Chair (Brian Berg)

- IEEE Milestone update
 - The milestone for *The Floating Gate EEPROM, 1976-1978* was approved!
 - Events at which this milestone will be dedicated and honored are:
 - Mon, Aug. 20: Computer History Museum (6-9pm)
 - Tue, Aug. 21: Flash Memory Summit (5-6pm) at Santa Clara Convention Center
 - We hope to get President Gordon Day and past President Lew Terman to attend
 - A video co-sponsored by SanDisk and IEEE to honor this milestone as well as to promote the IEEE Milestone program itself is under discussion
- Zoe Lofgren event update
 - Sat., Sept. 1, 2-4pm
 - Marvell is donating use of the main lobby of their Santa Clara headquarters
 - Congresswoman Zoe Lofgren will be presented with an IEEE-USA Award for Distinguished Public Service, specifically, “for dedicated support of technology, innovation and the men and women who engineer our future.”
 - PACE Chair Kiran Gunnam submitted the proposal for this award
 - We will invite committee chair and their spouses/SOs, two representatives from each SCV chapter, as well as corporate representatives
 - This event will be:
 - a thank you to our volunteers
 - a thank you to our corporate friends
 - a way to try to bring more corporations and influential people into the IEEE fold
 - potentially a way to solicit sponsorship of the Sept. 28-29 MAW (on the order of \$1000-2000)
 - I will send out an email soliciting:
 - Names of IEEE-friendly companies (e.g., companies donating use of their facilities for IEEE events) and appropriate contacts

- Trish Bass, PSE Chapter Secretary, has agreed to assist with this event
- Need funding of approx. \$5500
 - Food and drink: up to \$4500
 - Assuming 150 attendees
 - Design and mail out a nice invitation
 - Magician walking around the audience, who would also do a trick for Zoe that would get everyone’s attention before she gave her 10-minute talk. We can discuss what else should be on the program.

 - Al Dorji, CES Chapter Treasurer, has agreed to organize having the chapters present at the reception at the end of the first day (Fri, Sept. 28)

 - Corporations are being approached as well
 - Charge \$129 per attendee

 - 5 former Bell Labs employees will compare their work with R&D today
 - A *Bell Telephone Laboratories, 1925-1984* IEEE milestone was to be dedicated later this year, but its 70-word citation has yet to be finalized due to the many inventions “battling” for inclusion
