 Policies and Procedures
 - Asked some questions for clarification by AudCom and SASB
- Note that changes to the submitted P&P can only be approved at the 3 plenary meetings during the year
- The first Vice Chair is only authorized to make editorial changes.

1.5 Fundamental Principles of Standards Development

- Marked not acceptable
 - R2: Use full name of Standards Committee
- We have:
 - "IEEE 802 LMSC"
- Agree that it should be spelled out:
 - "IEEE 802 LAN/MAN Standards Committee (LMSC)"

3.4.1 Chair - Comment

- Substantive:
 - R0: 1) Deleting "b) Forming study groups, as necessary." text is not allowed
 - R2: Comment not addressed "b)" should be reinserted per instruction no modification except addition
- Marked as not acceptable

3.4.1 Chair - Question

- In the baseline document, 5.5 PAR Development the text says:
 - "the Standards Committee may form a PAR Study Group as a subgroup of the Standards Committee or as a subgroup of an existing Working Group to examine the proposal"
- This assigns responsibility for forming a PAR Study Group to the Standards Committee and not the Standards Committee Chair.
- Request SASB Interpretation:
 - 1) Are PAR Study Groups formed by the Standards Committee Chair or by the Standards Committee?
 - 2) in item b), does the term "study group" refer to a "PAR Study Group" or some other type of study group?

3.4.2 Vice Chair - Comment/Response

Comment:

 R2: since a first and a second vice chairs have been noted, the duties of these two distinct officers should be noted.
 Perhaps as 3.4.2.1 and 3.4.2.2 or as done with the multiple secretary titles.

Response

 Disagree: The roles are essentially identical, except to indicate which Vice Chair takes over for the Standards Committee Chair. In our view, it reads more clearly as a single description.

4.3.2 Request to the Chair for Voting Membership - Comment

- Editorial
 - 1) Changing Section title from "Request to the Chair" to "Request to the Standards Committee Chair" is usually not allowed with exception of advised in instructional text and special circumstance
 - R2: Comment not addressed. Section Title should be changed to the template text.
- Marked as not acceptable
- This section is marked "Not Applicable" in the IEEE 802 LMSC proposed P&P

4.3.2: Response

- In updating the baseline to match current rules, the relevant occurances of "Chair" and "Sponsor Chair" were changed to "Standards Committee Chair"
- There are multiple chair's in the document, e.g., Responsible Subcommittee Chair, Working Group Chair, Technical Advisory Group Chair, Chair of a subgroup, Chair of the Appeal Committee, Appeal Panel Chair
- Request to AudCom:
 - For consistency and accuracy, the section title should match the usage in the rest of the document, which uses uniformly the term Standards Committed Chair to refer to this position.
 - This change is consistent with the intent of SASB and the baseline and improves clarity.

PAR Study Groups - Clarification

- The SASB Operations Manual, "5.2 Project Authorization" states:
 - "A PAR Study Group is a subgroup of the Standards Committee or Working Group ..."
- The baseline says
 - "the Standards Committee may form a PAR Study Group or may task an existing Working Group"
- Clarification requested:
 - Are PAR Study Groups a subgroup of either the Standards Committee or Working Group as it says in the SASB Operations Manual?

7.1.1 Actions requiring approval by a majority vote

- Marked as not acceptable
 - 1) Editing Item e) violated the instruction only edit bracketed text
 - R2: Comment not addressed
- Actions
 - Reversed changes
 - Deleted bracked item "[Approval to co-sponsor a project (PAR).]"
 (allowed in instructions, c) taking care of the brackets)
 - Added new itme as e), "Approval for a joint development project" (allowed in the instructions, b) adding actions)

7.1.2 Actions requiring approval by a twothirds vote - comment

- Marked as not acceptable
 - Editing Item a) violated the instruction clause shall not be modified
 - 3rd Paragraph is a new paragraph contain notes which violated the instruction except to include additional voting actions
 - R2: Comment not addressed
- Note: This has to do with changes to the P&P

7.1.2 Actions requiring approval by a twothirds vote - Response The current text allows a minority of the voting members, with no notice, to

- The current text allows a minority of the voting members, with no notice, to change the P&P:
 - Example: 15 members, 8 present is a quorum, 6 in favor meets 2/3 but is only 2/5 (40%) of the members voted in favor. New P&P is submitted to AudCom.
 - In subsequent meetings, the 6 constitute > 1/3 and can block the majority's attempt to undo the rule changes.
 - There is no restriction on when rule changes can be proposed, they can be simply presented under new business or by modifying the agenda during approval.
- This was last approved by SASB in 2014
- IEEE 802 LMSC feels strongly that open participation would not allow a minority of the members to fundamentally change the Standards Committee operation with no notice.

12.0 Revision of Standards Committee P&P

Marked as not acceptable

 R2: The reviewers have considered the Standards Committee's comment; however, we do not agree that this is appropriate in the P&P. The section can either be removed or it will be a discussion item at the next AudCom meeting.

Action

- The method for changing rules need to be in that document, or in a superior document. Hence, in our opinion, it belongs in the P&P.
- IEEE 802 LMSC feels strongly that open participation would not allow a minority of the members to fundamentally change the Standards Committee operation with no notice.
