## Role of the ITU standing committee

## Objective

- Provide IEEE 802 input into IEEE-SA engagements with ITU
- Receive updates on IEEE-SA engagements with ITU
- Do not interfere with existing technical liaisons to ITU-T (e.g., in 802.1, 802.3)
- Do not interfere with existing regulatory and technical liaisons with ITU-R (e.g., in 802.18)

• The subgroup is responsible for assisting the Sponsor (e.g., drafting all or a portion of a document, drafting responses to comments, drafting public statements on standards, or other purely advisory functions).

  - policy is per home WG
- Preparatory meetings for upcoming ITU events for IEEE
  - Formalize current volunteer engagement
  - Summarize issues to de discussed per ITU event
    - IEEE-SA staff will indicate targeted ITU events to guide the agenda
  - Review proposed positions/contributions
    - IEEE-SA staff or volunteers may propose
  - Hold conference calls as needed between plenaries


## IEEE membership in ITU

#### IEEE and ITU

- IEEE is a Sector Member of ITU-T, ITU-R and ITU-D
  - Participate in the work of ITU-T Study Groups, Working Parties and expert groups, seminars, round tables, colloquia and workshops
  - Attend ITU and ITU-T decision-making bodies (e.g., ITU Plenipotentiary Conference, World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly)
  - ITU Council granted no fee sector membership ~2002
- IEEE is classified as a "regional or other international organization"
- IEEE is qualified as
  - <u>ITU-T A.6</u> Cooperation and exchange of information with national and regional SDOs
  - <u>ITU-T A.5</u> Making reference to documents from other organizations.

#### Register for a TIES Account

- Typically, volunteers get access under their company's membership
- Any IEEE 802 WG member may apply for a TIES Account under IEEE
  - Provides access to ITU-T documents

#### Attendance at ITU

- Typically, volunteers attend under their company's membership
- Volunteer attendance at ITU meetings as an IEEE representative requires IEEE-SA approval

## Recent ITU conferences

## ITU Plenipotentiary 2022

- Held every four years
  - Sept 26 Oct 14, 2022 <u>Bucharest, Romania</u>
- Election of officials
- Sets ITU's general policies, adopt four-year strategic and financial plans, and address key ICT issues as requested by ITU Members.
  - Documented in Resolutions
- Updates to base text unlikely
  - Constitution and Conventions
- Preparation work undertaken by the six regional telecommunication organizations

<u>CITEL</u>: Inter-American Telecommunication Commission – North, Central and South America, and the Caribbean – 34 Member States except Cuba

<u>CEPT</u>: European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications

Administrations – 48 countries of the European region

<u>ATU</u>: African Telecommunications Union – 46 Member States of the African region

<u>APT</u>: Asia-Pacific Telecommunity – 38 Member States of the Asia-Pacific region

<u>RCC</u>: Regional Commonwealth in the field of Communications – 17 Member States comprising the Russian Federation and former Soviet republics .

<u>League of Arab States</u> – 21 Arab States in and around North Africa, the Horn of Africa and Arabia

#### Resolutions of interest

- DECISION 5, Revenue and expenses for the Union for the period 2020-2023.
  - Several one-time grants, some cuts, slightly higher unit, and a balanced budget
- RESOLUTION 11 ITU Telecom events.
  - Sunseted
- RESOLUTION 101, 102, 133, 180 Internet Protocol-based networks
  - Despite a strong push that Internet governance should be expanded, it was not.
  - Member states retain exclusive Council WG (without industry)
- RESOLUTION 130, building confidence and security for ICT
  - Expansion of the policy role of ITU in cybersecurity matters was contained
- <u>RESOLUTION 146</u>, International Telecommunication Regulations.
  - WTPF 2026, no WCIT, and Council will again have an expert group
- RESOLUTION 177, 188, Conformance and interoperability, Counterfeit
  - ITU Mark progresses with conformance and interoperability testing
- RESOLUTION 212, The Union's future headquarters premises.
- New proposals accepted: Al and failed: open RAN, OTT

## Highlights for 802

- New building project will result in ITU HQ closure from 2023-2027
  - We are looking into IEEE 802 hosting ITU-T SG15 in Montreal July 2024
- There was no change to the status of remote participants (they cannot be part of the decision), but a study was initiated on if this should change.
- A push by some countries to promote new Open RAN resolutions failed
  - But "disaggregated, open and interoperable network technologies and solutions" was added in Res 137 which could be read to include IEEE 802 technologies.
  - Opportunity to raise awareness of IEEE 802 within ITU as sector members (like IEEE) are invited to "share information".
- New resolution on AI will result in AI-related projects
  - might overlap with some aspects in IEEE 802
- New resolution tries to constrain military use of spectrum (which is allowed to use any band) given recent interference issues in the TV and satellite bands.
- New space resolutions highlight the need for additional spectrum for satellite access
  - possibly at the expense of more spectrum for IEEE 802 technologies

## Future ITU conferences

## Telecommunication Standardization Advisory Group (TSAG)

- advisory body to the study groups, membership and staff of ITU-T
  - responsible for the working procedures defined in the A-series Recommendations and the organization of the ITU-T work programme.
  - Responsible for the work programme between WTSA
- In person December 2022
  - TSAG will organize into working parties and Rapporteur Groups
    - Working methods
    - Work Programme (including industry engagement)

### Key issues include

- SG restructuring (targeting WTSA-24)
  - Resolution proposed for WTSA including
    - The use of metrics to guide restructuring
    - The involvement of TSB (and no independent consultant)
- Collaboration
  - Rec. A.23 Appendix
    - Clarifying collaboration with ISO and IEC on information technology
- Ad hoc group on governance & management of emeetings
  - Electronic meeting best practices
  - Definition of "hybrid" meeting?
- Working methods
  - focused on facilitating decision-making at WTSA

#### ITU Council

- The Council acts as the Union's governing body in the interval between Plenipotentiary Conferences.
- Its role is to consider broad telecommunication policy issues to ensure that the Union's activities, policies and strategies fully respond to today's dynamic, rapidly changing telecommunications environment.

#### ITU Council - June 2023

- Council WG kick-off
  - Elaboration of the draft Strategic Plan and draft Financial Plan
  - Internet public policy, WSIS & SDGs, languages, ...
  - EG-ITR will kick off the telecom regulation discussion, again...
  - CWG-LANG is studying the inclusive languages issue
- Guidelines for the utilization of the Global Cybersecurity Agenda
  - the secretariat will conduct further consultations with Council Member States

#### Virtual WSIS Forum 2023

- World Summit on the Information Society
  - ITU + UNESCO + UNCTAD + UNDP
    - discuss the role of ICTs to implement the UN Sustainable Development Goals



- ICTs for Well-Being, Inclusion and Resilience: WSIS Cooperation for Accelerating Progress on the SDGs
- 12-week agenda planned with 250+ sessions
  - in person 13-17 March
- Open Consultation process
  - Themes, Topics, Speakers, Workshops, Exhibits
  - IEEE SA is a Specific Activity Partner
    - Includes thematic workshop, HL policy session, HL track facilitator
    - Previous IEEE 802 topic Time-Sensitive Networking in 2022

### IEEE 802 summary

- There are strategic opportunities for policy engagement and capacity building on IEEE 802 technologies at ITU conferences
  - Time-Sensitive Networking workshop held at WSIS 2022
- Given ITU new building project, opportunity for IEEE
   802 to host ITU-T SG15 at July 2024 plenary
