not yet been prepared.

- b. Communications- No report was received at the meeting, but a later report from Chuck Friel indicated that both Howard Griffin and Joe Budziak had been transferred from the Orlando area and that, therefore, a new slate of officers would have to be worked up for the ComSoc chapter.
- c. Computer- Don Mendorf introduced Mannie Connell as the new chairman of the chapter for the coming year. A discussion of turnout at meetings pointed out a lack of student participation and a need to publicize meetings more widely at UCF. It was noted that the Distinguished Visitors being used as speakers assured very good programs, but with final exams coming up some students were not very interested in outside activities. Only one or two students attended the most recent meeting.
- d. Microwave Theory and Techniques- No report was received at the meeting. Later it was announced that Deen Khandelwal will continue as Chapter Chairman and Steve Gray as Chapter Secretary, but that a new Vice Chairman is being sought, and volunteers will be welcomed.
- A lect ure and facility tour has been arranged at Harris Corporation, Satellite Communications Division, 1301 Woody Burk Road, Melbourne, for Thursday, 2 August, at 7:30 PM. The subject is "Role of Satellite Communication in Developing Nations," and the speaker is Harry Stapor, of Harris' Technology Department. Maximum attendance is 30, and reservations are required. Free transportation will be provided from Martin Marietta's Bldg. 10 parking lot, leaving at 5:00 P.M. For reservations or further information, call Deen Khandelwal at 352-4094, or Steve Gray at 352-4560.
- e. Power Engineering & Industrial Applications- Bill Cram reported that the new officers elected in May for the chapter were Joe Hiller, Chairman, and Goeff Dick, Vice Chairman. The officers will be installed at the June meeting, when the program will be about the Clinch River breeder reactor. At the Hay meeting, a total of 19 attended the program on Methane Production for Power Generation, where Mr. L. W. Umstadter described the experimental anaerobic fermentation facility in Bartow, Florida.
- f. Vehicular Technology- No report was received.
- g. Chapters Representative- No report was received.
- 4. Standing Committees-
- a. Awards- Bruce Mathews reported that all arrangements had been made for the presentation of the Outstanding Service Award at the June installation banquet.
- b. Banquet- Fred Simons requested that a count of tickets sold to the June banquet be phoned to him on Thursday evening or Friday, so arrangements could be completed with the Imperial House.
- c. Conferences- George McClure reported a discussion with Roy Harris, Region 3 Director, during the Fla. Council of IEEE Workshop, in which Harris said he would go to the IEEE Board of Directors with the SOUTHCON proposal at their August meeting to request approval

of a \$25K loan for IEEE participation (\$10K to Atlanta section, \$10K to Orlando, and \$5K to Region 3). He said that he had appointed Bill Sullivan, ex-Director of Region 3, to be a member of the SOUTHCON Steering Committee, and that both he and Sullivan would attend the meeting of the SOUTHCON committee on June 12 in Atlanta (Ga. Tech.). They did, and George McClure attended representing the Orlando section.

- d. Education- No report was received. It was mentioned that King Osborne is taking a year's leave of absence from UCF and that a replacement should be appointed to this position. Later, in response to an inquiry by a recent engineering graduate schooled in Puerto Rico regarding the schedule for Engineer in Training exams, it was reported by Jim Gay that Paul Hartman at UCF, phone 275-2416, maintains a current schedule of EIT exams.
- e. Florida Council of IEEE- Hannie Connell reviewed the IEEE Officers Workshop held in Orlando on 2 June which included debates between IEEE presidential candidates and between Region 3 director candidates. The aggressive plan presented there by Joe Beidenbach to make educational courses available for sponsorship by sections was mentioned, including the video cassette and player approach.
- f. Membership- Mannie Connell reported that 34 new IEEE members were signed up at the recent MTT conference in Orlando, although most of them were located outside Orlando. Two of these joined IEEE and the Computer Society. Three chapters have not yet received their membership displays and should pick them up from Mannie Connell. These are ComSoc, PE&IA, and VT.
- g. Publications- Gayle Fairless reported that mailing costs are running \$20 for the Section Notes, with over 700 pieces mailed. Last month, the cost for 650 pieces was \$17.55. \$200 is left in the postal account. With the change in officers for the section, John Gilbert should sign the postal certificate as treasurer, transferring that job from Ben Patz. Gerry White is being added to the postal authorization list, to cover the mailing of Computer Society chapter announcements. Mannie Connell is on the list now.

There will be no Section Notes published in July or August. The deadline for inputs for the September Section Notes: Friday, 10 August. Fairless' phones are 352-2471 (bus.), and 859-2631 (res.). It was suggested that Dave Flinchbaugh put together a calendar of activities to be included in the Section Notes. This should be coordinated with Gayle Fairless.

- h. Publicity- Mannie Connell reported that he would welcome a replacement in this job, now that he has assumed responsibilities as Computer Society chapter chairman in addition to his other job as Membership Chairman.
- 1. Student Activities- No report was received, but a request had been sent to Caroll Lynch asking for a list of the new student chapter officers to be added to the Executive Committee mailing list. No reply has been received.

5. New Business-

- a. Formation of a new professional group. Mannie Connell stated that he would like to see a new group forwad on Training Equipmient. There is no home for this topic now, other than AES. He has mentioned the subject to Dr. Leo Young, IEEE presidential candidate.
- b. Consideration of new location for Executive Committee meetings. Winter Park is favored by those from the north side of the area, and Orlando Central Park by those on the south side. Bill Cram suggested contacting Wendell Dixon about the possibility

of meeting at the Orlando Utilities Commission building, next to Orlando City Hall, at Orange Avenue and South Street. George McClure agreed to check into this with Dixon.

- c. Next meeting- The next meeting was set for Tuesday, 7 August 1979, at the Service Center, St. Margaret Mary's Church, Winter Park.
- 6. Adjournment- The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 PM on a motion by Don Hendorf, Seconded by Ernie Erickson.


