Objective

- Provide IEEE 802 input into IEEE-SA engagements with ITU
- Receive updates on IEEE-SA engagements with ITU
- Do not interfere with existing technical liaisons to ITU-T (e.g., in 802.1, 802.3)
- Do not interfere with existing regulatory and technical liaisons with ITU-R (e.g., in 802.18)

IEEE and ITU

• IEEE is a Sector Member of ITU-T, ITU-R and ITU-D

- Participate in the work of ITU-T Study Groups, Working Parties and expert groups, seminars, round tables, colloquia and workshops
- Attend ITU and ITU-T decision-making bodies (e.g., ITU Plenipotentiary Conference, World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly)
- ITU Council granted no fee sector membership ~2002
- IEEE is classified as a "regional or other international organization"
- IEEE is qualified as
 - ITU-T A.6 Cooperation and exchange of information with national and regional SDOs
 - <u>ITU-T A.5</u> Making reference to documents from other organizations.

TSAG Feb 10-14, 2020 Summary

- Telecommunication Standardization Advisory Group (TSAG)
 - advisory body to the study groups, membership and staff of ITU-T
 - responsible for the working procedures defined in the A-series Recommendations and the organization of the ITU-T work programme.
 - Responsible for the work programme between WTSA
- Attendees ~150 participants.

TSAG Rapporteur Group notable items

• Working Methods

- The revised text of the Rapporteur and Editor's Manual was approved
- There was no agreement to solidify the 'definition' of consensus.

Strengthening Collaboration

- No contributions concerning Open Source
 - Still in the RG-SC Living List in anticipation of contributions to be sent to the September meeting of TSAG and/or the WTSA.

Strategic Standardization

- 'hot topic' discussions continue on statistics and the SDG mapping guidelines
- new Architecture Advisory Board proposal needs further discussion

Work Program

- 'Food for Thought' on restructuring presented by the Director of the TSB
- Interim meeting 5-7 August in Geneva to facilitate further discussions

FG-NET2030 & NewIP

- Information session to explain the scope of Network 2030
 - FG Chair explained the relationship between Network 2030 and NewIP.
 - Opposition to the inclusion of 'NewIP' as a subject relevant to the mandate of ITU-T was expressed.
- SG13 (and related focus groups) are gaining the attention of many Member States
 - The proposed NewIP work and the current work of the FG-NET2030 is seen as a threat to the underlying protocols, naming/number, and architecture of the Internet

Future ITU-T conferences

ITU-T WTSA

- World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly
 - held every four years
 - defines the next period of study for ITU-T
 - Including structure of Study Groups, work program of questions and direction from resolutions
 - elects leadership of Study Groups
- WTSA-20 will take place in Hyderabad, India, 17-27 November 2020
- Global Standards Symposium 16 November 2020.

ITU Regional Preparations

<u>CITEL</u>: Inter-American Telecommunication Commission – North, Central and South America, and the Caribbean – 34 Member States except Cuba – Conf. Doc. 63 + Adds.

<u>CEPT</u>: European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations – 48 countries of the European region – Conf. Doc. 48 + Adds. <u>ATU</u>: African Telecommunications Union – 46 Member States of the African region – Conf. Doc. 55 + Adds.

<u>APT</u>: Asia-Pacific Telecommunity – 38 Member States of the Asia-Pacific region – Conf. Doc. 64 + Adds.

<u>RCC</u>: Regional Commonwealth in the field of Communications – 17 Member States comprising the Russian Federation and former Soviet republics – Conf. Doc. 62 + Adds.

<u>League of Arab States</u> – 21 Arab States in and around North Africa, the Horn of Africa and Arabia – Conf. Doc. 72 + Adds.
