3. Student Branch and Chapter Updates

SJSU Student Branch (SJSU STB, Ramanen Thayabaran) - update

Nanotechnology Council (Anshul Vyas of Santa Clara University/2BitElectronics)

- Nanovation: From Science to Startups (8th Annual Half-Day Symposium)
sponsored with **E3S, NSF, and BNC**
 - Saturday, 27 October: 9 am-5 pm, UC Berkeley, Stanley Hall
 - 9 speakers confirmed
 - Registration fees for IEEE members and Non-IEEE are \$50 and \$75
 - Offering a discounted rate for 50 to 75 students; each student registrant costs \$30; NanoTechnology is requesting a subsidy from SCV Section of \$1000 to support up to 50 students
 - Ed and Brian stipulated that students must both register/pay by EventBrite and attend in order to receive the discount on-site in cash or by check



Moved by Kris Verma and Seconded by Sachin Desai that each attending student be subsidized \$20 to a maximum grant of \$1000; NTC must assure that students must both register/pay by EventBrite and attend in order to receive the discount on-site in cash or by check . Approved unanimously.

Tech Academy of San Jose (John Crump, Director)

- The emphasis has changed in the last 5 years with the economy driven by innovation where the US is losing ground
- Since 2006, the target has been middle school students with emphasis on:
 - understanding the skills necessary for college work in engineering and technology
 - understanding the engineering profession and exploring technology
 - excelling in math and science and the need for academic achievement
- Currently, the curriculum includes
 - High Technology/Communications
 - Water Engineering
 - Energy Engineering
 - visits to local high tech firms
- To be added in 2013 are:
 - Biomedical Engineering
 - Digital Electronics
 - Green/Sustainable Energy
- Scholarships are available based on economic hardship

 - The MAW attracted approximately 270 attendees
 - 38 speakers participated:
 - 6 were from CNSV
 - Friday tracks
 - Embedded Software (iOS, Android, Embedded Linux)
 - Life Sciences (Biotech and Medical Devices)
 - Career Assistance
 - Saturday tracks
 - 21st Century Infrastructure (Internet-of-Things, Big Data/The Cloud)
 - Consulting and Patents
 - Career Assistance
 - Keynote speakers were captured for ieee.tv for future MAW publicity
 - Jim Ready, Cadence: started embedded OS industry
 - Steve Hetzler, IBM Fellow: key storage industry architect
 - SanDisk and Cadence recruited; Haynes & Boone was also a sponsor
 - Sponsors at \$1000
 - Sponsors included SCV, CNSV, CPMT, Berg Software Design
 - 7 \$100 scholarships were given out

- Preparation for Officers Training Event (26 January 2013 at Michaels, Mtn. View)
- Desired topics were solicited, and the results of this will be sent out on the ExCom listserver. Results so far includes:
 - A request for a 1-hour workshop which would not have a set presentation but would elicit input on what problems there are at the chapter level and what best practices have been developed. An "Unconference" bottoms-up format was suggested,
 - (Received tonight): Since the Computer, CPMT and Consumer Electronics chapters have received "Best Chapter" awards, perhaps other chapters could benefit from these chapters' "best practices"
 - (Received tonight): An input today: previous "training" sessions go too quickly to learn how to productively use the IEEE tools such as SAMIEEE and vTools. Eyes get glazed.
