



Minutes:

1. Meeting was called to order at 5:50 PM by Chairman Mannie Connell.

- 2. Russ Theisen moved that minutes be accepted. Seconded by Bill Cram then the motion carried.
  - 3. No Treasurer's report.
- 4. **Publications:** Gerry White reported that the SECTION NOTES are late from the printers but should be available tomorrow for distribution.
  - 5. BYLAWS Committee Report: Ernie Erickson.

Result of last meeting was to reorganize the BYLAWS along the lines of the National BYLAWS. The reorganization of the various sections should clarify the BYLAWS by grouping related topics in the same section.

- 6. **SOUTHCON '84:** Ben Patz requested volunteers to work on committees when SOUTHCON returns to Orlando in 1984. Russ Theisen, Clark Hay, George McClure, Bill Cram and John Gilbert volunteered.
  - 7. SOUTHEASTCON: Russ Theisen.

Announced next meeting of committee at 9:00 AM at Sheraton Twin Towers. Papers have been reviewed and accepted. Authors have been notified.

- 8. PACE: John Gilbert announced that the cups with the IEEE logo are made and the cost will be approximately \$3.00 each. The manufacturer however has mistakenly made 96 more than the 144 ordered and has offered them to us at approximately \$1.00 each plus freight. Bill Cram moved that we approve funds to accept the offer. Clark Hay seconded. Motion carried.
- 9. Mannie Connell announced that George McClure is the Orlando Section's nominee to the Florida Council of the IEEE.
- 10. Communications: George Taack.

The November meeting was held on November 4, 1982. Mr. William Shinnick of

Western Electric, Norcross, GA gave a talk on manufacturing and applications of fiber optics. The meeting was attended by twenty-six people.

The next meeting will be a joint meeting of Communications - MTT - Electron Devices on January 19, 1983. There will be two people from the Bell System to discuss the divestiture of AT&T and the effect on the individual and the Bell Companies. Those interested can attend dinner at the Harley Hotel prior to the meeting. Reservations will be made through Stromberg-Carlson for both the dinner and the meeting. The S-C number is 339-1600, Extension 138 - Wanda Sales, Extension 142 - George Taack, or Extension 143 - Ed Ellis.

11. **Computer:** Clark Hay introduced two colleagues who are interested in IEEE Executive Committee activities: Rick Hardin and Jack Hartley.

The November 23rd meeting was a mixed success. The planned panel discussion format fell through due to lack of speakers. Jim Burke from Intel did a super job of discussing the latest offerings from his company. There were 29 present but this was less than the guarantee so we had to pay for some unconsumed but reserved meals.

A January 18 meeting is planned to have distinguished visitor Dr. T. R. N. Rao of University of Southwestern Louisiana. He will speak on Memory Package Error Detection and Correction. Single Error Correction - Double Error Detection (SEC-DED) codes have been successfully used in computer memories for reliability. In VLSI storage arrays bit error correction as well as byte error detection/byte error correction become very important. 



COMPUTER SOCIETY APRIL MEETING ON SUPERCOMPUTERS

April 22 from 4 to 6 PM at UCF Room ED122 will be an opportunity to learn about supercomputers from Dr. Kai Hwans of Purdue University.

Dr. Hwans received his PhD degree in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science from the University of California at Berkeley in 1972. He is now an Associate Professor of Computer Engineering at Purdue. He has published extensively in the area of computer architecture, arithmetic system design, sequential machines, file structures, performance evaluation, and parallel processing techniques. He is Co-Principal Investigator on a research project on VLSI Multiprocessor Architecture for Pictorial Information Processing. His new book, Computer Architecture for Parallel Processing, will soon appear in the McGraw-Hill Computer Science Series. Dr. Hwans is a senior member of IEEE.

Supercomputers are currently under development for such application areas as seismic data processing, fluid dynamics, weather forecasting, economic modeling, nuclear energy, artificial intelligence, and basic research. Dr. Hwans will discuss the architecture of such computers as Cray-1, Cyber-205, BSP, IBM 370/168, Univac 1100/80, and the Denelcor HEP.

Trends and directions in future development will be assessed including information

from current research projects at MIT, UC Irvine, Manchester, France, Utah, and Japan.

# NEW PRIME-TIME TELEVISION SERIES ON PBS TO EXPLORE SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATIONS

Instructional Mini-series Will Be Provided To Nation's Secondary Schools

TOMORROW/TODAY will be shaped to attract both general viewers and scientific engineering professionals. It will be aimed at an audience having a healthy curiosity and a discerning eye on the challenges ahead. The series will explore scientific and technological innovations at research centers throughout the United States and the rest of the world, reporting not only today's research and development but also their economic and social implications for the future. 




