Allen Earman called the meeting to order at 6:04 pm.

October Meeting Minutes (Allen Earman)

Allen asked if there were any objections to acceptance of the minutes from the 6 October 2010 meeting as circulated on the listserver and posted on the SCV website prior to this meeting. Hearing no objections, the minutes were accepted.

November Meeting Agenda (Allen Earman)

Allen asked if there were any changes to the second agenda that had been circulated prior to the meeting. The agenda was accepted as submitted.

Chapter Report #1: Reliability Society (RS) Chapter (Jon Elerath, Secretary)

- Jon reviewed the current chapter officers

Chapter Report #2: Robotics and Automation Society (RAS) Chapter (Ed Katz, Chair)

- Ed reviewed the current chapter officers
- This is a joint chapter for the SCV/OEB/SF Sections within SFBAC
- Financials provided: \$1660 in the bank
- Regular meetings are held, averaging one per month

Chapter Report #3: Signal Processing Society (SPS) Chapter (Sankalita Saha, Vice Chair)

- Sankalita reviewed the current chapter officers
- Financials provided: \$2832 in the bank
- 2nd Monday of the month meeting except for summer months
- Meeting topics have focused lately on 3D technology

Chapter Report #4: Solid State Circuits Society (SSCS) Chapter (Kiran Gunnam, Chair)

- Kiran reviewed the current chapter officers
- Financials provided: about \$24,000 in the bank
- Local chapter members: about 2000
- 16 technical events over the last 12 months, including 2 short courses



- Total meeting attendance over the last 12 months was about 1506; this is the largest count in recent memory
- The chapter website was recently redesigned

Chapter Report #5: Women in Engineering Affinity Group (WiE) Chapter (Roxsana Hadjizadeh, Chair)

- Roxsana noted the current need for chapter officers
- Financials provided: \$3121 in the bank
- One meeting was held jointly with PELS
- Brian Berg noted that he is leading an effort to revive the chapter
 - He has found 3 volunteers to be officers, and he encourages other women in the section to volunteer their services as an officer and/or to help find speakers
 - He encourages section chapters to collaborate with the chapter

 - o Bio-enginee ring talks
- The chapter is using Facebook to keep in contact
- There are about 57 active members, and there is about \$4000 in the bank
- Three IEEE competitions in which the SCU Student Branch has been or will be involved:
 - IEEExtreme Competition: (they were in 1st place for about 5 hours, but then dropped out of this 24-hour competition)
 - IEEE Student Chapter Website Competition
 - Micromouse competition (upcoming)
- Goal for this year: establish a community of interdisciplinary engineering students focused on technology by providing opportunities to excel and to socialize
- Allen noted that a new Electron Devices Society (EDS) Student Chapter has just been formed at SCU

Power & Energy Society (PES) Proposed New SCU Student Chapter (Gopal Singh)

- This student chapter is pending approval, which is expected in early December
- It is being organized through Dr. Samiha Mourad, and is geared mainly for graduate students
- 15 students signed a petition for this, and a number of officers have been identified

UCSC Student Branch Update (Diego Aulet-Leon, Chair; Stephanie Weber, Vice Chair; Russell Petersen, Treasurer; Lynn Teng, Secretary)

- Financials provided: \$2134 total funds
- 62 active members
- Meetings every other Wednesday
 - A recent Google tech talk filled a room to overflowing
 - A Sierra Circuits PCB Fab tour is planned
 - A Monterey Bay Subsection joint event is planned
- Tutorials are held regularly
- In response to a request for \$50 for printer toner and \$100 for pizza and snacks for an upcoming meeting, Dick Ahrons made a MOTION to provide \$150 to the UCSC Student Branch, which was SECONDED by David Craven. After a bit more discussion, the motion PASSED unanimously.

<u>SJSU Student Branch Update (Hamza Afzal, Project Coordinator; Pratheepa</u> Santhiranayagam, Treasurer; Susan Mir, Events Coordinator; Hani Abidi, Vice Chair)

- Student Hamza Afzal provided an update about electronics workshops he is helping design for the students
 - These have become very popular since they provide real hands-on experience with populating a board, soldering, debugging and making it work in a short period
- The student branch has big plans for competitions this year:
 - Micromouse: 4 teams
 - Natcar: 6 teams
 - Lunabotics: team of 20+ people (can operate in 1/6 gravity)
 - FormulaHybrid: collaboration between ME and EE students
- Hamza asked for support of the electronics workshops. In response, David Craven made a motion to allocate \$150, which was seconded by Jeffrey Pawlan. Since this would not fully cover one workshop, Brian Berg made a MOTION to allocate \$250 for the SJSU Student Branch, which was SECONDED by Lee Colby. After some discussion, the motion PASSED unanimously.

Women in Engineering (WiE) Affinity Group (Brian Berg)

• Brian referenced his earlier comments about reviving this chapter.

Treasurer's Report (Fred Jones, Treasurer)

- Due to his only having taken over Mohamed Sayed's job as Treasurer at last month's meeting, Fred did not have a report.
