# Chapter Report #1: Antennas & Propagation Society (David Norlander)

- Financial status: ~\$3000.
- After only one meeting in 2011, was revived in 2012 with five meetings.
- Looking for a meeting venue that does not charge.
- David will contact John Swan for his contact at Raycomm as a potential speaker.

# Chapter Report #2: Communications Society (Sanjay Kasturia, Saurabh Sureka)

- Saurabh presented
- Many 2012 meetings. Voted as Most Active ComSoc Chapter at GlobeCom 2012; is only surviving ComSoc chapter from LA to Portland. Held joint full day workshop with CAS, had 80-100 people, \$30-\$40 fee, a few sponsorships. All events are held at TI in Sunnyvale.
- Financial status: ~\$13.8k
- Goals for 2013
  - Looking for a Marketing Officer.
  - o More sponsors.
  - o Hoping to hold a joint workshop with student group, notably SCU.
- Upcoming events:
  - o Feb. 13<sup>th</sup> speaker from Google.
  - Alan Weissberger is organizing Sprint Innovation Center tour March 6 or 7, a few slots still available.

Recognition of Alan for organizing Jan. 7<sup>th</sup> talk at on "**How the Race for Microprocessor Leadership Transformed Silicon Valley**", with John Hollar of the CHM as moderator.



# <u>Chapter Report #3: Components, Packaging & Manufacturing Technology Society</u> (Mudasir Ahmad)

- Financial status: ~\$78k
  - Note: CPMT handles large amounts of money, but it comes in and goes. Most comes from Effective Training Associates courses.
- 2012: Held two technical meetings every month (except July and August). Biggest draws were *History of Silicon Valley* and *SER workshop* at Cisco. Most meetings held at Biltmore.
- Most meetings were recorded using Webex and can be played from the CPMT website.
  - o Fairly good experience, live webcast for SER was very successful.
  - Considering sharing webcast with Orange County CPMT chapter.
- Paul Wesling maintains CPMT website.
- Student support:
  - o Best Packaging award for Region 6 Micromouse competition
  - SVEC Education Fund scholarship matching funds
  - Packaging-related project grants to students at Stanford and Berkeley, they give presentations, helps industry folks and students, win-win for everyone.
- Looking for co-sponsorships for technical meetings.

# <u>Chapter Report #4: San Jose State University Student Branch (Waymond Chen, Armen Boursalian (former chair), Anaam Ansari, Willy Tan)</u>

- Waymond presented
- Financial status: ~\$6k
  - o Brought a check to pay off loan from last year. \$2,000
  - \$300 standard annual subsidy check given
- A good amount of student members (~200), due to incentives to join (IEEE room, for example).
- Last semester had tech talks by representatives from Brocade, PLX, and Paul Wesling.
- Upcoming events:
  - o Brocade Campus Tour
  - o IR Decoder workshop project coming up.

# San Jose State University Spartan Racing (SAE) Project Funding Request (Vince Donatini, Raakesh Bhat)

- Vince presented
- Thanked SCV Section for previous \$1K donation. Most other sponsors donated in-kind, through donation of materials. The SCV Sponsorship was used to cover DAQ costs.
- Reviewed current car designs and travel costs. Competition are on May 8-11 and June 19-22. Have a few Tesla engineers helping.
- Asked for a combined total of \$3K for both teams, for developing DAQ and continuing progress.

Jeffrey Pawlan proposed a MOTION for SCV section to provide \$1K for the electric car project. David Craven SECONDED. APPROVAL with 2 abstentions.

Would like to get in touch with VTS.

#### K-12 (Lee Colby, David Craven)

• Lee has been teaching a lab at McNary in EPA, and will be switching to another school in Menlo Park in a few weeks.



- Lynbrook High School IEEE Engineering Club
  - Have held several planning/strategy meetings. Club is approved by high school.
     Have had one actual club meeting.
  - Issues:
    - No formal IEEE charter for Pre-University level groups, so IEEE Education Society is working with them, may appeal to National.
    - Encouraging next generation youth in STEM careers is part of the top five Sections Congress 2011 recommendations.
    - Lynbrook club's website wording needs to be changed for legal reasons.
    - Example of Princeton High School IEEE STEM Club, which is actually a branch of the Princeton Education Society chapter, thus does not violate any legal obligations.
  - Financial status: \$400 funded, need more to send four (4) teams to the "Tech Challenge" held by the San Jose Tech Museum. Requesting an additional \$400.
    - K-12 bank account has \$1800 for this. Also may be able to get money from Region 6.
    - General discussion: Does the section have a process/interface for high schools? Chapters can give money, so chapters are the best interface.
- Lee also helped judge the recent statewide Future City competition.

# Chapter Report #5: Santa Clara University Student Branch {JP Allport}

- Officers scaled down from last year, currently only four officers. Secretary may return next quarter.
- Financial status: \$2k budget. Funding from SCU School of Engineering.
- SCU reimburses students for IEEE membership. Currently 11 IEEE members, have 25 students on club/distribution list. 15-18 students show up at weekly meetings.
- Upcoming events:
  - o Snap circuits basic electronics workshop.
  - o TI info session.
  - Possibly a social outing, a company tour of Nvidia and Maxim, and a soldering workshop.
- SCU IEEE is unlikely to get an IEEE room due to small relative size of EE department: Senior class is only 7 students.
- \$300 subsidy check written.

