**Officer Reports**

**SC2011 Report (Kim Parnell, Brian Berg, Ed Aoki)**

- Sections Congress 2011 (SC2011) was held on Aug.19-22, 2011 in San Francisco
  - It was an outstanding effort by Tom Coughlin, with assistance from Roger Hoyt
  - Ed Aoki, Allen Earman and Dick Ahrons were instrumental in the success of the Computer History Museum (CHM) visit by SC2011 attendees on Sun, Aug. 21
- There was a hearty round of applause for the great way that visitors from around the world were made to feel welcome

**Chair (Kim Parnell)**

- A Region 6 meeting preceding SC2011
- There needs to be an increased focus on prioritizing and weighing the relative merits of funding requests
- As Karl Mathia, SCV Treasurer, relocated to Portland, OR, in August, he resigned and Ed Aoki then assumed Treasurer responsibilities (just as Ed did when Karl was in Austria earlier this year)

- Dick Ahrons made a MOTION that Ed Aoki be named the new SCV Section Treasurer. This was SECONDED by Jack Berg. The motion PASSED unanimously.
- Ed was thanked for all of his hard work.
- Kim encouraged all attendees, and all SCV members, to vote in the current IEEE Election. Votes must be cast by Oct. 2. There was some discussion re: the candidates.
- The SCV Photovoltaic Chapter is closer to reality
  - Kim showed an email from Paul Wesling noting this fact



**Vice Chair (Brian Berg)**

- Brian noted the passing on Aug. 6<sup>th</sup> of IEEE Fellow and Agilent Fellow Nick Moll. Nick was an industrial scientist at the forefront of semiconductor research at Hewlett Packard Labs and Agilent Labs. He held 13 patents in transistor materials and methods, with a particular interest in fiber optics and LEDs. He served for six years as the editor on compound semiconductor devices for "IEEE Transactions on Electron Devices." His father, John Moll, co-developed the Ebers-Moll transistor model. Brian asks that any personal comments re: Nick be sent to him at [b.berg@ieee.org](mailto:b.berg@ieee.org) and he will send these to Nick's widow.
  - (Following the meeting, and per his widow's request, Brian communicated with IEEE to insure that Nick's obituary would appear on the IEEE Institute website. This will happen in mid-October.)
- Two IEEE Spectrum events are upcoming in October at the Computer History Museum:
  - Tue, Oct. 4: Silicon Valley's Impact on the Automotive Industry
  - Mon, Oct. 24: Reinventing Infrastructure for High Speed Rail
- SCV Elections are upcoming
  - Ram Sivaraman said he will send out a solicitation for officer nominations

**Treasurer (Ed Aoki, Treasurer)**

- The IEEE Audit of the IEEE-SCV Section was approved without any issues. A big thanks to Ed Aoki (and Karl Mathia) for achieving this goal.
- Ed gave a Treasurer's Report covering the major expenses and receipts for the summer months
  - Chapter Rebates (June):
    - IEEE Transfers: \$12,600 and Checks: \$7,700
  - Other expenses (July)
    - Webmaster Remuneration (2nd Half, 2010 and Q1, 2011): \$3,000
    - SCU Formula Hybrid: \$1,500
  - SC2011-Associated Expenses Reimbursed by SC2011 Committee (August):
    - \$10,000.00 deposit and \$15,819.03 final payment
  - Receipts: \$9,718 realized gain on LT investment

**Secretary (Ed Aoki)**

- Ed requested his notification of loss of Chapter Officers in a timely manner.

**PACE (Kiran Gunnam)**

- PACE has a new, well-organized website
- Three new volunteers are event coordinators: Neeta S Srivastav, Manuel Ilagan and Sanjeev

- Dick noted that David Craven is working with the various student chapters to arrange for a Bay Area-wide gathering at the CHM
  - The general idea is to share best practices and what kinds of activities work well
  - The event will likely be scheduled a few weeks after the students get settled in for the fall.
- Dick noted that he and Brian Berg are working on an IEEE Milestone for Data Storage in Flash Memory

**ISMICT 2012 Conference (Arthur Astrin)**

- This is the 6<sup>th</sup> International Symposium on Medical Information and Communication Technology, which will be held in the U.S. in March 2012

- Art made a MOTION for a loan of \$5000 in support of this conference, with the contingency (as amended by Dick Ahrons) that the event take place within the territory of the SFBAC (since it is currently scheduled to take place in San Diego). Ken Doniger SECONDED the motion. The motion PASSED unanimously.



**Information Theory Chapter (Arthur Astrin)**

- Arthur has resurrected the Information Theory Chapter, and it will likely meet at Stanford on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wed. of the month.

**CPMT Workshop (Ed Aoki)**

- CPMT will be holding a Workshop on Chip-Packaging Co-Design for High Performance Electronic Systems (CPCW) at the TechMart in Santa Clara on Sept. 19-20
- This will be a simultaneous physical and e-workshop
- It is aimed at systems, signal integrity, power integrity, circuit design, and reliability engineers wishing to better understand challenges and solutions in system design, manufacturing, and qualification.
- The CPMT Society and the local chapter are each 50% sponsors, sharing equally in any profit or loss.
- The targets are as follows:
  - Attendance: 70 (including non-IEEE, non-CPMT members)
  - Revenue: \$ 23,000 (90% registration)
  - Expenses: \$ 17,000 (80% per-capita)
  - Expected Surplus: \$ 6,000
  - Maximum downside: \$ 6,000
  - SCV-CPMT Share of loss: \$ 3,000