# Chair (Ed Aoki)

- SFBAC Officers Training
  - held at Michaels' at Shoreline, Mtn. View, 26 January 2013 with 100+ attendees. Of the 65 officers registered, ~30% were Chairs, ~20 % were Vice-Chairs, ~25% were Treasurers and ~25% were Secretaries.
  - o All training materials from the training are now archived on the website.
- SVEC Engineers Week Banquet, Tuesday, February 19, at DoubleTree, SJ.
  - o Sachin sent in the checks for 4 Banquet Tables and two Scholarships.
  - Jack Berg has sent out invitations to our SCV-ExCom2012 ListServ for a total of 35 IEEE seats and 5 Government Seats. A few officials have been invited.
  - o SCV Section has a display table and banner, Tom Coughlin will manage it.

- CHM: Free Weekend for IEEE member and family: February 16 -17 must bring flyer
- "CHMdeal.com": 2 years of CHM membership for the price of 1 year was set up by Brian Berg.
- Ed's report to Region 6 meeting (presented by Jeffrey Pawlan):
  - o Was well-accepted.
  - o Discussed the events driven by Brian Berg in 2012.
  - o One of the themes was how to reach government officials
- Brian Berg report on **Women in Engineering (WIE) event**: *Partnering to Encourage Entry Into and Enhance Sustainability of Women in Technology at* Google, Mtn. View: 23-24 January 2013. Attendees from around the world. Many great speakers.
- Brian Berg report on continuing efforts to revive SCV-WIE.
  - From the Google event, now have 40 interested people signed up on Google spreadsheet, 10 of whom are interested in being officers. Will send another email to SFBAC for recruits this evening.
  - Meeting and election in 3-4 weeks. Driven by SCV section, but open for Oakland/EB and SF. Shirin Tabatabai of SF section is also involved, as well as national IEEE WIE chair.
- Brian presented Kendall Waters with a Certificate of Appreciation for helping make the Metro Area Workshop successful.

#### Vice Chair (John Swan)

- IEEE-Section liaison with SCV Industry/Business leaders
  - Review: Primary motivation: Difficulty finding venues, sponsors. Imagine an ideal situation. Feedback from Stan Karakowski:
    - Suggested having annual events for industry executives
  - o Had planning meeting with Sachin & Ed
  - First: identify companies, top executives at companies, contact them and be referred to someone who can be a champion over lunch or coffee.
  - Then hold first event: mid-November, event with 20 or so executives, software and hardware companies, representing all societies, to present IEEE, see what they need, have IEEE volunteers present/attend

#### **Treasurer (Sachin Desai)**

- Report for January major expenditures.
  - o Current status: \$163,861.46
  - Drop from January is from rebates that went out for last year
- Report on SFBAC Officers Training Event "WHAT and HOW-TO" on the L-50 process well-received
- Report on IEEE-WEBEX Training Session for SCV Treasurers and followup.
  - About 13 attendees for first WebEx. Rocky start due to technical problems. Positive feedback.
  - Next WebEx: Saturday Feb. 9<sup>th</sup> at 2pm, on L-50. Topic will change throughout the year.
  - o Takes day and a half to approve a WebEx session.



#### Secretary ( Ed Aoki presented )

- SCV Section status in vTools
- Reporting of **SCV ExCom Officers** must be done immediately after the election: 8 of our OU (~1/4) have not reported 2013 ExCom; some have not yet held elections.; SCV Section Secretary/Chair need to be informed of results of elections and new officers, including IEEE member number. SCV Secretary can enter the data into vTools.
- Need New Officer reports from: EMBS, IMS, ITS, PES/IAS, PSES, REL, RAS, SP
- vTools reporting of SCV Section meetings: 225 Technical Meetings [TM] reported
- 2 of our units submitted 0 or 1 report.

Chapters that submitted 0 or 1 report for 2012 will receive \$ 0 in rebates for 2012 and declared INACTIVE for 2012. Chapters that submitted 2 reports but held a total of 6+ TM that are not included in the reported meetings receive the \$200 rebate but will not receive an additional \$75.

# **Committee Reports**

#### **IEEE Engineering Milestones Report (Dick Ahrons)**

- 9 possible milestones are proposed.
  - o Plaques for these cost approx. \$1K each (exact: \$890). The Section is required to cut the check, but on occasion, the sponsor may reimburse.
  - Possibly 3 of them could occur this year (2013), no earlier than 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, however.
     Approval/funding for the remaining milestones could reach into 2015.
  - The process: Milestones must be vetted but 24 historians. A champion must to write up and plan and fill out form and where to put plaque somewhere publicly – papers, patents, uniqueness, no controversy about conflicting things. Takes about a year for the whole process for each.
- Dick proposed that the 9 possible milestones be approved

David Craven proposed a MOTION to approve the 9 possible milestones. Brian Berg SECONDED. Unanimous APPROVAL.

- Volunteering:
  - If you want to volunteer for a particular milestone, speak with Dick. Brian can forward a link with the required forms.
  - o Even if champion already exists, still need a volunteer to help drive the champion.
- Dick also met with IEEE CS National chair recently after a CHM event
